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MINUTES OF THE APRIL 10, 2017 RING 76 MONTHLY MEETING

The meeting was convened at 7:00 pm President Joe "Mystic" McGrievy at the Mission Bay Boat and Ski Club. There were 29 members and 4 guests in attendance

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Joe noted that Terry Lunceford had performed the previous week in the Peller Theater at the Magic Castle, together with Lorenzo Clark. Joe — and others were especially impressed with Terry in his tuxedo doing the linking rings. Ken Intriligator agreed and thanked Terry for getting him into the room with a VIP seat!

Joe also mentioned that he was blown away by Den Den's performance in the Palace of Mystery at the Castle that week.

2nd V.P. (Entertainment) Richard Ustick, promised more on the history of playing cards for a future meeting. He also briefly mentioned the Election Committee and the upcoming election. Members are encouraged to run for any office, though the President must be someone who has already served on the board. A Sergeant-at-Arms and a Member-at-Large are needed; the other positions have current Board members who are willing to serve again next year. Jeff Marcus, who is on the Election Committee, noted that at the last Board meeting, each of the Board members would be happy to rotate off of the board if other members are willing to serve.

The announcements were kept short to avoid making it too late of a night for the kids present. For that reason, there was no new magic raffle.

PROGRAM

The theme for the meeting's magic performances was Kids Magic. Among the few visitors were three actual "kids": Leo, Max, and Sohum, who watched and participated as on-stage

helpers for the magic performances.

Cary Schaffner, aka "Cary the Magish", started out mentioning the importance of eye-contact when, wow, it seemed his eye was suddenly there rolling on a spoon (it was just a joke and all was fine). He did a giant magic coloring book with helpers Max and Sohum

Ken Intriligator did a presentation for the kids on the old Three Card Monte scam. The routine was essentially based on that of Darwin Ortiz, with a few additions (some intentional, others not so much).

Charlie Gott did a gospel magic presentation with helpers Leo and Sohum. The two helpers padlocked Charlie with a serious-looking set of wrist-cuffs, which represented "the chains of sin". Charlie turned around and then kept humorously lending a mysteriously unshackled hand to the helpers as they followed his instructions. The chains were no match for the Higher Power of Good.

Greg Wauson had two big, grown-up looking kids named Laurie (Pearson) and Richie (Robertson) as helpers. They were both asked to inspect a black, cloth bag. Laurie said it was legit, and Richie agreed, saying "it looks like a normal Malini bag to me!" Laurie made an egg appear by saying "bawk bawk hawk". Then it mysteriously appeared and disappeared, perfectly performed to a great comic routine.

Kenny Shelton did some excellent rope magic, with great comedy. Knots appeared and disappeared, the ends of the rope disappeared. The routine ended with a Professor's Nightmare with ropes of different and changing lengths

The following additional performances were not part of the monthly competition:

Joe Mystic told a story about a mischievous boy, and showed a can full of coal lumps turn into a can full of diamonds, for all the good children. Then, with **Sohum** as a helper, they each tore some wrapping paper and, magically, the torn paper

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turned into a paper hat for Sohum. As a finale, Joe produced a long, long, long chain of paper ribbons from his mouth.

Dave from Total Kid's Entertainment did a fun routine with Presto the Bunny Rabbit peeking out from different parts of a holder and then disappearing and appearing in a hat. Then, with Max and Sohum as helpers, a silk disappeared from a bag and transported into cage. This was a lot of fun, as it kept "not working," each time "requiring a bigger wand." The sight gag and buildup was hilarious for the kids and adults. In the end, it took a wand that was perhaps over 10 feet long, but, yes, it worked — the silk transported.

Sohum, who is 15 years old, was visiting relatives in San Diego and is a member of another IBM ring in California. He is a very talented, young magician and performed a few routines for us. The first was a short sponge-ball routine. Next was a mini-linking ring routine. Finally, he did an excellent performance of Garrett Thomas' Stand Up Monte. We hope to see you back at Ring 76 whenever you're in town, Sohum.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 and many went to a diner in Pacific Beach for dinner, dessert, and camaraderie.

Keep watching the newsletter for more details in the coming months and we look forward to seeing you there in July.




The New Board of Directors Will Be Elected in June

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

REPORTS

The election committee will take any additional names for the upcoming election. The board strongly encourages new members to consider serving on the board.

June Meeting - The theme is food magic and the membership will elect the new board. Dues will also be due.

Installation banquet - The banquet is set for July 9th at the Boat Club. There was discussion about catering. Joe had some catering details from Olive Garden and Jeff had some details from Beckers'. It was decided to use the Olive Garden who will provide a pasta menu. The Ring will provide coffee and dessert.

Several potential types of entertainment were discussed but no decision was made.
