

Teach-A-Trick

April Meeting Online!

There's enough bad news around with the coronavirus crisis; now for some good news: Our April meeting will still go on! 
Trick of the Month Club

Misers Dream

In Miser's Dream, the magician produces coins from thin air (or anywhere), and drops them into a coin pail. This was a favorite routine of the great T. Nelson Downs, more than 100 years ago.

"The Dream" is a based on the even-older trick producing a coin from a child's ear. With the addition of the pail, the magician can repeat the effect with "coin-after-coin."

The routine requires two magical "moves" – palming a coin, and a "bucket drop." Virtually



every stage magician has performed this routine, and if you don't know how it works, you should!

The Props

All you need is about 7 half-dollar coins, and a metal pail. Many pros use a tooth bush can as a"pail," but even a tin can will do - so long as you can hold it with four fingers inside, and it makes a loud ringing sound (called the "clunk") when a coin is dropped inside.

You also could buy a commercial Coin Pail, some with built-in "gimmicks." But these pails are expensive, you don't need the gimmicks, and the pails usually look like champagne buckets – which are vestiges of the past. This is why many pros today use a tooth brush can.

The gimmicks allow for stealing additional coins, hiding "droppable" coins inside the pail, and faking the "clunk." Our version of Miser's Dream uses no gimmicks, so you need only the handful of coins and an un-gimmicked pail. (Later, however, we describe a "coin ladder," which is an alternative to the pail.)

The Set-Up

Stack 6 coins on the finger-tips of your right hand, palm up. Tip the stack over backwards, so the bottom coin remains at your finger-tips, and the overlapping coins extend toward your palm.

Slide the pail horizontally over your fingers and the coins, grasping the upper side between your fingers (now inside the pail) and your thumb. The coins now are hidden, yet you can move the pail freely.



Hide another coin in your left hand in a fingerpalm position. You're ready to go! This set-up is easier than it sounds, and with a little practice, you'll be able to do it unnoticed as you pick up your pail.

The Performance

First, show the pail as "empty" (even though it's really not). Then, with your left hand, produce a coin from a child's ear. To "produce" this coin, simply slide it with your thumb until it's held between your left thumb and index finger. Extend your other fingers so the audience sees that you are holding only one coin!

Now pretend to drop this coin into your pail, but actually, return it to the finger-palm position! Use the middle finger of your right hand to push the bottom coin of your "hidden stack" into the pail. The coin from the "hidden stack" actually produces the "clunk" sound!

Bring your left hand up with the original coin again in a finger-palm position, and you're ready to go again!

Our set-up lets you drop 7 coins, which is plenty! In fact, the last 3 drops can be "invisible coins," instead of a "produced" coin.




To switch to "invisible coins," on the fourth drop, really drop the coin in your left hand into the pail. For the remainder of the routine, have audience members toss "invisible coins." Pretend to catch these "invisible coins" in the pail, releasing coins from your right hand to make the "clunks." For the finish, dump all 7 coins onto a table top.


Using a Coin Ladder

A "coin ladder" is an alternative to the pail. With most coin ladders, coins drop through a series of glass or metal panes, producing a musical sound as they fall. This dramatizes the "drop," and adds a musical effect to the routine. Of course, a ladder is both bulky and expensive.

If you use a ladder, I recommend one equipped with a "waterfall" feature, allowing you to release a dozen or more hidden coins all at once. This permits you to finish by having the whole audience throw invisible coins into the ladder at one time. Even if you don't always use the waterfall, it's nice to have this capability.

WHAT'S NEW?

Magic Video Streaming Project:

The Magic Video Streaming project is one where we will have all the magic videos we legally own available to members for streaming via a PLEX media server. At last count, we had over 1,200 instructional and performance magic videos that will be available for viewing on the server.

Current Project Status: We currently have a prototype server running on a Dell Optiplex 7010 desktop. It is running Windows 10 Home that needs to be updated to Window 10 Pro for remote access capability. We have PLEX Media Server loaded (paid version) on it. It is capable of doing 1-2 video streams concurrently. Our goal is to be able to do at least 5 concurrent video streams of 1080p video.

As many of you know, I started a fund raiser for money to buy either a new server or a used server or parts to build our own server. From that effort, we raised \$825. The hardware to build our new server



has been ordered and I will start building it as soon as everything arrives.

I do not have enough money left to buy a Windows 10 Pro license. That will cost about \$200 so if you can afford to, please reach deep into your pockets so we could get this project running, it would benefit you, the club, and be appreciated by all.
