
President's Message

April Meeting

Secretary **Matthew King**. Meetings held every 2nd Monday, currently via Zoom.

This was our thirteenth ring meeting held on Zoom. President **Richard Ustick** called the meeting to order at **7:06 p.m.** There were **22 members** online. He announced dues are coming up and can now be sent to Payments@Ring76.com. If interested in joining the board, please email president **Ustick**. We are open to suggestions to for a new meeting place. **Robert Vinson** mentioned being on the board brings a sense of pride, and it is a great experience.

Matthew King discussed the auction rules for the meeting, and he introduced the first auction item, a Milk Vanishing Pitcher by Viking Mfg. Co. The highest bidder was member **Mark Booth.**

Greg Wauson introduced member Gary Dismukes who gave a book review on "Artful Deceptions – The Impromptu Card Magic of Alan Kronzek. It is 100 pages and some of the effects use sleights while others are self-working. The focus is on spectator interaction and a theatrical experience. Gary mentioned there is a routine based on Gemini Twins, Larry Jennings' "The Visitor", and a Dai Vernon effect he really enjoyed.

Greg Wauson congratulated **Mark Booth** for winning the monthly newsletter challenge. **Greg** announced we have 8 presenters for our Teach-a-Trick meeting.

Gary Dismukes performed an effect with 4 different colored dice. He had Greg Wauson select which number to place face-up on each of them. Whatever numbers were selected, Gary placed that number of cards under each die. For the reveal, Gary showed the cards and the numbers selected ended up revealing a 4 of a kind. He indicated he learned it from Nick Brown, and that Nick Trost had a

version based on **Jerry Sadowitz**. He explained the method to members.

Next was **Mike Stilwell**. He showed a variation of an ending to "Crazy Man's Handcuffs", which created the illusion of two intertwined rubber bands, where one was then made to visibly vanish, and reappear on his wrist.


Matthew King introduced the next auction item, which was "Exact Change" by Gregory Wilson. The winning bid was member Gary Dismukes.

Joe "Mystic" McGrievy was next to Teach-a-Trick. He remembered seeing member Bob Meigs perform something similar. He shared a video performance of an effect with a napkin that magically animates, interacts with you, and moves around like it's trying to get away from you. **Joe** demonstrated how to construct an easy gimmick to create more of an animation.

Next up was **Elissa Melor**. She used 9 cards and asked everyone to play along at home. She made 3 piles of 3 cards each, picked up two of the piles and stacked them up, but then had the audience remember the bottom card of the 3rd pile. Then she spelled out the card face down using 1 card at a time, then spelled the suit, then spelled magic, and **Elissa** ended up with the selected card. She explained it was a **Iim Steinmeyer** effect called "Mind Card Speller".

Matthew King introduced the final auction item, "The Diamond Silk Fountain" by Jay Scott Berry. Member Miguel Garcia won the auction item.

The next performer was **Bob Meigs**. He liked calling his presentation "Elementary", performing in the guise of Sherlock Holmes. He cut a deck in half, mixed the two packs part face-up and part face-down, and then put the packs together. He showed 4 predictions. The first said "You will have

23 cards face-up", and the spectator counts and confirms. The second prediction indicated "11 of the face-up cards will be black", the third prediction said "All of the black cards are Clubs", and they were, except 1. The last prediction named the 1 odd card. Then **Bob** explained it to members. Someone mentioned it may be called "Shuffle Bored" by **Simon Aronson**, or possibly "Predictability", and another member mentioned he remembered it as "The Trick that Can't Be Explained", and another remembered it as "Little Bunny Trick".

Robert Vinson. Explained a book test called "The Easy Book Test" based on the 1089 method. The performer has multiple books, a spectator selects one, they end up on a page number and memorize the 9th word. The performer can reveal what word they have in mind. Greg Wauson thanked Robert Vinson for his contributions to Ring 76 and told him we will miss him. Robert indicated he would like to remain a member.

Greg Wauson recommended members check out an article in the February issue of **The Linking Ring** called "Magic Mentors" by **David Ginn**.

The next magic presenter was **Miguel Garcia**. He thanked the club members for their friendship, and said he enjoys being a part of the club. He taught an effect he showed to **Josh Sherwin** and the late **Jeff Marcus** at Denny's after our meetings some time back called "Estimation Aces". He demonstrated being able to cut to each of the aces from a shuffled

deck, and then explained how to set up the deck and perform it.

The last performer, **Matthew King**, taught one called "Card Divination" from the book "How to be (a fake) Kreskin". You have a spectator shuffle and cut any deck of cards, and you're able to divine the top two cards. **Matthew** explained how the effect can surprise people, as he surprised members by stepping away from his table to reveal he was in a suit from the waist up, and in shorts and flipflops from the waist down.

Rick Bruce mentioned that former Ring 76 member Mike Feldman was on Penn & Teller. Members briefly discussed the history of Doug Henning and "The Magic Show" on Broadway.

Greg Wauson asked if members would like to sign up for the stand-up contest, and absent enough sign-ups we would discuss a themed performance night in lieu of the contest.

President **Richard Ustick** adjourned the meeting at 9:01 p.m.

The meeting was held via Zoom and it was called to order at 7:07 pm. by President Richard Ustick. Also in attendance were First V.P. (Entertainment) Greg Wauson, Second V.P. (membership) James Thayer, Treasurer Joe "Mystic" McGrievy, Sergeant-at-arms Dave Chiu, Secretary Matthew King, Member-at-large Mike Stilwell, and Member-at-large and Ring 76 Librarian Gary Salisbury. The March board meeting minutes were approved.



REPORTS

Treasurer Report, Joe "Mystic"

McGrievy: Joe shared his list of expenses and our current financial status. We paid 1 and 1 web hosting two times this month, and reimbursed Gary Salisbury for his purchases for the library storage supplies. We also purchased an Amazon Gift Card for the newsletter challenge winner. Our current balance on hand is \$2,631.29 and Joe shared his screen showing the bank account reflected the same.

Second VP (Membership), James

Thayer: James indicated we are ending the 2020-2021 year with 53 members. We had 57 members at the beginning of the year, but 4 members passed on this year. Dues are starting to come in, and we received 5 renewals via PayPal and 3 payments via mailed checks. James revisited the idea of a new hosting plan, and the most complicated part would be transferring the emails to the new host. It could reduce the monthly cost from approximately \$15 to \$5 or \$6 per month.

Sergeant-at-Arms Report, David

<u>Chiu</u>: David indicated we had 25 members and 3 guests at the April meeting, and we discussed having guests at the meetings and drawing more attention to Ring 76.

Library Report and Discussion, Gary

Salisbury: Gary indicated he helped a member who had difficulty getting on the Plex Server, and he took that knowledge to create a "Dummy's" guide to getting on our media server. The Ring 76 online media server is now available to, both, Ring 76 Members and non-resident Ring 76 members. David Chiu has finished working on a script for a "how-to"



video regarding using the Plex Server and sent it to **Gary** during the meeting. **Gary** asked if his "Dummy's" guide could help with it, too. **David** mentioned there are a few members now starting to access the online media more frequently.

First VP (Entertainment), Greg

<u>Wauson</u>: **Greg** recapped the last meeting. We had 8 performers and he was glad to see member **Bob Meigs** join and participate in our "Teach-a-Trick" meeting.

OLD BUSINESS

Richard Ustick brought up the April meeting and auctions. Matthew King discussed the auctions, which produced a total of \$131 during the meeting. He also showed updated video overlays, and the progress on a new flyer for the newsletter. We briefly discussed the possibility of using Zoom in the future for meetings, non-resident members, or lectures.

Richard Ustick mentioned Bob Meigs has offered his house to host the installation banquet, as asked for opinions. It was decided to leave it up to the members to make their own choice, and possibly set up a Zoom link to broadcast it simultaneously. Members briefly discussed vaccines, wearing masks, and erring on the side of caution. Mark Booth mentioned his doctor told him hospitalizations were at their lowest point since April of last year.

Richard Ustick inquired as to starting live meetings in August and finding a location. Mike Stilwell mentioned using the Elks Club in El Cajon by having Joe "Mystic" McGrievy sign up for a membership at \$250 for the year, and we may be able to save rent funds. We could have access to the outdoor stage, indoor stage, etc. A vote was taken for Joe to gather initial information about it. Greg Wauson asked about the status of the senior community center. Mike Stilwell indicated he called and was informed they must follow the Governor's guidelines for senior centers. Mark Booth pulled up the El Cajon Elks Lodge website and shared photos of it. Gary Salisbury

mentioned the San Carlos Elks Lodge, and **Joe** said he will check both. **Richard Ustick** indicated it may be good to also see if there's an option more centrally located. **Greg** mentioned to also make sure there will be no scheduling issues with securing our meeting dates in advance.

Richard Ustick emailed I.B.M. International about who's going to install Ring 76, as we lost our Territorial Vice President this year. Richard also mentioned he is still storing the Universal Monster cutouts. Mike Stilwell mentioned advertising them in the newsletter. Gary Salisbury mentioned he can store them at his house, if necessary. Matthew King offered to photograph them for sale. Richard asked Greg Wauson to connect with Bob Meigs to find out if the Haunted Hotel might be interested or what we might expect to receive for them.

Richard Ustick asked if there is any new business.

David Chiu mentioned we might want to tell the members to pay via "friends and family" when using PayPal so we can save on fees. Greg Wauson mentioned the votes for the May meeting will count towards the Performer of the Year award, and there were only 3 sign-ups for the Stand-up Competition.

Greg also mentioned we will have a special surprise guest magician joining us at the May meeting, and he also talked briefly with Gregory Wilson about returning with some new material for our members in the future.

Meeting Adjourned at 8:28 p.m.
