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Minutes of the May 8, 2017, Monthly Membership Meeting

The meeting was convened at 7:11 pm by President Joe "Mystic" McGrievy at the Mission Bay Boat and Ski Club. There were 29 members and 1 guests in attendance.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Joe announced that, due to lack of participation, the annual stage magic contest was cancelled. The board decided that it was time to reevaluate our meeting format, and to use the meeting time to get feedback from the members.

2nd V.P. (Membership) **James Thayer** announced that membership dues of \$30 will be due at the end of June. Members can pay James in person at the June ring meeting or by other options. There will be a late fee of \$5 after June 30.

Lynn Fischer, who does children's magic, is looking for white doves. **Joe** mentioned a possible lead

Guest **Manny Sanchez** introduced himself. Manny is on active duty in the Navy. He has had a long time involvement in magic.

The election board — Jeff Marcus, Greg Wauson, and Rich Robertson — reminded the ring about the upcoming election for the Ring Board, and that all positions are open (the President must, however, be a current or former Board member). With the exception of the Sergeant-at-Arms, the current Board is willing to continue in their present positions but they encourage others to put their names on the ballot,

John Hunter volunteered to run for Sergeantat-Arms and there were two volunteers for Member-at-Large: Loch David Crane and Robert Vinson, who would be in addition to Member-at-Large and Newsletter editor Malcolm Campbell. If any other member wants to run for any position, contact Jeff, Greg, or Rich. Nominations will be open at the June meeting.

The membership will also vote for the Ring's Member of the Year at the June meeting.

Richard Ustick reminded the members that the theme for the June meeting is "Food Magic". Also, the installation banquet will be Sunday July 9, starting at 5pm, at the San Diego Mission Bay Boat and Ski Club.

Joe Mystic announced that the Comedy Palace has moved their magic night to either Friday or Saturday night, but only once per month. Contact them or check their website for details

There was no new trick raffle this time. **Jeff Marcus** brought a new effect to demonstrate and raffle off but time did not permit it. The popular program will continue at the June meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

It was noted that the Ring Reports have not appeared in the Linking Ring for a long time. This was a mistake on the part of the Secretary and has been corrected.

PROGRAM

In place of the Stage Magic competition, **Joe** and **Richard** moderated an open discussion about ideas for the Ring meetings.

Joe solicited discussion about why so few signed up to perform in the Stage Magic competition. Some said they didn't have any new material.

Having the performances be less competitive and shifting the emphasis to providing constructive feedback to the performers was

suggested as a way to get more members on stage. Several variations in the voting process to recognize various strong points were also suggested.

Eliminating the monthly themes was presented as another possibility to increase participation. Having more meetings with non-competitive performances such as Teach-a-Trick or more informal small-group sharing sessions before or after the meeting was considered. A member who also belongs to the North County ring recommended their meeting format, which is non-competitive and more about sharing

It was noted that Jack's Place might become available for the Ring to go back there for our events.

Following the discussion, several members performed for the audience. **Terry Godfrey** did a coinsnatching routine with a handkerchief and a nickel balanced on his finger. The spectator repeatedly failed to grab the nickel from his finger.

Jeff Pearson did a card reveal with a tiny card from tiny wallet.


Jeff Marcus did a spoof on The Gift.




The New Board of Directors Will Be Elected in June



Bob teaches a daily magic camp, called Wizard School, a weekend magic camp, Abra-KID-Abra, and does the Time Traveler's Magic Show daily at 4PM in the Creative Youth tent. **Greg Wauson** will be doing the Time Traveler Show on Saturday, June 17.

MINUTES OF RING 76 BOARD MEETING May 22, 2017



The meeting was called to order by President Joe "Mystic" McGrievy at 7:30 pm (dinner started at 7:00pm). The other board members present were: First V.P. (Entertainment) Richard Ustick, Secretary Ken Intriligator, Treasurer Bob Meigs, Sergeant-at-Arms Sherry Luft, Second V.P. (Membership) James Thayer, and Newsletter Editor and Memberat-Large Malcolm Campbell. Member-at-large, Past President and Librarian) Kenny Shelton was absent.

Also present were Territorial V.P. Jeff Marcus and guest Ring member Loch David Crane.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the April Board meeting were approved.

REPORTS

Treasurer's report - Treasurer **Bob Meigs** presented his report to the board. There were only minor changes from last month. The report was approved by the board.

Library report - The Librarian was not present. **Membership report - James Thayer** reported that Ring 76 has a new member (Lynn Fischer), so the Ring now has 68 members in good standing, including 11 Life Members.

OLD BUSINESS

May 8, 2017 ring meeting report - Because of the cancellation of the Stage Competition. there was plenty of time for discussion of the preferred content of the membership meetings and many good suggestions were recorded.

This was further discussed by the Board. It was

decided to conduct a Survey Monkey survey to get more input from members. The new board will use those suggestions in August for planning next year's calendar

The Board was reminded that Members are asked to support the bar at the Boat Club to the tune of \$50 minimum to keep the venue at no cost to the Ring. Please buy drinks at the bar; They are very reasonably priced.

Ring incorporation - Malcolm has made some progress on getting the ring incorporated as a non-profit organization.

Installation Banquet - Set for Sunday, July 9th 5-9pm at the Boat Club.

Joe made the catering arrangements with the Olive Garden. The ticket price will be \$20 per person.

Several possibilities for he entertainment are being explored. **Jeff Marcus** will see if there is anyone performing at the Magic Castle who would come here for the banquet. He is also looking for junior members of the Castle who would be willing and able to fill the slot. **Bob Meigs** is exploring the use of a complement of Ring members who will be performing at the fair this year.

There was also discussion of having members do strolling magic at the meeting prior to dinner.

. New Trick Raffle -- There was a suggestion to contact the trick's creator to get their blessing on the reveal, and the board agreed that they would be OK with the reveal if the creator OKs it. Jeff Marcus has a trick that he had prepared for the May meeting, and he can demonstrate it at the June meeting. There was further discussion about the cons of the reveal.

June Meeting - The theme is "Food Magic" and it will be a competition with points awarded going toward the Performer of The Year award.

The membership will alsoelect the new board.

NEW BUSINESS

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Jack's Place - Ex-member Michael Johnson has contacted several Board members on the subject of the Ring re-locating its meetings to Jack White's Magic Museum. There would be some money and time to be committed by the Ring to help Michael achieve his plans for making the space productive.

The Board decided to wait until a detailed proposal is available for review and negotiation.

The ring would like to give Michael moral support on a wait-and-see-what-happens basis.

NEWSLETTER

Malcolm reviewed the inputs from the Board needed for the newsletter

The board meeting adjourned at 8:45 pm.

Last Chance to Join the Ring 76 Board for 2017-18

Hey members, you know that the Ring doesn't run itself. We have a Board of Directors that keeps the Ring going and, hopefully, smoothly. As with many organizations, 10% of the membership of Ring 76 does 90 % of the work. Most of you come to the meetings and enjoy the entertainment but that's it. Why not consider giving something back to the club by joining the board and helping to make it a better ring?

Most of the people serving on the Board have done so for a long time — some off and on for over 20 years. Although all are dedicated to fulfilling their responsibilities, none of the Board members is married to the job; they do it for the love of the ring and step up when the other 50 members don't.

That being said, everyone on the board has indicated that they would happily give up their position to someone else who would be willing to take it over.

By joining the board, you are requested to attend Board meetings once a month (except for December), usually two weeks after the regular meeting. Board meetings ae at Bob and Mary Meigs' house at 7:00 pm. Most meetings last only about an hour or two including dinner (and beverages) most graciously prepared by Mary. Following a prepared agenda, the board reviews and discusses the business of the Ring. Throughout the year, meeting venues, themes of the meetings, scheduling of special events and lectures are set. The Board also reviews and proposes updates and interpretations of the governing aspects of our Constitution and Bylaws. The board executes its responsibilities to enforce the terms of the Constitution and ByLaws including the election process.

Following adjournment, discussions continue over dessert.

Any member can run for any office except President (you must have held any other position on the Board for a year before you can be president.) Although each member of the Board has an equal say and vote in the business of the Board, each member has the following additional specific tasks.

President: (currently Joe Mystic) presides over the Board and General Membership meetings.

First Vice President of Entertainment: (currently Richard Ustick) is in charge of arranging and conducting the entertainment and competitions at the membership meetings.

Second Vice President of Entertainment: (currently James Thayer) is in charge of keeping membership records and receiving dues. James is also our Webmaster and Historian.

Secretary: (currently Ken Intrilligator) records the minutes of all meetings & probably the most intensive job) keeps minutes of all meetings, submits them to the Newsletter and The Linking Ring magazine.

Treasurer: (currently Bob Meigs) deposits receipts, pays the bills and reports transactions to the board. **Sergeant-at-Arms**: (currently Sherry Luft) hands out badges, maintains attendance records and keeps order at the meetings.

The Board has two or three **Members-at-large** (currently Malcolm Campbell — who is also the MagiCurrents Editor — which participate in the workings of the Board by taking on specific assignments which they are best able to perform. This is a good position to start in to "get a feel" for the Board.

If you are interested in helping and giving something back to the ring, please contact one of us on the nominating committee, before the June meeting if possible, but you may ask to be placed on the ballot at any time before the election in June.
