MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER 8, 2018 RING MEETING

AT THE SAN DIEGO MISSION BAY BOAT AND SKI CLUB

President Robert Vinson and **VP of Entertainment Richard Ustick,** called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Richard announced that table payments are being taken for next month's Swap Meet. **Robert** announced that there will be three large collections of magic from deceased members estates and items donated by **Jack White**. There will be some larger items for sale.

Richard emphasized that the Swap Meet is open to all, and that members are encouraged to bring their friends.

Dr. Jeff Pearson reminded members about the North County Magic Club meet-up on the first Thursday of every month at Cocos in North County. The meeting is open to all, and is an opportunity to perform for lay people, who know to come on the first Thursday to watch magic.

MINI-LECTURE

The Board has been providing mini-lectures at our monthly meetings. The October lecture was given by President **Robert Vinson**, who thoughtfully wrote up his advice into a printed booklet given to the Ring members. Robert started out as a performer in music, and has extensive experience in magic performance, including as a professional magician performing for large audiences in Las Vegas for many years. The lecture was excellent, covering many aspects of performing including getting gigs, what to do and not to do, setting up, on-stage tips, etc. There was a good discussion and the booklet will be a valuable reminder. Thank you, Robert!

COMPETITION PERFORMANCES

Next came the member performances, with excellent EMC-ing by **Richard.**

First up was **Malcolm Campbell** who performed scary-themed magic in Dracula costume. He demonstrated a mysterious light bulb from his magic drawer, and then silks with knots that came undone. Then he had an audience member (**Ken Intriligator**) choose a word from his book (Dracula), and he correctly determined that the word was "disappointing." The performance was certainly not!

The next performer was Mago Ruly who called on Nick Benevento to assist him. Mago explained how in Mexico the Dias Del Las Meurtos is like Halloween, but also a little different. He brought out some spirit slate chalkboards, and demonstrated some amusing drawings. Then the spirits took over and correctly wrote the name of Nick's card on the board with chalk

Next, **Matt King** set the mood with a scary costume calling the spirits with candle light. The spirits answered questions, somewhat mischievously — and with good humor, — with mysterious knocks from the back of the room.

Assistant **Sherry Luft** selected a card, and the spirits correctly determined its suit and value.

Ken Intriligator had several audience members examine and shuffle packets from what appeared to be a Halloween themed deck of cards, but which was presented as a mausoleum of ghosts. The packets were collected and further shuffled. Nick Benevento assisted in counting off ten cards, facedown, and holding them as in a card game. Ken explained that the spirits had infected their minds. He had Nick look at the clubs, then hearts, then spades, then diamonds, correctly naming all of the cards in Nick's hand in the order that he thought of them.

Ian Gibbons had audience member Ken Intriligator shake a die in a box "really hard, as if your life depends on it". Ian had a display with four sheets of paper numbered one through six. The die came up as a "4" and the sheet with "4" was turned over and shown to say "high-five", so Ian gave Ken a "high-five". In doing so, the audience saw that all five of the other pieces of paper said "Kill". Whew, that was a close one!

Alfonso Vasquez was assisted by Dave Chiu as he performed a trick-or-treat theme, with Jack-o-Lantern sponge balls. In the end, many, many Jack-o-Lanterns were produced from a previously collapsed trick-or-treat container, including a large one for the finale.

Jeff Marcus had some fun jokes and predictions, and then found the word that Malcolm Campbell selected from a magazine.

Kenny Shelton demonstrated the handicraft of a ghost, which resides in Dean Dill's box, with assistance from **Dr. Jeff Pearson** and **Laurie Pearson**. The ghost linked and unlinked two ropes and a solid metal ring.

The meeting was adjourned around 9:00, and many of us went to Buddies Diner for dinner, dessert, and camaraderie.



This January, Ring 76 is going to have its own Ring 76 "Can You Fool Us" event.


Members of Ring 76 are invited to perform in front of the Ring and a panel of judges who will then see if they can figure out HOW THE PERFORMER DID IT !!!!!
