### Passing of Secrets

Our April meeting was our annual Teach-A-Trick Night. The meeting was called to order at 7PM by our Interim President, Sal Barajas. Bob Meigs briefly described the LUNA party concept planned for our July Installation and Awards Banquet, and encouraged attendance and participation. (Editors Note: The LUNA concept is discussed further in this newsletter.)

The Teach-A-Trick format consisted of eight instructors, divided into two teams of four. There were four presentation tables, so the instructors alternated between teaching their trick and watching the presentations of the other team's members. Thus, instructors saw five presentations (including their own), and other Ring members saw all eight. Presentations were limited to ten minutes.

The first team included Malcolm Campbell, Joe Mystic, Jacques Lord, and Alfonso Vasquez. Malcolm explained the "Use of a Mundane Slight," and Joe demonstrated a Ring on Chain effect and Endless an Chain routine. Joe also distributed a small version of the Ring on Chain to everyone. Jacques taught a Hot & Cold Aces card routine, and Alfonso showed us an impressive (though not all that easy) Phone in Balloon.

The second team consisted of Nick Brown, Cary Schaffner, Bob Pozner, and Bob Meigs. Nick explained a Steinmeyer routine called Broken Arithmetic, and Cary showed us a card routine called Whispering Jokers. Bob Posner taught card palming and the Asher Spread Control; and Bob Meigs presented the Richard Osterlind routine, Radio Sum Total.

Our instructors did a fine job this year, helping their audience with written instructions, give-aways, and personalized instruction. The wide variety of effects presented should have provided something for nearly everyone.




# For the Magician who Specializes in ENT

### Producing money from the spectators ears and nose and using the magicians throat to entertain) Reviewed by Joel A Moskowitz M D August 24, 2013

Robert Baxt was born in Brooklyn, speaks Japanese, has a law degree and a master performer/writer/humorist/balloon twister etc etc. He presents his version of the Miser's Dream in an informative DVD. Robert mentions that he worked for Al Flosso, the Coney Island Fakir. Flosso (Albert Levinson) owned Martinka Magic Shop on 34th street in Manhattan (Houdini coowned it.). Baxt reports that Jeff McBride worked for Al Flosso too. (I worked for Al Flosso for several months and I bought my Tarbell Course from my earnings).

Flosso's signature effect was to amaze/amuse a child from his mesmerized audience by plucking coins from the air/ the ears/ the nose and into a metal bucket. Robert Baxt offers his interpretation. Not as comic looking as Al Flosso (five foot two and rotund) but able to elicit the same laughter from his audience. Robert has boiled the magic down to the essentials. He eschews complicated sleights. He doesn't need it to entertain.



The DVD may seem redundant. He performs and performs and performs.

If you are comfortable being comedic, this DVD will help. This routine is not for every magician. Most Miser's Dream routines are staged for children. You have to have a temperment for the little tykes. But if you are at ease working with kids, this DVD will allow you to with little effort, excite, entertain and enhance enjoyment.

Baxts special skills from his resume induces the student to imagine that Robert is a multiple person: Professional Comedian, Studio Audience Warm-Up, Magic Tricks and Illusions, Juggling, Lock-Picking, Twisting Balloon Animals, Ventriloquism, Pick pocketing, Gambling & 3 card monte skills, Puppetry, Mind Reading, Hypnosis, Pulling a tablecloth out from under the dishes, Plate-Spinning, Rope Twirling, Can use Chopsticks, Extensive work with Children's theater, Dialects, Aerobic Dance, Circus Ringmaster, Rolling a coin across his knuckles, Yo-Yo expert, Professional stand-in. SPEAKS FLUENT JAPANESE.

Baxt left out one quality that makes this DVD Baxt, A Boy, & A

Bucket: Robert's Super Easy to do, Lots of Laughs, Miser's Dream Routine! a winner. He is a teacher. Cost? \$72.00 for a metal bucket, washer/palming coins, jumbo coin and 60 min DVD. If you like this DVD, you will find on Robert Baxts web site,


# For the Ambitious Magician

Released by Arnel Renegado marketing by RSVP Magic/England.

Arnel from the Phillipines seeks to amaze with facile methods and he achieves this with Creased. Many

ambitious magicians aim to present a unique version of the Ambitious Card effect. Few do. This does. The essence of the Ambitious Card trick is that a chosen/identified (inscribed with a magic marker on its face) is able to rise to the top of the pack i.e. an ambitious card will ascend



miraculously. The magician upon receiving the signed card, places it in the gripped pack and instantly, wallah, it suddenly appears on the top of the deck. The deck may be examined and the signed card is a souvenier.

The pack may be borrowed, purchased anew in the traditional Ambitious Card Routine (ACR). Creased fails to compete with these provisos but it makes up with the astounding magic. Magi who know the

method for ACR will be confused with this Renegado Routine.

Not only is the random (any) card signed and mutilated on its face (so as to identify it) but the card is creased! Approximately one eighth down a horizontal crease is created with the chosen card. The card is inserted in the middle of the gripped pack and instantly appears as the top card! It can be given to the spectator immediately. Bafflement!

The gimmick, Arnel says, will last years...but....if you need a replacement how to build it is revealed in detail. Because you use a gimmick you must have the same deck type as the gimmick. This is the only short coming. Most spectators will not consider this...magicians are supposed to have decks...and the deck is ready for examination (without the gimmick - which is added surreptitiously.

If you are an ambitious cardician creased is prescribed by Dr. Moskowitz Rx Rx Rx Rx 4/5.

## What on Earth is a LUNA Party?



The important things are to COME and to be ENTHUSIASTIC! You won't want to miss it, because this will be an entertainment adventure like none you've ever attended. And we certainly hope lots of you will participate. If you've been in Ring Close-Up or Stand-Up Contests, or in our Teach-A-Trick Nights, bring what you performed and do it again! If you have something new (as Jeff Marcus always does at Denny's), BRING IT! If you have a trick you think will fool magicians, sign up for our Fool-the-Pros contest. If they don't know how you did it (and some of the judges may not be very experienced), you'll win a bottle of wine.

Please email Bob Meigs at carshows@sbcglobal.net if you'd like to perform. He needs to know about how many people might do Teach-A-Trick or Close-Up routines in order to know how many stations to provide, as well as what else to expect. He will prepare a loose schedule, but there will be plenty of room for impromptu performers.

If you don't want to commit, but you have a trick or two, play an instrument, have a new judo move or dance step, or own a Santa suit, BRING IT!

The party will be on Sunday, July 13, at Bob Meigs house in Solana Beach. It will start at 5PM, with the installations and awards at 7:30. Dinner will be ongoing from 5:30 to 7:30, and will be something you can carry around.

Be sure to bring you camera; you'll want to take A LOT of pictures!


