General Membership Meeting Monday June 14, 2021

Secretary **Matthew King**. Meetings held every 2nd Monday, currently via Zoom.

This was our fifteenth ring meeting held on Zoom. President **Richard Ustick** called the meeting to order at 7:07 p.m. There were 26 members online.

Richard mentioned this will hopefully our last Zoom meeting. The July meeting will be our first live meeting in a year and a half, and it will be our installation banquet. **Richard** shared the slate of candidates with members, and he asked for members to vote yay or nay for the slate. Members voted, and the slate was confirmed.

Richard reminded members to pay their dues, which can be sent via check or by PayPal. **James Thayer** mentioned checks can be sent and his address, which is found is in the newsletter. **Richard** mentioned that we need to find a newsletter editor and asked any members to reach out if interested.

Richard announced the installation banquet will be held on July 11th, and **Bob Meigs** has generously offered his home to hold the event. Members will receive an RSVP email with more information, and it will be important to RSVP for an accurate head count.

Richard reminded members to send in their vote for Ring 76 "Member of the Year", keeping any member in mind who has contributed the most to Ring 76 and the magic community over the last year. Greg Wauson indicated he will be sending an email to members regarding voting. Richard indicated that membership has been solid for the last 2 years, and the board has worked hard to provide quality magic and lectures to our members. Richard thanked Matthew King for his work on cataloging and presenting the various magic donations and coordinating the in-meeting auctions. Matthew thanked Richard and told

members about the auctions, items listed on the magic store website, as well as how to navigate the categories.

Greg introduced two-time Penn & Teller "Fooler" magician **Shawn Farquhar**, who was voted the "Canadian Magician of the Year" twice, a World Champion first place winner at FISM, past IBM International President, and has received many other awards in magic.

Shawn Farquhar reminded members to get tickets for the upcoming Virtual IBM Convention on July 8th, 9th, and 10th, which includes virtual magic shows, lectures, and more. Shawn provided an exceptional lecture to our members, demonstrating effects from his second lecture called "PB&I" (his first lecture was titled "Bread and Butter"). Effects included his C2W Card to Wallet, his award-winning MatriXpress routine, Torn 2 Pieces, a playing card melted through another, he screwed together a deck of cards, magically divined a whole deck, and showed MANY more! He discussed his multiple television appearances on Penn & Teller: Fool Us, and he provided members with valuable information and tips (while he also kept our members laughing). He recommended members check out the Ask Alexander section of the IBM website, and he also recommended a subscription to Reel Magic, both of which have a plethora of magic material. Shawn finished with a generous Q&A session, and we continued chatting well after the meeting was adjourned.

Our installation banquet magician, John George!

John George got his initial interest in magic from his father, who would perform tricks for the family every year around Christmas. At Disneyland, he met Dana Daniels, who was performing strolling magic. In 1995, John George met Johnny Ace Palmer, who would become his lifelong friend and mentor, and he began his magic career that same year. After graduating from college, he worked for Carl Williams at Custom Magic, a designer of illusions for top magicians, including Lance Burton and David Copperfield. He continues to build props for his own use.

He has performed regularly at the Magic Castle throughout his career and is a resident entertainer at Warren and Annabelle's in Maui. He has performed at the private parties of many celebrities, including

Nicolas Cage, Francis Ford Coppola, Drew Barrymore and Paul McCartney, and at the red carpet premiers of The Prestige, Maleficent and WALL-E.

John George has competed and won awards in a range of magic competitions, including:

- First Place 1998 International Brotherhood of Magicians Gold Cups Competition
- People's Choice 1998 International Brotherhood of Magicians Gold Cups Competition
- First Place Society of American Magicians Gold Medal Competition
- Silver Medal Award of Merit Society of American Magicians
- First Place Florida State Championship for Close-Up Magic

John George became a speedcubing enthusiast after watching Will Smith solve a Rubik's Cube in the film The Pursuit of Happyness. He has participated in World Cube Association competitions with the Rubik's Cube and Pocket Cube. His personal records in



competition are 26.75 seconds with the Rubik's Cube and 12.41 seconds with the Pocket Cube.

John George resides in Southern California with his wife, Devon. Especially intriguing is the fact he constructed an 18-seat theater for magical performances in his home. The theater is accessed by a hidden entrance and features a castle design motif.

This promises to be a fascinating performance by a man of many interests.

Shawn Farquhar lecture a big success!

We were looking forward to the Shawn Farquhar lecture and he did not disappoint the 30 people who attended this event. To my knowledge, he is the only winner of the Federation Internationale des Societes Magiques (FISM) world champion competition to ever attend a Ring 76 meeting, and this professionalism showed. He called this his PB&J lecture, Powerful But Justified, so-named by his daughter. He kept us going and on our toes for well over two hours.

Several of the items he presented were his improvements on existing effects. He explained each one immediately after performing it.



- 1. He demonstrated problem solving when inventing magic tricks, trying to figure out how to change a playing card into clear laser-cut plastic.
- 2. Poker chip version of 3 Fly
- a. Attributed Chris Kenner from book Totally Out of Control.



- b. Instead of silver dollars or half dollars, he uses poker chips, which can be used anywhere in the world and they make no noise when sliding next to each other.
- 3. "Bypass" This is a real fooler with two cards. One is folded diagonally and the other card fairly and slowly melts through the diagonal fold and comes out the other side. Both cards are then fairly shown, with no clue to how it works. Shawn invented this during the COVID lockdown, which was especially harsh in Canada, where Shawn lives. He showed us how it works and said we can find more details on Reel Magic Magazine, from Kozmo, for just \$5 per month.
- 4. Shawn showed us his take on Paul Harris' Screwed Deck, which is sold by Palmer Tilden. Shawn bought his entire company, Palmer Magic, from him.
- 5. A mentalism effect was next TOXIC, which is performed with an iPhone. It allows the magician to predict a total after several mathematical operations on the calculator of a spectator's cell phone. Shawn showed us TOXICO, his version, which has some nice improvements. This is a sneaky effect which is fun to

do since it utilizes a little-known feature of the calculator function on a smart phone.

- 6. Shawn showed a piece of paper, folded it into an envelope, then pulled gift cards out of it. It does not look possible, but it is and has been published in Linking Ring magazine.
- 7. Wallet This card in wallet effect is very effective and uses moves from the folded paper trick. The aardvark is a medium-sized, burrowing, nocturnal mammal native to Africa.
- 8. The pseudo-memorized deck trick uses a mini stack of six cards. He recommended we create and print a tiny cheat sheet and tape it over the bar code on



a deck of cards so we can easily refer to it secretly during the performance.

- 9. Invisible stack Shawn had a volunteer tell him where to stop when spreading cards and which order to re-stack the cards. It's based on the "Invisible" deck, using a similar pairing of cards.
- 10. Next up was a nice packet trick with multiple kings and queens, called The Jealous King. This originally came from the mind of legendary Japanese magician, Ton Onosaka, who introduced the magic of Japan to America.



- 11. He then performed an effect in which four jacks and four 9s change places. It utilizes a utility move called the 13 x 13 Switch, which deceptively switches two packets of cards.
- 12. He closed with his signature piece, Torn 2 Pieces. Calling it a torn and restored photo effect somehow does not do it justice. This visually-stunning piece is a real fooler, uses only natural moves, and leaves the spectator with a mis-made souvenir which does not look possible. He has performed it many times on TV, including on the Ellen DeGeneres Show. He decided to market it to magicians and has sold more than 40,000 worldwide.

Shawn was happy to field any of our questions. He was asked about the spread pass, so he dived into its





detailed handling. This is a clean-looking version of the pass which provides good visual cover. And when asked about his three appearances on Penn and Teller's "Fool Us" TV show, he delighted us with some wonderful stories.

We magic buffs have more capabilities to learn about magic than ever before. Not only can we attend magic club meetings like this Zoom lecture, with Shawn in Canada, he reminded us as IBM members we have access to Ask Alexander on the IBM's website, magician.org. After logging in, we can click "Ask Alexander," to select from a giant database of all things magic. And he shared that his IBM ring in Canada makes available to its members an online streaming service of magic material using the Amazon Web Service (AWS). This is similar to the Plex streaming service available to Ring 76 members, although our library has substantially more content. One Ring 76er also mentioned members of the Academy of Magical Arts have free online access to Genii Magazine.

And we are blessed to be part of a relatively small, but world-wide, community. As a kid growing up in Canada, Shawn had many friends who, like him, also became well-known magicians: Kevin James, Mac King and Greg Frewin. Mike Stilwell shared he was Bumper, the baffling bunny, at the PCAM convention on the Queen Mary many, many years ago. Shawn said he remembers seeing Bumper there and still has some of Mike's promotional material! It is a small world.
