

#### **PERFORMANCE and TEACH-A-TRICK:**


**Matt King** was assisted by daughter **Ava King.** Matt demonstrated a napkin tear with palming, which is presented as a demonstration with a surprise ending

that there is variant by Allan Ackerman, in his Las Vegas Kardma book.


**Jeff Marcus** demonstrated a trick with a rubber band, where the rubber band passed through finger after finger.

**Terry Godfrey** taught the Tenkai pennies trick from Bobo. He showed an interesting way to get into the Tenkai (also called Goshman) pinch by having the coin in the classic palm position and using the pinky to lever it quickly into the pinch position.

We had a special guest, who was invited by **Craig Blackwood: Paul Draper,** who was making his fifth appearance of the day from a space that he set up his home. Paul talked about the millions of school age kids who are at quarantined home these days, and how on any day hundreds of thousands will be having a birthday. So he set up a page to

help fund low cost (\$20) 30 minute shows for hundreds of kids daily. Craig Blackwood discussed this project, and how he and Paul are doing a show in connection with HP. Paul discussed some aspects of how to choreograph for the camera, and how to keep it interactive and involve the audience members at home with making the choices, and they are the ones who do something to cause the magic. Paul gave many valuable tips on performing for the camera, including how to adapt to some differences in misdirection in performing for the camera vs performing live. Paul is consulting for magicians on how to adapt to our new situation. Paul's website is https://www.patreon.com/PaulDraper and joining the site for \$5 helps to fund his shows for kids. Thank you Paul, and thank you to all of the presenters.

## Shavings from the Board

Minutes of the Ring 76 Board Meeting

April 27th, 2020

The meeting was via Zoom and it was called to order by President **Richard Ustick** at 7:09 pm. The board members present were: First V.P. (entertainment) **Greg Wauson**, Second V.P. (membership) **James Thayer**, Treasurer **Joe "Mystic" McGrievy**, Secretary **Ken Intriligator**, Sargent-of-arms **David Chiu**, and Member-at-Large **Rich Robertson**. Also





present were Librarian and Member-at-Large **Gary Salisbury**, IBM Regional Representative **Jeff Marcus**, and North County and Military Liaison **Josh Sherwin** and Social Media rep. **Mark Booth**.

## **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

The minutes of the March board meeting were approved.

#### REPORTS

<u>**Treasurer's report</u>** Joe went over the month's check register and other charges.</u>

Library report and discussion Gary Salisbury presented his report to the board. The PLEX server prototype is up and running now, with a new processor on order for a faster server. Users need to download the free PLEX app and Gary will add them for access.

Membership and Newsletter and website:

James Thayer's update: we remain at 61 members. James would like to find another editor. Any volunteers?

**First VP of Entertainment Greg Wauson** gave a recap of the April Zoom meeting and teach-a-trick. There were 26 or 27 participants, with good feedback. Greg did a zoom prep session with the presenters, and everything went very well. There were no glitches. Kudos to Greg! (There was a side discussion about benefits of having future board meetings on Zoom.) There was a discussion about having former members visit the meeting on Zoom.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

<u>May 11 Meeting</u>: Greg has booked Carissa Hendrix, aka Lucy Darling, to give a lecture. Greg will write about it in the newsletter. Non-members could perhaps join for a fee by pre-pay on PayPal. There was a question about recording, but we will not since, we assume that it would not be welcomed by Carissa.

**June Meeting:** Will there be a close-up contest? Via Zoom? There was a discussion about prerecorded vs live performances. There was a question about possibly having the performers physically meet and perform live in the same space, and record it for the members to watch. This was seen as problematic for at least one potential performer. There was a discussion about the minimum number of performers. Joe can videotape performers in his warehouse. The board debated various options for the rules if it is videotaped (for example, full body should be visible). Greg will send an email to to the Ring to assess interest level.

**Installation Banquet:** It's too soon to decide about what will happen by July.

**New Board and Election:** James will look into ways to vote online.

**Future of Ring 76:** The Board would like to keep the dues at the current level, and give more in terms of Zoom lectures etc. if we are unable to physically meet. Dues can be paid via PayPal.

## Trick of the Month Club

A Card at Any Number

ACAAN stands for "Any Card at Any Number." Nicknamed the **"Holy Grail,"** this is perhaps the best-known card trick in magic. There are many versions of the trick, but of those I know, **this is the best**.

I don't know where I got it, nor its real name, but it came from the fertile mind the late, great, *Barrie Richardson*. So I just call it, *"The Richardson Effect."* It can be done with a borrowed deck, requires no set-up, fits in your pocket, works in any venue, produces a different result every time, is easy to do, and is a real "fooler"! What more can you ask?

#### The Richardson Effect

You can use a borrowed deck and let a spectator shuffle. Give a spectator a *free choice* from a facedown fan. While the spectator is showing the card to others (but not you), hold the deck in your left hand and slide-off the *top four cards* into your right hand. Hold them with the outside edges tilted slightly *down* so the audience cannot see *how few cards* are in this packet.

Tell the spectator to put the selected card back "*in the middle of the deck*," and extend the packet in your left hand. Place the packet in your right hand (four cards) on top of the spectator's card. It looks like the card is "*buried*" in the deck, but it is actually **5**<sup>th</sup> **from the top.** 

Riffle shuffle the deck a couple times, leaving the *top few cards* (at least 5) intact. If you can do a *"false-cut"* (which does not change the order of the cards), throw it in – otherwise, just continue on.

Ask a second spectator to select a number between one and 52. (Use your audience management skills get a number above 10 and below 30.) Using the conversation with the spectator as "cover," make a *pass* with a packet of slightly more than 5 cards (perhaps 8 or 9) from the top of the deck to bottom. As you make this pass, turn the cards over so the deck now has card backs facing out on both sides.

This *pass* is the key to the trick - and fortunately, it is *easy to do*. Hold the deck in your left hand, thumb on top, with your right hand concealing the right edge. Turn slightly to the right, angle the right edge of the deck down, and jog a packet of 8 or 9 cards about 3/4 inch to the right. As your spectator is calling out a number (providing a bit of misdirection), just *roll this packet to the bottom of the deck, faces up*. Hold the deck from the bottom with your left hand, palm up, to hide the upside-down cards on the bottom. With a little practice, you will learn to make this pass *virtually undetectable*.

#### You're almost done!

Start counting toward the selected number, placing the cards *face down* in a separate pile. Hold the deck in the *palm* of your left hand, counting cards off the top. *Five cards before the selected number,* say to the first spectator, *'I know what you're thinking. Maybe we've already passed your card. What was the card you selected?''* 


As first spectator answers, turn the pile of counted cards face up with your right hand, and start spreading them out (more misdirection). Casually set down the deck in your left hand, *turning it over as you do,* and use both hands to spread out the already counted cards.

**The trick is now basically over;** you have 5 cards left to count, and the selected card is now 5<sup>th</sup> from the top!

Use your right hand to put the deck back in your left, *keeping it square*, with the front tilted slightly down, so you don't flash the cards on the bottom. Resume your count, this time dropping the cards *face -up*.

The chosen card appears at the designated number. *TA-DA! You have just performed the "Holy Grail" of card magic!*

## WHAT'S NEW?

#### Magic Video Streaming Project:

The Magic Video Streaming project is one where we will have all the magic videos we legally own available to members for streaming via a PLEX media server. At last count, we had over 1,200 instructional and



performance magic videos that will be available for viewing on the server.

<u>Current Project Status</u>: We currently have a prototype server running on a Dell Optiplex 7010 desktop. It is running *Windows 10 Home* that needs to be updated to *Window 10 Pro* for remote access capability. We have PLEX Media Server loaded (paid version) on it. It is capable of doing 1-2 video streams concurrently. Our goal is to be able to do at least 5 concurrent video streams of 1080p video.

As many of you know, I started a fund raiser for money to buy either a new server or a used server or parts to build our own server. From that effort, we raised \$825. The hardware to build our new server has been ordered and I will start building it as soon as everything arrives.

I do not have enough money left to buy a Windows 10 Pro license. That will cost about \$200 so if you can afford to, please reach deep into your pockets so we could get this project running, it would benefit you, the club, and be appreciated by all.

I have ordered and received all the parts to build the new server except the processor. That is due in May 10th-18<sup>th</sup>. When it gets here, we will start the build.
