# Minutes of the April 9th Ring76 Meeting

#### Clairemont Senior Center

President **Robert Vinson** and Entertainment VP **Richard Ustick** called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. Prior to the meeting, raffle tickets were being sold for \$5/ticket for a 50/50 raffle. J.C.

Wagner's widow, and also a get-well-soon card for Malcolm Campbell. There were 23 ring members attending and 3 guests. The guests were Ron Zimmer (a magician from Florida and friend of Jeff Marcus), Diane Wollan (from San Diego and Apple Valley, who was a guest of Sargent-of-arms John Hunter), and Katrina Dismukes (magician, frequent raffle winner, and daughter of Gary Dismukes). The raffle winner this time was Gary Salisbury.

#### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Richard Ustick announced the names of the election committee (including Greg Wauson and Dave **Chui**) and that every position (aside from the President) is up for grabs if anyone wants to contribute in this way to the ring. The current members would be happy to pass the torch, and that would help to bring fresh ideas to the ring for next year. The May meeting will include the annual Standup competition - see the website for the performance time limit and other rules, and email Richard if you would like to enter. The June meeting will include the election for next year's Board, dues will be due, and the performance theme will be story and historical magic. Also, starting next month, members can "rent" a table for a minimal fee to the ring (I think \$10) and sell magic items before the meeting starts. Finally, ring Secretary Ken Intriligator announced that he met up with past Ring Secretary **Jacques Lord** at the Magic Castle the day before.

#### **SHORT LECTURE**

Greg Wauson discussed some very helpful insights that he got from reading the book Maximum

Entertainment by Ken Weber. This included an interesting definition of entertainment, and several "director's notes" advice for performers.

#### **PERFORMANCES**

Josselin Nespoux gave a very nice goodbye performance. Josselin came to San Diego from France a little over two years ago (as a researcher at UCSD), and has been a wonderful addition to our Ring for that time. He is a talented performer, and indeed he is on our Ring's Hall of Fame as the winner of the close up competition in both 2018 and 2017. Josselin performed a version of a Boris Wild effect called perfect open prediction: the

prediction card card is shown (9S, with blue back) and then Joe Mystic was invited to deal cards face up from a red-backed deck until he wanted to stop. The next card was kept upside down and then all other cards were turned right-side up, and it was noted that none were the 9S. It was then shown that the card that Joe stopped at indeed matched the prediction. Josselin also performed a one-coin routine. Josselin also performed a beautiful routine (I think based on Osmosis by Slyvain Mirouf) to music where the middle is cut out of two cards, transforming them into linking



rings that were linked and unlinked with four phases of interesting twists and turns.

"Original Magic" theme performances:

**David Chui** brought in a placement from a Chinese restaurant that listed the twelve animals of the Chinese Zodiac, and the described a bit about the characteristics of people born in the year of the

various animals. He explained that he was born in the year of the dog, so he has an acute sense of smell. **Ron Zimmer** selected a card, which was then lost in the deck. David then found the correct card from the smell of Ron's touch.

**Jeff Marcus** performed his handlings of the ambitious card, with card selection (and signed) made by **Diane Wollan**. The card went to the top,

the bottom, to any number called for from the top. Finally, it went to Jeff's wallet, which was in view on the tabletop the whole time.

Mark Booth did a routine with a small padlock and many similar-looking keys. Greg Wauson assisted, putting his wallet in a lockbox and verifying that a none of the keys opened the padlock, except for one. Greg then padlocked his wallet into the lockbox and mixed the keys. He showed them to Mark, who eliminated each by intuition. The last remaining key was verified to open the padlock, and Greg's wallet was safely returned.

**Ken Intriligator** did a version of the three shell game (inspired by Bob Sheet's routine from the

School of Scoundrels), presented with a "kid's magic" theme. Diane Wollan was asked to play the part of a kid (with John Hunter as her dad). First a Minecraft Creeper doll was shown to sneeze, producing a baby creeper pea. Diane was given the opportunity to put it under the shell incubators and slide them

around. Then the baby creeper played games with Diane and her dad, where whichever shell dad thought it was under was wrong and whichever one Diane thought it was under was correct. Finally, Diane put the baby creeper pea under one shell, covered it with a bowl, and an empty shell was covered with a glass. The creeper pea still went from one to the other shell.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00, and many of us went to the nearby Denny's for dinner, dessert, and camaraderie.

# Minutes of the Ring 76 Board Meeting

April 22, 2019

The meeting was called to order by President Robert Vinson at 6:58 pm. The board members present were: First V.P. (entertainment) Richard Ustick, Treasurer Bob Meigs, Sargent-of-arms John Hunter, Secretary Ken Intriligator, Member-at-Large Rich Robertson, and Member-at-Large Joe "Mystic" McGrievy. Absent were Second V.P. (membership) James Thayer, Newsletter Editor / Member-at-large Malcolm Campbell, and librarian Kenny Shelton.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the March board meeting were approved.

#### REPORTS

Treasurer's report Treasurer Bob Meigs presented his April report to the board. There was a question about some additional cash from a few members who have already paid their dues. Library report Kenny Shelton was absent, so there was no library report.

Membership report James informed the board via email that there is no change in the membership roster: there are currently 59 members in good standing.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

April meeting recap: The meeting was discussed and seen as a success. Greg's presentation on Maximum Entertainment was great, and very informative. Josselin gave a wonderful goodbye performance, and several members performed. There was some debate about if the lectures are useful for the majority of members, who are hobbyists and might not want to develop shows.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

May Meeting: The stand-up competition meeting. The board extensively discussed and debated the scoring rubric, and settled on one with four categories. One member suggested eliminating this competition in future years, given that there tend to be few performers. It was also suggested that the time limit (10 minutes) could be dropped if there are few performers. Currently, three members have told Richard that they will perform. Robert will have the performers contact him, so he can arrange for things to go smoothly with whatever needs they might have (music etc). Rich Robertson will be the Master of Ceremonies, since Richard Ustick will be out of town.

Board Elections: The nominating committee is David Chui, Jeff Marcus, and Greg Wauson. The Ring will need a new Sargent-of-arms, and a possibility for that position was discussed, and will be contacted by Richard or Robert.

June Meeting: The election meeting. The \$30 dues will be due, and the theme is history or story magic.

Meeting Sales Tables: The Ring will charge \$10 for a table to those who want to sell magic items before the meetings. There was discussion about accessing the meeting room starting at 6pm, to allow for an hour of sales and socializing before the meeting



starts. Also, the Ring will sell donated items, and Bob Meigs will bring a Square or other credit card payment system. This will start at the June meeting.

Installation Banquet: Robert got bids from both Porters and Bekker's - both were over the \$20 per person price point. The board is leaning toward going with Porters, but will further consider other options, given the cost. The board decided to have Randy Kappe the Hypnotist perform, which Jeff Marcus has arranged for the Ring. Randy has generously offered to make the performance gratis. The board will reach out to Jack White, to invite him to attend the Banquet as a guest of honor, if he is able to do so.

#### **NEWSLETTER**

James Thayer is again willing to fill in temporarily for Malcolm Campbell for the Newsletter.

The board meeting adjourned at 8:50 pm. Rich Robertson seconded the motion.

## You Are The Judge

For our annual Stand Up Contest this year we are going to continue to use the judging scoresheet that we introduced at the Closeup Contest. Rather than just having a popular vote, we are asking the members to think about the performers they are watching and judging them on a small number of professional standards. This is, after all, a contest and not just another performance night. We, the audience, expect the performers to have a higher degree of polish in these shows and so they deserve a higher degree of scrutiny when being judged.

As you see from the picture (Page 7), there are four categories you will be expected to review when casting your ballot for Standup Performer of the Year. These are the Originality of the performance, the Poise, and Presentation of the material, the overall technical skills or ease of presentation, and the Crow appeal. How did the act go over with you and the rest of the audience?

The Board understands that we are asking a little more of the membership on these entertaining nights, but the contests ask a little more of the performer, does it not? If the member is going to go up to the stage and give us a professional quality show then do
