Alexander Great, Our Installation Banquet Performer

The entertainer at our Installation Banquet on July 10 will be Alexander Great. He's a corporate and trade show performer who has entertained tens of thousands of people during his career. His clients include Disney, CBS, E-Entertainment and Medtronic. He's adept at stage illusions as well as close-up sleight of hand.

Alexander Great began as a magician at age 13 when a childhood friend taught him a trick. Practicing hard and competing at magic conventions, the first fruits of his efforts yielded the first place trophy for stage magic at The Pacific Coast Association of Magicians convention in 1986. The next year he returned with an even more elaborate act, and claimed the first place prize once again. Soon after, he presented illusions for Six Flags Magic Mountain, and later toured Australia as an apprentice to illusionist Chuck Jones, where he learned the real secrets of illusionary magic.

Graduating with a degree in marketing, Alexander returned to the states, performing at the Magic Castle often, where he was presented the highly respected Achievement Award. Soon after, The International Magic Awards featured his act and presented him with a trophy for Best Junior Magician. This nationally televised FOX special was the first of its kind and opened the door to developing even more breathtaking illusions, which he took abroad.

His show was presented in Japan, Stockholm, Rio de Janeiro, Taiwan and Shenzen, China. Later Alexander Great was featured at Caesars Magical Empire in Las Vegas. He then performed in Lake Tahoe for two years straight at The Horizon Casino Resort. Currently he resides in the entertainment capital of the world, Las Vegas.

He's looking forward to joining us at the beautiful venue provided by Bob and Mary Meigs. This promises to be a show you don't want to miss!

Magic in Balboa Park

The Marie Hitchcock Puppet Theatre in Balboa Park will be the venue for three magic shows, presented by members of Ring 76, on Sunday, July 31. It's rare for this theater to be used for anything besides puppetry; kudos to Mike Stilwell and representatives from the puppet theater for coordinating these events. Matthew King, Dale Law, "Joe Mystic," Mike Stilwell and Greg Wauson are currently scheduled to perform. Master puppeteer and magician Steve Taylor will be the emcee for all three shows.

The Marie Hitchcock Puppet Theater has a long history. It was originally part of the 1935 California Pacific International Exposition, which was organized to celebrate the completion of the Panama Canal. That large building was later subdivided into three areas, including the theater. The first public performance at the puppet theater was a marionette show given by Marie Hitchcock and her sister in 1947. Marie continued performing in



the puppet theater until she died in 1994 and the theater was named in Marie's honor in 1988. The theater still runs weekly live performances for thousands of guests each year.



Steve Taylor, the emcee for the shows on July 31, was a nine-year old boy in 1967 when Marie Hitchcock asked him to assist her in the puppet theater. He was thrilled at the opportunity and she gave him more and more opportunities to work there. He soon developed a love for puppetry as well as magic. From the encouragement given to him by Marie, Steve decided to make a career out of his passion for performing with puppets and magic. It will be fun to enjoy Steve as he is returning to the theater he grew up in.

Performances will be at 11:00 AM, 1:00 PM, and 3:00 PM and ticket prices for all shows will be just \$5. The low price is mandated by the theater. Tickets are expected to be available soon on the theater website, https://balboaparkpuppets.com/products/tickets. This is a great opportunity to showcase to the public some of the talents of local magicians. Come on out and support magic in Balboa Park!

To get to the theater, from Park Boulevard take President's Way in to the park. At the end of this road is a parking lot to your left. The theater is located on the west side of this lot and to the right of the Automotive Museum. Look for puppet show signs to help direct you.

Old Business



Trick of the Month Club #6 Miser's Dream

In *Miser's Dream*, the magician produces coins from *thin air* (or anywhere), and drops them into a *coin pail*. This was a favorite routine of the great *T. Nelson Downs*, more than 100 years ago.

Miser's Dream is a based on the even-older trick *producing a coin from a child's ear.* With the addition of the *pail*, the magician can *repeat the effect* with coin-after-coin, which is the effect we now call *Miser's Dream*.

The routine requires two magical "moves" – palming a coin, and a "bucket drop." Virtually every stage magician has performed this routine, and if you don't know how it works, **you** should!

The Props

All you need is about seven half-dollar coins, and a metal pail. Many pros use a *tooth bush can* as a "*pail*," but even a *tin can* will do - so long as you can hold it with four fingers inside, and it makes a loud *ringing sound* (called the "*clunk*") when a coin is dropped inside.

You also could buy a commercial *Coin Pail*, some with built-in "gimmicks." But these pails are expensive, you don't need the gimmicks, and the pails usually look like *champagne* buckets – which are vestiges of the past. This is why many pros today use a tooth brush can, available at *Bed, Bath, and Beyond*.

There are gimmicks for stealing additional coins, hiding "droppable" coins inside the pail, and faking the "clunk." But highly gimmicked pails are for collectors, not performers. Our version of *Miser's Dream* uses **no gimmicks**, so you need only the handful of coins (preferably half-dollars) and an ungimmicked pail. (Later, however, we describe a "coin ladder," which is an *alternative* to the pail.)

The Set-Up

Stack six coins on the *finger-tips* of your right hand, palm up. Tip the stack over *backwards*, so the *bottom coin* remains at your finger-tips, and the *overlapping coins* extend toward your palm.

Slide the pail *horizontally* over your fingers and the coins, grasping the upper side between your fingers (now inside the pail) and your thumb. The coins now are hidden, yet you can move the pail freely.

Hide *another coin* in your left hand in a *finger-palm position*. *You're ready to go!* This set-up is easier than it sounds, and with a little practice, you'll be able to do it *unnoticed* as you pick up your pail.

The Performance

First, show the pail as "empty" (even though it's really not). Then, with your left hand, produce a coin from a child's ear. To "produce" this coin, simply slide it with your thumb until it's held between your left thumb and index finger. *Extend your other fingers* so the audience sees that you are holding *only one coin*!

Now pretend to drop this coin into your pail, but actually, **return it to the finger-palm position**! Use the middle finger of your right hand to push the bottom coin of your "hidden stack" into the pail. The coin from the "hidden stack" actually produces the "clunk" sound!

Bring your left hand up with the original coin again in a finger-palm position, and you're ready to go again!

Our set-up lets you drop seven coins, which is *plenty!* In fact, the last three drops can be *"invisible coins,"* instead of a *"produced"* coin.

To switch to "*invisible coins*," on the fourth drop, *really* drop the coin in your left hand into the pail. For the remainder of the routine, have audience members toss "*invisible coins*." Pretend to catch these "invisible coins" in the pail, releasing coins from your right hand to make the "clunks." For the finish, dump all seven coins onto a table top.

Using a Coin Ladder

A "*coin ladder*" is an *alternative to the pail*. With most *coin ladders*, coins drop through a series of glass or metal panes, producing a *musical sound* as they fall. This dramatizes the "drop," and adds a musical effect to the routine. Of course, a ladder is both bulky and expensive.

If you use a ladder, I recommend one equipped with a "*waterfall*" feature, allowing you to release a dozen or more hidden coins *all at once*. This permits you to finish by having the *whole audience* throw invisible coins into the ladder at one time. Even if you don't always use the waterfall, it's nice to have this capability.
