



## September Meeting was Math Magical

President **Mike Stilwell** called the meeting to order at 6:59 pm. He introduced guests and asked for any announcements. Mike then conducted the



Broken Wand ceremony for the late **Brad Burt** (see pictures next page). His wife **Barbara Burt** and brother were in attendance. Mike asked for a moment of silence for Brad and his loved ones and

then Gary Salisbury delivered the broken wand to Brads wife. Mike told the first story abut Brad then asked if anyone had other stories to share. Terry Godfrey spoke about being stationed in San Diego and Brad was one of the first magicians he met. He mentioned he was low on money at one point, and Brad asked to buy a set of his Fox Cups. When Terry was back on his feet and Brad sold the cups back to Terry for the exact same price. Greg Wauson spoke of being a Long Beach Mystic with Brad in the 70's, and mentioned he was one of their top performers. Armando Gutierrez was performing the milk pitcher routine and said he needed a wand. Brad, from backstage, yelled "I have one", and was messing with the stage curtain to bring one out and which served as the goofy misdirection needed for Armando to finish his routine. Terry Lunceford said he knew Brad for a long time and Brad was the best man at his wedding. Brad sold Terry his first professional magic tricks. Terry spoke of Brad's many professional videos, and Terry mentioned he had a letter from Stan Allen to read. He read the letter from Stan about


magic in the 70's. Stan said that The Magic Castle started waving any students of Brad's through the audition process, and Brad had called the Castle to ask them to make his students work for it. **Michael Johnson** told a story to members about spending time in his magic shop. Michael had put together and provided members with a tribute book about Brad's life and read a portion of it to members. Brad created one of the first magic bulletins on the internet, and he became famous without TV and internet. A beautiful ceremony for another member of the magic fraternity we have lost too soon.

After a short break, Ring Secretary **Matthew King** introduced a show-and-tell item, which was Harry Houdini's Mutilated Parasol, purchased from the summer Potter & Potter auction. He spoke briefly about it and left it on display for members view. Mike then introduced **Gary Salisbury** to announce the door prize winners. **Richard Ustick** won "ESP Bingo" by magic Mike Stilwell, and **Miguel Garcia** won a porcelain rabbit out of a hat.

Mike turned the meeting over to VP of Entertainment, **Greg Wauson**, who introduced

Gary Dismukes to talk about the Hooker Card Rise. Gary took the stage and spoke about the famous and best card rise. He spoke about Dr. Hooker, the history of the creator, and the lecture he was lucky enough to attend. He described the effect and lecture in great detail. An interesting look at a historical bit of magic.

After Gary's presentation Greg Wauson moved



on to the performance part of the evening. The theme was *Math Magic* and first up was **Mark Booth** who gave out envelopes to each member which had cards with ad members

words and phrases on them. He had members

choose any word, and then spell the word by moving one card per letter to the bottom of the stack. At the end of the routine, all members had the same word remaining in their hands.

**Matthew King** performed a Rubik's Cube routine with 24 cubes, utilizing the assistance

of Greg Wauson, Vic Terrific, Dale Law, Laurie Pearson, and guest Roslyn Cole. He had members calculate numbers and reveal their solutions, then gave them their respective cubes to mix up. After all cubes were mixed and placed back in places the members chose, he turned around the stacked cubes and they spelled "IBM Ring 76" on the reverse side.

Next was **Rich Robertson**. Rich had some members use their phone calculators, and his wife Cynthia handed out calculators to use. He had members multiply numbers and he was able to determine the solution before they could be done electronically. He had Miguel name a 3-



digit number, which was 121, and said he would multiply it by a number within 25 seconds of a stopwatch. He had guest Alvin Revilas name any number between 200 and 20,000, then Rich multiplied the numbers with great speed and finished well before the time was up.

Greg then took a break from the performers to do some magic of his own He had **Sleeveless** assist him. Greg introduced a Mr. Potato Head toy and various pieces. Greg selected two of the pieces and asked Sleeveless to discard one. He had Sleeveless select 2 pieces, and Greg discarded one. They continued until only the mustache piece remained. Sleeveless opened the Mr. Potato head toy, removed a prediction, and revealed it contained a picture of the mustache piece. Greg indicated it was

from The Linking Ring and explained it to members.

Next up was **Dale Law**. Dale said he needed a little help, and showed a box that said "A Little Help" on it. He placed on glasses, a little hat, and asked Greg to select someone. Greg selected **Tom Owen-Towle**, who rolled a dice and Dale wrote it down. Tom

selected **Michael Johnson** to help next who also rolled a dice and Dale wrote it down. Then Michael selected **Terry Lunceford** to help rolled a die.

All of the numbers totaled 42. Dale flipped the page and there was a magic square where all numbers added up to 42 each way they were added.

Greg did some magic trivia questions for

members, then introduced Vic Terrific. Vic borrowed a \$5 dollar bill from Dale Law. He gave Alvin 3 dice. He asked Miguel to use his phone to help add numbers. Mike told Miguel his zip code. Then Miguel went to Terry



Lunceford and Vic asked him to tell Miguel the day and year he was born. He had Alvin roll the dice to form a 3-digit number, and had Miguel add the white one first, the black die second, and the red die 3rd, and asked Miguel to announce the long number. Next he had Terry divide out numbers, and it revealed Terry's age and indicated it was 3 months past his birthday. Vic knew the number Alvin had rolled. He had Alvin pull up maps and put in Mike's zip code. The larger total from Miguel matched the serial number on the borrowed \$5 bill.

Greg announced the last performer, **Terry Godfrey** who asked Sleeveless help. Terry had him count 10 cards into his hand, then had **Tom Owen-Towle** think of any one and then had Sleeveless count more. Terry wrapped the cards into a handkerchief, had Greg imagine a card, and then invisibly threw the card to Sleeveless, who placed it into the deck through the handkerchief. He counted out 8 more cards for Tom, and then had Tom throw it into the deck like a football player. Then they were counted and there were only 7 cards. He asked Tom to name his card which was missing. Then Sleeveless opened the handkerchief and Tom's card had appeared in the handkerchief.

Mike called up the performers to take a photo and

asked for members to vote for the Performer of the Month. Gary drew the winner of the 50/50 raffle, and Mike won. Members voted and Mark agreed to manage the banquet.



#### WHAT'S NEW AT THE LIBRARY?

#### IBM Ring 76 Magic Media Server:

The <u>IBM Ring 76 Magic Media Server</u> project is one where we will have all the magic videos we legally own available to members for streaming via a PLEX media server.

The <u>IBM Ring 76 Magic Media Server</u> is up and running so if you would like to try it out, send an email to:(librarian@ring76.com) with your real email address (not your ring email address) requesting access. I will send you a PLEX invitation, which you will need to accept, in order to gain access. People who have tried it say. "It is nothing less than **FANTASTIC** and that alone is worth the yearly membership fee."

I finally got enough funds to purchase a legal copy of Windows 10 Pro for the server so we can have remote administration of the server.


#### **IBM Ring 76 Library Reconstruction:**

The Ring 76 Library is physically located at my home in Blossom Valley and you are welcome to stop by and browse as much as you desire.

It was stored on a heavy duty industrial shelving system in my 3 car garage.



Currently we have 16 feet of wall space but as donations grew, the available space became smaller and smaller so I came up with an idea. My garage is 2 cars wide and 2 deep on one side. I decided to convert the 3rd bay (shown in red) into a dedicated room for the library.



I have a lofty goal to make the new club's library look like the Magic Castle foyer complete with secret door. I don't know how close to that I can get but at this time, that is my goal, if I can get it past my wife.



Construction is underway but going slow because I am doing this all myself and am not known for Dr. A, a retired Canadian Mentalist (who wishes to existing cabinetry in this area and reinstalled it. The next task will to be to add the wall and new door and then we have to patch and paint the room. After that the new cabinetry gets installed and the library unpacked. We then have to do a complete inventory and get it published so you know what books and videos we have. Volunteers are always welcome to assist.

#### **Soliciting Library Donations:**

Over the past months I have been soliciting donations of books and videos from different magic groups on Facebook and have received a lot of material; books, video, and props. All the props went to the IBM Ring 76 Magic Store to raise funds for the general fund. All the videos will be digitized and made available for streaming from our IBM Ring 76 Magic Media Server. All the books will be put into our library. Any duplicates will be sold to members at ring meetings.

If you have any magic DVDs or VHS tapes, why not consider donating them to the library? They will be digitized and put on the IBM Ring 76 Magic Media Server so they would always be available to you any time plus be sharable to other club members. Sharing is good!

## **DONATIONS WANTED**

We need more books and videos to build the library. Those have to come from donations because there are no funds earmarked for library acquisitions in the ring budget. I would like to raise about \$500 for new book and video purchases for the library at the upcoming Magic Live! convention next spring.

<u>Think about this:</u> If you have purchased a downloaded video lecture (such as Penguin lectures) and no longer need it, I have a suggestion. Donate it to the library and we will put it on our PLEX server. That way you will always be able to view it any time along with the rest of the club. The club would then officially own the copy however, once it is transferred over to the library, you must delete all copies of it from your system. This is no different than donating a VHS or DVD except the media isn't physical, it is digital.


