March Meeting was fun for kids of all Ages

President “**Magic Mike**” Stilwell commenced the meeting at 7:01 pm. This month’s theme was Children’s Magic. “**Magic Mike**” asked some guests in attendance to introduce themselves. **Mark Booth** spoke about having a chili cookoff and invited members to join in, and he also thanked **Bob and Mary Meigs** for hosting the event at their home again. **Gary Salisbury** had **David Chiu**’s daughter draw the ticket for the opportunity drawing. The winner of the \$60 drawing was a lucky guest. **Magic Mike** turned the meeting over to First VP of Entertainment **Greg Wauson** who reminded members to vote for their favorite performance which counts towards the Entertainer of the Year.

“**Joe Mystic**” McGrievy was the first performer. He engaged the audience with the song “If You’re Happy And You Know It”. “**Joe Mystic**” turned a black cane into red,

then turned it into two silks, then the silks turned back into canes. He stuffed a red silk into his fist, and it came out white. He stuffed the white in and it came out blue. Then he stuffed the blue in, and it vanished. Then the red, white, and blue silks reappeared, and he placed them in a bag which then turned into an American flag. Then “**Joe Mystic**” showed a Rubik’s cube in a jar, he shook it and it turned into M&M’s. He asked for a volunteer and used guest Mila. He had her look inside a metal can. Then he continued to pull coins out of her ear, arm, chin and more until he had many. He had her count them and there were nine. Then he had her throw one and the audience heard it land in the can. Then **Joe Mystic** produced two Jumbo coins from her and, after pulling a sponge rabbit out of his hat, he placed it in a box and turned it into a live rabbit.

The next performer was **Mark Booth**. He showed a solid wood block, a wooden tube, and a small wooden cabinet. Then, he took the block and put it in the cabinet with the front visible through a small window in the cabinet. **Mark** indicated the block would vanish, as the audience saw it sliding back and forth. As a finale, the audience saw the block visibly vanish from within the

cabinet and reappear under the wooden tube. Then, **Mark** showed an effect with a magician and his assistant, “Mr. Mysto” and “Silly Sallie”, in a red and blue cabinet. He said they would magically change spots. He looked in the top and said they switched, and he’d make them switch back. Then he did it again to make them switch and showed them this time. Then he made them jump back by just turning them around. The audience asked **Mark** to turn them around, and when he did, there was a different picture on each that formed a rabbit.

Next was **Mago Ruly**. He started with a comedic wobbly stand and performed to music. He fixed the stand and magically produced a tabletop for it. **Mago** then asked one of the kids to assist him. He magically made a cape and matching hat for the assistant to wear which matched his vest. He then showed a “Book of Magic Spells” and laid a large yellow feather on it.

The feather magically rose into a vertical position, and then back down. Next, **Mago** showed an image of Mickey Mouse with the surrounding color in black and white. When he pulled the image out, it had changed into a colorful image.

Matthew King was up next. He had guest Colton assist. **Matthew** showed the audience a jumbo playing card, and then Colton stood on it, then selected a card from a jumbo deck, while the audience could see that all the cards were the same. Colton somehow selected an indifferent card and, after two magic wands broke apart and one kept popping the ends off, the cards ending up matching. Then he had another guest, Trevor, select a card, sign it, and shuffle it back in the deck.

Matthew brought out a 4 ft. balloon, placed the deck inside, and shook them up. After failing to find the card in the balloon he called attention to a windowed envelope attached to his table with a card inside it. The card was removed and shown to be the signed card. Next, he had multiple kids help with mixing Rubik's cubes and returned them to any place within a frame. He showed a numbered list of 12 video game characters and had a number called between 1-12. The selection was Mario, and he turned around the cubes showing they were mixed perfectly to match an image of Mario.

Next was **Vic Terrific**. He showed a woman's a purse, said he found it, and asked whose it was. Then he turned it inside out again and again, with it turning into a different bag each time. It finally turned it into a pot of gold for St. Patrick's Day.

Then **Vic** pulled out three ropes of different sizes and made them turn into three of the same size. Then he turned them into one single rope, then two ropes. He tied them into

a knot, slid his hand down the rope, and the knot vanished. **Vic** then drank from a shot glass, said it was "apple juice...fermented", and placed the glass in a brown bag. Then he suddenly crumpled up the bag, making the glass vanish. As he tossed the bag aside the audience heard it hit the stage with a loud thump.

Then **Vic** said "I want to show you this" and he held up a sign that said "THIS". Then he said it was "bigger than that" and showed a smaller sign which said "THAT". **Vic** had guest Summer select a card and return it to the deck. **Vic** tossed the cards into a bag, lowered a piece

of rope inside, and when he pulled it out her card was tied to the rope.

Next was "**Mr. Funtastic**". He showed a black silk and asked if everyone saw a bright colored silk. Then the black silk turned into a rainbow one. He then took metal rings and a chain and was able to tie them on as he dropped them down the length. Then **Mr. Funtastic** took a rope, made it stiff, then made it limp again. Next, he had a silver pitcher and said he would make a flower grow in it. He had the audience say magic words, "Have a Banana" and a flower grew. Then he said he had a mega straw for a mega gulp as he produced a 6 ft straw. Then **Mr. Funtastic** surprised the audience by producing a bowling ball out of an empty bag. Next, he tied a knot

in a rope and made it vanish. He showed a yellow and blue rope, tied a knot in the yellow rope, and made it jump to the blue rope. Then he pulled off the knot and put it back on. Finally, he untied the knot and showed the yellow knot had melted onto the blue rope.

The last performer was **Michael Johnson**. He performed to music and made two canes appear. Then he made a rope rigid, and limp again. He showed a wallet with money that vanished, reappeared in his hat, then he turned the money into Jumbo money. Next, **Michael** had a metal ring and made a ball vanish and reappear as he reached through the circle. Then, the ring turned into a square. Next, he poured water in his hat and when he turned it over the water vanished and a seemingly never-ending hat coil poured out. **Michael** showed a No. 2 magic wand (pencil), and he taught everyone three effects using pencils.

Shavings from the Board

The March board meeting was held via Zoom on March 28, 2022 and was called to order at 7:07 p.m. by First VP (Entertainment) **Greg Wauson** sitting in for President “**Magic Mike**” **Stilwell**. Also in attendance were Second VP (Membership) **James Thayer**, Treasurer “**Joe Mystic**” **McGrievy**, Sergeant at Arms **David Chiu**, Secretary **Matthew King**, Librarian and Member-at-large **Gary Salisbury**, Social Media Rep and Member-at-large **Mark Booth**, and Member-at-large **Richard Ustick**.



OLD BUSINESS

Richard showed a new possible replacement trophy or a replacement medallion. **Joe** indicated he liked the round medallion to keep it consistent with what we have been doing in the past. The Board discussed the prices and decided to order the medals. **Greg** mentioned the possible Superior Quality Ring Award and **Matthew** asked about getting more members to attend the meeting and checking on dues being paid. The board discussed submitting the application following the next charity event. The board discussed what constitutes being a *Life Member of Ring 76*. **Mark** discussed the Installation Banquet and indicated **Richard** had passed along a payment for our first RSVP. **Bob** and **Mark** exchanged some emails about some fun things to do during the banquet. **Matthew** shared a list of all donated items sold since he took on the project, which totaled \$2,211.50. **Matthew** discussed the store and sending some images to Paul Gross for input on value and purpose of some items.

NEW BUSINESS

Greg mentioned that the discussion about the April meeting was more of a show and tell and not a performance night. **Greg** took names of members that would be performing. **Richard** mentioned the nominations for the Board should be presented at the April meeting. He mentioned the stand-up contest would be in May, and the June meeting would be another performance night. **Greg** mentioned that “**Magic Mike**” will be donating his time at a Wheelchair Regatta fundraiser on June 5th. There are currently 3 magicians set to perform, **Magic Mike**, **Alvin**, and **Greg**. **Matthew** asked to be added to the list. “**Joe Mystic**” informed **Greg** that the magicians at the Prestige work Thurs-Sun and suggested they may be willing to do a lecture for us on a Monday, or on an off night. “**Joe Mystic**” mentioned Bob Sheets would be in town for a few weeks and he might be willing to lecture, and he would investigate it as an option.

Trick of the Month Club

The Trick That Fooled Einstein

(Pocket-Change Version)

This is the same trick as last month, but with a new look. It’s an “adult-show version” of *The Trick That Fooled Einstein* – as most adults carry *pocket change*, whereas kids often don’t. Instead of the spectator taking a handful of coins from a bowl, this trick is based on the amount of change in the *spectator’s pocket*. Although it’s the same trick, it takes on a *whole new look*.

Select a spectator who has some coins in their pocket (or purse). Have them hold this change in a closed fist, so you cannot know the amount. *But be sure your spectator does not have an “excessive” amount of change – say, not more than a couple dollar’s worth!* (This shouldn’t pose a problem, because most people don’t carry that much pocket change, and because more than a couple dollars’ worth won’t fit easily in a closed fist.)

Just as last month, you make three predictions:

- 1) *I have as much as you . . .*
- 2) *. . . plus (“x” amount) . . .*
- 3) *. . . plus enough to make **your** pocket change total (“y” amount).*

(*You* determine the amounts for “x” and “y;” vary them for repeat performances before the same audience.)

You have a *change purse*, containing an amount of change known *only to you* - but with certain parameters. **First**, your change is equal to the combined amounts stated in your **second** and **third** predictions ($x + y$). **Second**, your change must exceed the spectator’s by **at least** the amount of your second prediction. (If your change purse contains at least \$3.50, and you limit your second prediction to no more than 60 cents, *you should be safe*.) And **third**, to ensure that you can divide your change easily to match each prediction, it should include at least two *quarters*, three *dimes*, four *nickels*, and nine *pennies*.

Pretend to “weigh” the spectators’ fist full of change by moving it up and down with your hand, as if this provides input for your predictions. (But this is only for “show” – the trick works as long as your change exceeds theirs by *more* than the amount of your second prediction.)

After you’ve made all three “predictions,” have the spectator count his (or her) pocket change. You now count out **your** change, showing in sequence that each prediction to be correct! It appears as if you somehow knew the amount of spectator’s pocket change, which, of course, would be impossible!

IBM Ring 76 Media Server-----ON GOING

As a point of reference to remind everyone, the current PLEX server is not the production server. It is a test system we are using to test the feasibility of a dedicated PLEX server. It is referred to as “Little Boy” and the production system is referred to as “Fat Man” (names from the Manhattan Project).

The “Little Boy” test server is being temporally housed at David’s home while he helps get it organized. He is currently over 2/3rds the way through adding those 300 DVDs we got from Bill Michalek. I have to still get him the 120 DVD donations from Stan Sieler.

In the meantime, I am starting ripping some from my location to assist.

The “Fat Man” server is on my workbench. I had some video issues but resolved those and it is currently working fine. I am using it to rip DVDs for the PLEX server so it is hard at work serving the library.

I am working with James Kellogg in securing more video materials for the PLEX server. He also said he would donate a bunch of VHS tapes if we wanted them. YES!!!

Note: Do you have a way to convert VHS tapes to MP4 files? We would love to borrow or accept a donation of a device to do that.

How about donating your DVDs to the library so everyone in the club can share them? You will still have access to them through the PLEX server – even on your smart phone!
