

## Kids' Magic in March

Many magicians today got the magic bug by watching a magic show when they were kids. There are a lot of biographies of famous magicians who got interested in legerdemain by attending a performance of Harry Blackstone Sr., or some other magic great, as a child.

But it didn't have to be a famous magician, possibly just someone entertaining the students at their elementary school. Or maybe the magic hook was set for a youngster just watching Uncle Charlie make a silk scarf disappear after dinner. In any case, the sense of wonder that magic brings to children is what we'll be about at our meeting on Monday night, March 14.



Entertaining children with magic is a different animal than performing for adults. For one thing, kids are not shy when they think they see how Mr. Magic is accomplishing his miracle and will often yell out how they believe the trick is done. Enter the sucker trick to take advantage of that! At least one sucker trick will be done at the meeting. But even with the best sucker effect, the magician needs to be careful not to alienate the audience by embarrassing the little monster, er, loud and precocious kid. There are countless books and videos devoted to kids' magic. But in addition to knowing what to do, there's no substitute for performing before a live audience. You can get some stage time by performing a trick at our March meeting. And no pressure, but it's always especially welcome to hear from one of our members who seldom performs, saying he or she will take the stage. As of this writing, we have five entertainers scheduled, so there's still room for you! Send Greg Wauson, VP of Entertainment, an email at gw83@ring76.com, if you'd like to show us that cool kids trick you've been working on.

This will be a performance night; members will cast their votes for performer of the month. And those votes will also be included in the cumulative count towards our prestigious award for performer of the year, which will be revealed at the installation event in July. Feel free to bring kids to the meeting, since the magic will be geared to them. We were pleased to hear that an announcement was made to those who attend church at our venue, Church of the Immaculate Conception, that our theme on the 14<sup>th</sup> will be magic for kids, and they were encouraged to attend and bring along any youngsters. In the past, our kids' magic nights have had very few kids there; this might be an exception. Who knows – maybe a little boy or girl will show up at our meeting and become the next Lance Burton or Carissa Hendrix!

It's not too early to give some thought to throwing your hat into the ring for this fun event. Each contestant will have ten minutes to entertain the crowd with his or her amazing illusions and Ring 76 members will then vote for their favorite performance. Cash prizes will be awarded for first, second and third place: \$50, \$30 and \$20, respectively. Winners will be announced at the Installation Banquet in July.





## Shavings from the Board



The February Board meeting was held via Zoom and was called to order at February 28, 2022. The various officers presented their reports and each

was approved by a vote of the Board.

At our last meeting which featured our annual Closeup Contest, Sergeant-at-Arms David Chiu, indicated we had 20 members and 16 guests, which is an impressive number the Board agreed.

First VP (Entertainment), Greg Wauson: Greg indicated we had seven contestants in the close-up contest, and he was pleased to see different members performing. He has tabulated the votes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place, and we will find out the winners in July. Only a few people have signed up to perform for Kids'Magic in March.

Mark Booth brought up the idea of having mini lectures on teaching magic and basic techniques. The Board then discussed the difference of revealing vs. teaching. As we have a large number of "civilians" at our meetings, the Board discussed the possibility of using pre-meeting time for members to discuss effects.

Second VP (Membership), James Thayer: James reported 2 new members, Alvin and Misha. We are now at 55 members and Mike mentioned two other local magicians he is going to reach out to about joining.

Old business was then addressed including the awards. We discussed as the medals we traditionally use, and now gone. The idea of plaques for the performance contests or trophies was talked about as well as Challenge Coins. Richard will be looking into the cost and practicality of each.

Mark Booth mentioned he spoke with Bob Meigs about the Installation Banquet. At the present we will

be holding the banquet at Bob Meigs' home, as we did last year. What food we will be serving and the cost to the members were the topics. The Board decided to try to keep the cost at last year's level. Entertainment is also being looked at.

New Business was then discussed.

Mike and others discussed sound systems for the Kids' Magic meeting. Matthew mentioned he will be bringing his and everyone is welcome to use it. Mike asked whether the door prize tickets should only go to the adults, and the Board agreed. David suggested a kids door prize, and Joe suggested just giving all kids a magic trick at the meetings. The Board also decided to discontinue the newsletter challenge. Mike mentioned that he and Matthew were talking about donating time to the San Diego Humane Society at their next fundraiser. The Board decided it would be a good idea. Mike discussed a new part of the meeting where members introduce themselves. Greg reminded the Board that the theme for April is Tricks you don't use.

Meeting adjourned at 8:40 p.m.

## Trick of the Month Club

### The Trick That Fooled Einstein (Adapted for "Pi Day")

The Trick That Fooled Einstein is a prediction trick using coins. It can be performed for anyone, and/or be taught to kids over 12. The trick requires no math skills beyond counting money and simple addition. As the outcome is set in advance, setting it at \$3.14 works great

on "Pi Day."

#### Pi-Day

**Pi** is the mathematical number used in determining the perimeter or the area of a circle. The computation of Pi can be carried to a never-ending number of digits, but math classes usually abbreviate it as 3.14. Thus, schools often call March 14 (3/14) Pi-Day.

#### The Trick That Fooled Einstein

The required props are a change purse containing \$3.69 in small change (including at least 2 quarters, 3 dimes, 4 nickels, and 9 pennies), a glass bowl with about \$3

in small change; and a white-board with an erasable marker. You invite a spectator to come up and take a handful of coins from the glass bowl, and keep these coins in a *closed fist*, so no one knows the amount. You dump the contents of your coin purse (\$3.69) on a table (to be more visible to the audience, you might use a chair instead of a table).

Take the spectator's fist in your hand and pretend to weigh it. Write your first prediction (there will be 3) on your white-board and show this prediction to the audience. It is "1) I have as much as you . . . ". Repeat the weighing process, and write and show your second prediction - "2) . . . plus 55 cents . . . " Repeat with your final prediction, which is "3) . . . plus enough to make yours total \$3.14."

Have the spectator place her coins on the table, being careful to keep them separate from yours; count them, and announce the total. You then count an equal dollar amount from *your* pile, proving your first prediction. Now count from your remaining coins 55 cents, proving your second prediction. Count out your remaining coins - OMG - they total \$3.14! This proves your final prediction, and can be used as an introduction to Pi.

**You're done!** This is *The Trick That Fooled Einstein*. (Not really, but that's what it's called.)


#### **How Does It Work?**

Notice that you never told the audience how much change you **started** with. You start with your final prediction (\$3.14), **plus** the amount specified in Prediction #2. In our example, this is would be \$3.69 (\$3.14 + \$0.55).

If you start by matching the amount in the spectator's fist (*Prediction #1*), and then make this amount total \$3.14 (*Prediction #3*), you use \$3.14 – every time. *Prediction #2* only exists to make the trick a little less obvious. If you set aside another 55 cents, you have used all \$3.69, the amount you started with.

## Just a Friendly Reminder

Ring 76 does not run itself. All the events, lectures, banquets, potlucks, and performance nights are planned and executed by the Ring's Board of Directors which in turn is made up of members *like you*. Ring elections are held every June and any member in good standing can be on the Board of Directors. Fresh ideas need fresh Board members. This is where we talk about your library and do book & video reviews. Yes, your library! If you are a Ring 76 member in good standing, then this is your library! So keep in good standing by paying your dues on time.

#### **WHAT'S NEW AT THE LIBRARY?**

#### **Library Donations-----ON GOING**

<u>Tom Owen-Towle</u> donated several boxes of materials that I haven't gone through yet.

<u>Richard Ustick</u> gave me several boxes of Ring 76 archive material for storage. This probably should be digitized and stored on the web server.

#### IBM Ring 76 Media Server----ON GOING

As a point of reference to remind everyone, the current PLEX server is not the production server. It is a test system we are using to test the feasibility of a dedicated PLEX server. It is referred to as "Little Boy" and the production system is referred to as "Fat Man" (names from the Manhattan Project).

The "Little Boy" test server is being temporally housed at David's home while he helps get it organized. He is currently adding those 300 DVDs we got from Bill Michalek. He has already encoded 200 DVDs and has 100 left. I have yet to get David the new 120 DVD donations from Stan Sieler.

We also now have three new collections available for streaming:

Currently there are 1,498 excellent magic videos available for your viewing pleasure.

Also, I am also soliciting for more video donations through multiple sources. I am working on getting the Reel Magic Magazine collection into the library. I made an offer to purchase Jeff Marcus' collection so we will have to wait and see if the offer was accepted.



The "Fat Man" server is still on my workbench and I am using it to test its reliability. If you would like to volunteer to help, just let me know.



Note: Do you have a way to convert VHS tapes to MP4 files? We would love to borrow or accept a donation of a device to do that.

How about donating your DVDs to the library so everyone in the club can share them? You will still have access to them through the PLEX server – even on your smart phone!

#### IBM Ring 76 Magic Library----ON GOING

The new library construction project is progressing slowly while I try to find time for it. In the meantime, everything is in temporary storage in my garage and available for access.



I purchased 5 flip lid bins at Costco for storing library items.

There are 3 items currently on loan.

#### Funding-----ON GOING

50/50 Opportunity Drawing – We made \$41 from the 50/50 Opportunity Drawing at the February meeting.

Members may contact me 7x24 either by e-mail at <u>librarian@ring76.com</u> or by cell phone (voice or text) at 619-569-6035 to let me know what you would like to check out. (If you do not hear back from me within 24 hours, there may have been a technical problem so call me.) I will make sure the item(s) get to the next monthly meeting or you can pick it up at my home in Blossom Valley.

There is a limit of 4 items per month. You will need to sign the library card attached to the item along with your phone number. 
