

Musical Magicians



#### Illusionology

This is the season of gift giving. Treat yourself to a beautiful, spectacular book of magic. Only 30 pages but I venture you will treasure it and keep it for yourself. I predict that out of your open gaping mouth, you will say "Wish this was around when I started in magic". In case you didn't have an uncle who would pluck coins out of your ears and inoculate you with the addiction to conjuring, this book would do it.

Supposedly crafted in 1915 by Albert D. Schafer a magician and member of the Illusionists Guild recorded the tricks contained in this choice book. On a Publisher's Note we read that this text was delivered to their offices by an 'unknown source'. The mystery

was that the 'author' Schafer was not known to definitely exist. On the other hand, the magicians, illusionists described in this book all did. As are the 'Scribe' Emily Hawkins a writer and editor whose New York Times bestseller Oceanology. Visionary/illustrator David Wyatt with Levi Pinfold another award winning artist combined with Tomislav Tomic "The Draftsman" whose combined efforts crafted this latest in the 'Ology series. Other 'Ology are Wisardology and Monsterology.

This awesome hard cover book starts right off on the front cover with a lenticular picture of a rabbit whose eye is red jewel and tilting the cover allows you to view the entrails of the rabbit! A lenticular image is a preceding version of holographs.

Novice aficionados of conjuring will have a glimpse of the stars of the 19th and 20th century: Houdini, Robert-Houdin, Davenport, Keller, Alexander. With approximately thirty effects to excite the budding magician - including coin, playing cards, plastic gimmicks hidden behind flaps, folders, and envelopes. At the same time, the reader will be treated to a starting effect called "The Paradoxical Hole" -

several rotations of pieces of a square result in production of a hole. The alternate title of the book "The Secret Science of Magic" are remembered that once the telephone, the lightbulb were thought of as impossible. Tricks of the eye/ science of seeing/ deceptions - taunts the text is seeing believing?



The Cradle of Illusionology is traced to Ancient Egypt. Types of magic tricks are described. The Learned Pig is a phenomenon of amazing animals. Blaise Manfre turns water into wine. Indoculis Privata Logui 'not apt to disclose secrets' the motto of the Magic Circle which inspired the Illusionists Guild (1905 vs 1915)

Coaching the beginner are the 3Ps, Practice, Performance, Patter. A section is devoted to Find the Ace routine by Hofzinser - the cards are provided.

Misdirection is both verbal and physical, mental and psychological. Keller is featured with his The Rose Tree.

Lafayette The Great is pictured with a graphic Lion in a Cage. The Science of Levitation - Princess Karnac is revealed. Disappearing section is devoted to the New and Marvelous Sphinx; the Mascot Moth working; the Proteus

Cabinet. Devotees and longstanding students of magic will be familiar. Magic and new technologies i.e. Tesla's electricity and Robert-Houdin's light and heavy box (which Ken Klosterman has and he shared it when we visited his fantastic museum) How magicians defy physical laws: escapology; fire walking; bed of nails and others.

Follows are the secrets of Houdini -needle swallowing, straightjacket escapes. Second sight, hypnosis, mind reading, number telepathy is not forgotten.


#### The Sound of Music

As anticipated, Richard Ustick did one of his patented hit-tunes-made-magical, singing and performing "Fountain of Silk" to the tune of Mountain of Love. Larry Samuels, followed with an excellent Sidewalk Shuffle/Tonte routine; and Greg Wauson performed a torn bill to an impossible location.

Jacques Lord displayed both his musical and magical talents with Vanishing Harmonicas and an Invisible Harmonica. Mago Ruly performed a variety of silk routines, capped by the production of a parrot in a cage. Jeff Marcus did a dated Color Changing CDs routine – made more interesting because his version uses 45s, which only Jeff and I remember what those are (I even remember 78s). Joe Mystic closed the

# New Book Features Ring 76 Members

The most famous magicians today, including several Ring 76 members, are featured in a new book by Michael E. Johnson, titled "Playing Cards Autographed By Magicians: A Collector's Guide" (ISBN 9780988534704).

This 82-page book, now selling on Amazon for \$19.99, provides an in-depth look at magic autographs on playing cards. More than 150 magicians are highlighted, with 192 autograph examples and 109 website links. There are special chapters on which magicians to collect, where to find them, and how to get their autographs either inperson, or by writing letters. As Johnson notes, "If you want to collect autographs, don't be a punk. Buy a ticket or buy a product. Support them, and they support you!"

Produced in full-color, "Playing Cards Autographed by Magicians" is packed with photos of autographs, playing cards, playing card decks, and famous Magicians. The issue of authenticity is addressed, from a suspected forged Doug Henning autograph selling on eBay in 2012, to the fake secretarial signature that was used by Houdini a century earlier. There is also an interesting chapter on forgeries and fakes from "The Magician" television series with Bill Bixby.

Serious collectors will appreciate the price information provided, as Johnson describes actual prices realized on eBay for this type of merchandise, even dissecting the origins of his collection which sold on eBay a few years ago for a record price. There are special sections on popular Magicians like Copperfield, Angel, Blaine, Burton, Siegfried & Roy, Penn & Teller, and Jay. Everything is cross-referenced with a 414-subject index.
