### Garrett Thomas

One of the Ring 76 meetings I especially look forward to each year is the installation banquet in July. It's a time for being with magician friends, their families and enjoying terrific food, followed by celebrating those deserving members who have served the club as officers or won awards. For 2020, we'll still be with friends, in a virtual sort of way, and unfortunately, calling our July meeting an installation banquet is a misnomer. Yep, this will be another Zoom meeting, so any food you'll be eating will be up to you. But it will be fun — especially given our special guest entertainer.

There is a silver lining to being locked down due to the coronavirus and that is the ubiquitous nature of online meetings. This allows us to easily meet up with others around the country or around the

He may also tell some stories about performing strolling magic with David Blaine, Dani DaOrtiz and Christian Engblom at the Gaslamp Quarter the nights of Magic-Con.




discussing with possible entertainers; TBD. We are in need of a newsletter editor; contact **James Thayer.**



<u>Future of Ring 76:</u> There was concern about how to keep members interested and invested in the Ring.


The board meeting adjourned at 8:09 pm.

### Trick of the Month Club

Professor's Nightmare



This was supposed to be the June *Trick of the Month*, but I forgot to send it in! That may be just as well, as its absence from the June newsletter may produce more clarity than the blurb at the end of this article.

But meanwhile, *Professor's Nightmare* is perhaps the best-known rope trick in magic. Most magicians have performed it at one time or another, either by itself, or as part of a longer rope routine.

The trick is done with *three ropes* – one short, one medium length, and one long. The magician appears to magically make all three the *same length*. To couple *Professor's Nightmare* with other rope tricks, you might start with a *Cut-and-Restored Rope*, and end up "restoring" the three pieces into "one long, continuous rope." But we will limit this discussion to making 3 different-size ropes appear equal in length.

### Preparing the Ropes

Use a fabric rope (not plastic) that easily folds 180 degrees – the open space inside the fold (if any) should be *smaller than the rope's diameter*. Most 3/8" inch fabric ropes will work, whether "cored" (typical magicians' rope), or not.

The short rope is usually about 8-12 inches long, and the long rope can be *any length*. (My "long rope" is about 4 feet.) Link the long and short


ropes together *at their midpoints*. Your "mediumlength" rope will be the *same length* as the long and short ropes linked in this manner. Alternatively, you can use the formula,  $Medium = \frac{1}{2}(Long + Short)$ .

#### The "Business"

Once you have your three ropes, show them to the audience, stressing their unequal lengths. With the ropes in your right hand, hold your left hand open, palm facing you, fingers level, and thumb pointing up.

Lay the short rope in the crotch of your left thumb and index finger, with the rope hanging down across your open palm. Position the rope so the midpoint is about *1/4* inch above the midpoint of your palm. Next, lay the middle-sized rope in the left hand immediately to the right of the short rope; square the top end with the top of the short rope and let the rest of the middle-sized rope hang down. Finally, position the long rope immediately to the right of the middle-sized rope, square the top with the other ropes, and let the rest hang down.

Now bend the bottom of the short rope on top of the other two, bringing the bottom end up immediately to the right of the longest rope; square the bottom of the short rope with the tops of the other three. Do the same with the middle-size rope – bring the bottom up to the right of the short-rope bottom and square the bottom-end with the other rope-ends. Do the same with the long rope – bring the bottom up to the right of the now 5 rope-ends





(all pointing up), and square-off the end. You now have all six rope ends pointing up.


Slip a couple fingers of your right hand behind (audience side) the two rope-ends furthest to the right. Moving these fingers left, go in front (your side) of the third rope-end, and behind the fourth.

You now have your right-hand fingers around three rope ends, and the other three ends sticking up behind these fingers. Pull the three ends in your right-hand fingers a. couple inches toward you, and use your left thumb to secure the other three ends. Now pull the ends in your right hand to the right, and close your left hand to conceal the link between the short and long ropes.

The trick is now complete. You appear to be holding three ropes of equal length! This is the "magic moment"!

In reality, only one rope of the apparent length – the middle-sized rope. Your left hand actually holds both ends of the short rope, and your right hand both ends of the long one – these ropes are linked together at their midpoints, with the "link" concealed in your left fist.

Additional moves are merely to show (pretend) that the three ropes are now of equal length. You



might drop the ends held in your right hand one at a time, saying "One, Two, Three ropes - all the same length."

An additional move is to with take the middle-sized rope from your left hand with your right, saying "One." Pretend to take a second rope from your left hand, but actually replace the middle-sized rope in your left hand and, with one smooth motion, withdraw both the long and short ropes, concealing the link in your right hand, and say "Two." Finally, show the middle-sized rope – holding it with the only the left thumb and index finger - and drop it into your right hand, saying "Three." (There are other moves you can make, but these two make the point.)

You've now performed **Professor's Nightmare.** To finish, you might wad-up the three ropes and drop them on your table, change then back to their original lengths, or continue with a longer rope routine.

In all magic, it's not so much the **trick**, as the **presentation**. The mechanics of Professor's Nightmare are pretty simple, but it's your story-line that can make or break the routine. There are many excellent presentations, such as **Joe Mystic's** Rope Family. You can copy a good presentation, but it's better to develop your own! It's **presentation** that makes magic an art, instead of a science.

### **OBJECTIVES OF THE LIBRARY**

The library's primary objective is to support the art of magic by providing the best reference library in the entire IBM organization for members to learn from. It is here for you so please use it!

We will make it the best by:

- ▲ Increasing quantity and quality of materials available to members through donations and acquisitions.
- ▲ Implementing easier methods to check materials out.
- ▲ Improving communications to members about library issues.
- ▲ Implementing record-keeping and other methods to minimize loss.

This is no different than donating a VHS or DVD except the media isn't physical, it is digital.

#### **WHAT'S NEW?**

#### Magic Video Streaming Project:

The Magic Video Streaming project is one where we will have all the magic videos we legally own available to members for streaming via a PLEX media server.



At last count, we had over 1,200 instructional and performance magic videos that will be available for viewing on the server.

Current Project Status: We have now received all the parts need to build the PLEX server. David Chiu has donated a used flat screen monitor and the building process is under way. In the meantime, Robert Vinson and Mike Stilwell both donated \$50 to the project. Now we are only \$8.58 overdrawn in library petty cash. I can't wait to do a 50/50 raffle and do some library sales at the next physical meeting, when ever that will be to get some money back in our library petty cash fund.

We do have PLEX up and running on the prototype server that is capable of a couple of concurrent video streams. If you would like to try it out, send me an email (gdis46@gmail.com) with your email address requesting access. I will send you a PLEX invitation, which you will need to accept, in order to gain access. Since this prototype server has limited bandwidth we may have to limit the users during this test phase so first come, first served. One requirement: I need you to tell if you see or experience any problems. That way we can solve them before the real server goes into online.

If need be, you can keep the book or video again if nobody else has requested it but you must sign for it again.
