Mark had Mago hold his 10 coins in his hand while Mark made his prediction. Mark's first prediction was Linda's unseen card which was the Two of Hearts, his second prediction was Doug's birthday, February 8th, and the final prediction was Mago's exact change of $\$ 1.75$. Mark's predictions were all correct.

Next up, Greg introduced Alvin Revilas to speak about a serious


Mark Booth topic. Alvin then mentioned that during the pandemic he dealt with a friend with depression, and he turned the situation around, and it was the reason he got back into magic.

Greg followed Alvin with some Gospel Magic he has performed for Sunday School. He went on to explain how God created everything by using magic and displayed six yellow envelopes with stars and numbered 1-6 with different writings on the back. Greg then chose a spectator and had them pick a card. He then went on to show the backs of all the unselected cards and what was written on them: Give Money, Go to Church, Serve Others, No Fun, Dress to Impress. Last was the selected card, the card which was what God really wants, when he revealed what was on the back of \#3. He showed everyone a mirror and what God really wants is "YOU". Greg then explained to the club how to perform the effect.

Alfonso Vasquez performed after Greg and explained how magic helped him when he returned from the Gulf War and thanking Alvin for sharing his story. Alfonso then began his performance by using a guest's borrowed dollar, ripped it up, and then was able to put it back together. He then asked Sam to choose a coin from a variety of different types and stuck it


Next up was Mago Ruly. Mago called on Jon, from the audience, to selected a card. Mago then went on to show the audience two cards that were not selected by Jon and pulled out a picture of a girl in her swimsuit. He closed the picture and had Jon reach his hand into the fold of the picture two times, each time Jon pulled out a different item of clothing. His selected card appeared on the bikini bottom, Magos' final reveal was that the picture turned into a male lifeguard.
Matthew King appeared on
stage next asking for two volunteers to start his act. He chose Kelley and borrowed her ring. He then chose guest Susan and asked her to join him up on stage. Matthew had Susan hold the ring through a handkerchief, and when he whisked it away, it had vanished. Then Matthew pulled
 Matt King aside the stage curtain to show a gumball machine and asked the audience for a quarter. After placing two quarters in the machine, and odd items coming out, The third and final quarter that went into the machine was in fact the borrowed ring.

Last was Miguel Garcia. He chose Greg to help. He had Greg choose between a red and blue deck. The cards were shuffled. Then he and Greg cut the cards into different piles. Then Miguel had six, and Greg had five. Both of the top cards matched. Then the 3rd card matched.

## Shavings from the Board

The Ring 76 Board of Directors meets the fourth Monday of every month, except December. Here is a look at what the Board is planning for you in the coming months.

The September $26^{\text {th }}$ Board meeting was held via Zoom and was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President "Magic Mike"
 Stilwell.

After the approval of the minutes of the last Board meeting the various officers reported on their status. Treasurer Miguel Garcia awarded Mago Ruly $\$ 20$ for winning "Magician Choice" night and the current treasury is quite healthy. Sergeant-at-Arms David Chiu was absent, but "Magic Mike" indicated he was informed there were eighteen members and eleven guests at the last meeting. Librarian Gary Salisbury mentioned he has sixty audio books he will be adding to the Plex Server. Audio books do not teach tricks but explain how to get into the psychology of
magic. First VP (Entertainment), Greg Wauson reported we had nine performers for September. Greg mentioned it seemed that people had a good time and a step up from August's Math magic. He then complemented "Magic Mike" on flexibility when it comes to performing. The theme for October is Spooky Magic. Second VP (Membership), James Thayer informed the board that we currently have fifty five members in good standing. He also readdressed the need to educate members on what they will be voting on pertaining to the constitution and by-law changes (see article on page 5). The Board discussed presenting changes at the meeting in October and November as written in the constitution and having the members vote on all new changes at the November meeting.

After the officer's reports it was time for Old Business. Matthew King discussed the Superior Quality Ring Award process he is currently working on. He shared Ring 76 had won the Quality Ring Award four times as of 2005. He will get the current one prepared and sent to the Board before the next meeting. The Board also addressed revisiting writing up duties for Board roles at a later meeting.

It was then on to New Business. James informed the Board he will be attending the October meeting to educate members on what they will be voting on pertaining to the constitution and by-laws new changes. The Board then discussed and agreed to hold a swap meet during the November meeting. The cost for a table is $\$ 10$ for Ring 76 members and $\$ 20$ for nonmembers. The Board will also be reaching out to outside Rings to participate in the swap meet. "Magic Mike" then brought up the Ring 76 brochure and asked what was the status on editing and updating the brochure as well as who we need to get in contact with to make changes. Miguel and Anthony need to send in a portrait and a small bio. "Magic Mike" then asked once brochures are finished to get them out to local magic shops as they are running low. "Magic Mike" then stated he had spoken to Tim Wise and that Tim asked if we would like to have a lecture by Howard Hamburg who as well as being an accomplished magician was also a student of Dai Vernon. All that will be needed to get Howard to San Diego for the lecture is a place to stay and a $\$ 300$ fee. The Board unanimously agreed yes.

With that, the business of Ring 76 was addressed and the meeting was Adjourned at 8:07 p.m.


# Membership Changes Proposed for Ring 76

[As per the Constitution of Ring 76, any proposed amendment to the Constitution must be presented to the Ring Membership for consideration for two consecutive months in the communication of the Ring. This is the second posting of the proposed amendments and the voting by the membership will be at the November meeting - ed.]

The Board has been looking at making some changes to rules regarding Membership in Ring 76. Since these changes will require making amendments to the Ring 76 Constitution and Bylaws, these are changes that you, the current Members of Ring 76 will need to vote on to approve them.

In summary, these changes would add two new classes of membership, Non-Resident and Life, and modify an existing class of membership, Honorary. But before getting into the details of these changes, first, a little background on the current situation. As set out in our Constitution and Bylaws, currently Ring 76 has four classes of membership: Active; Junior; Associate and Honorary.

Active -- This is the default class of membership. Active members are over 18. If they are in good standing, they can vote in Ring elections; and are eligible to serve on the Board and can serve on any committees established by the Board. They have all the rights and privileges that accrue to membership in Ring 76. They currently pay $\$ 30 /$ year in dues.
Junior -- This is a class of membership for persons between the ages of 12 and 18 . They cannot vote in Ring elections and are not eligible to serve on the Board or committees. They do however have all other rights and privileges. They pay $1 / 2$ the amount of Active members (currently \$15). Junior members automatically qualify for Active membership upon reaching the age of 18.

Associate -- Associates are persons who are spouses of Active members; designated drivers for Junior members; and bone-fide assistants an Active member. Associate members cannot vote in Ring elections and cannot serve on the Board or as committee chairs. They may, however, serve on committees and they do hold all other rights and privileges. Associate members do not pay any dues.
Honorary -- Honorary members are persons who have "...benefited the magical arts and Ring 76 or otherwise sufficiently distinguished themselves...". Honorary members can be nominated by the Board and must be ratified by the Membership. Honorary members do not vote nor are they eligible to serve on the Board or any committees. Honorary members pay no dues and
continuation of their honorary status is reviewed by the Board annually.

The changes that the Board are proposing would add two new membership classes as follows:

Non-Resident -- An Active member of Ring 76 would become eligible for Non-Resident membership if they move to a domicile that is 100 miles or greater from San Diego's Old Town Plaza. The intention is to encourage members of Ring 76 to stay connected after they move away from San Diego. Non-Resident members are eligible to vote and serve on committees but may not serve as a Board member or as a committee chair. They would retain all other rights and privileges. Dues for a Non-Resident member would be $1 / 2$ that set for Active Members (or currently, \$15).
Life -- Life members is a "class" of membership that already exists informally, but the Board felt that it was time to properly define and codify this class of membership in the Constitution and Bylaws. Eligibility for Life membership is any Active member who has exhibited a high degree of dedication and personal effort to the benefit of Ring 76. Life membership would require nomination by the Board and ratification by the membership. Life membership would be identical to Active membership except in two key ways: first, they would pay no dues and second, they would remain members of Ring 76 until death (unless Life status is revoked through a formal disciplinary action.) Existing "Life" members (of which there are currently six) would be grandfathered into this class of Membership.

In addition, the Honorary Class of membership with be modified as follows:

> Eligibility for Honorary membership in Ring 76 would be to those who "...contributed to the magical arts or has otherwise sufficiently distinguished themselves in a manner relevant to the benefit of Ring 76..." They may be nominated by any member, in good standing, of Ring 76 and would be ratified by the Board. (Currently, Ring 76 has one Honorary member, Holly Baker, granddaughter of Honest Sid Gerhart, our Ring's namesake.)

So what's next, you ask? These changes must go through comment period where the members of the Ring have the opportunity to ask questions and comment on the proposed changes to the Constitution and Bylaws. At the end of the comment period, the membership of the Ring must vote on whether to accept the proposed changes. If the membership approves, these changes would then be incorporated into our Constitution and Bylaws.

# Trick of the Month Club \#9 <br> Four of a- Kind <br> By Bob Meigs 

This is another Mike Stilwell trick, but it doesn't use the key card. Mike has performed this one on TV - it's that good!
Effect: A spectator is asked to name a number, let's say, between 5 and 25. Assume the spectator says 18. You deal 18 cards off the top of the deck, asking if there is any reason the spectator chose that particular number. Regardless of the spectator's answer, square-up the 18 -card packet and re-deal into 4 piles,

Turn over the top card on the left pile (as an example, let's say it's an Ace); say, "Wouldn't it be remarkable if the last pile also had an Ace on top?" Turn over the top card of the $4^{\text {th }}$ pile, and it is also an Ace!

Say, "WOW! ," with enthusiasm! " We have two piles left. What are the odds they're also both Aces?" (2 cards in $50 \times 1$ in $49=1,225$ to 1 ). Turn them over - they are both Aces!
Method: This can be a borrowed deck, but you have to do a little preparation. There must be four-of-a-kind on top (Aces, in our example). ). You can shuffle, but you must leave the top 4 cards on top. (Easy to do with a riffle shuffle.)

Deal face down the number of cards selected by the spectator (18, in our example). The four Aces are now the bottom cards of this packet. If you deal this packet of cards into four piles, the bottom cards will be the last 4 cards dealt, and with one sitting atop each pile. As you turn them over, make this seem like a miracle!

In conclusion, say, "This never would have worked if you hadn't of chosen 18 (or whatever the chosen number was)." This bit of misdirection sends the spectator's mind down the wrong path..

## The Royal Road to Card Magic
