Mark Booth did a closeup effect in which he told a story about an evil family using many red and one white poker chips. He pulled out a bell and informed the members that when he rang the bell something weird would happen to the poker chips. The white poker chip then went on to move through the red poker chips after each time the bell rang. Then the final time the white poker chip went from the

bottom to the top then reappeared under the canister.

Joseph DePaul gave the club the option of another card trick or a

nasty spooky trick and then pulled out three nails and a hammer. Joseph asked an audience member to pick one of the nails. He told a few jokes on the history of hammering a nail. Then went on to hammer a nail in his nose. Then he hung a skeleton from the nail and made the nail disappear.




correct. The mummy was guilty of the crime.

After the approval of the minutes of the last Board meeting, the various officers gave their reports on the state of the Ring.

Treasurer Miguel Garcia shared the current Ring bank balance and James Thayer reminded the Board that he has been paying for the Ring Website for the last few months. Sergeant-at-Arms David Chiu shared that we had thirty-eight attendees at the last meeting with twenty three members and 15 guests. First V.P. Max Maven Passes

It is with a degree of sadness that MagiCurrents announces the death of Max Maven, a pioneer mentalist and magician who passed away at his home in Hollywood on November 1 after a two-year battle with glioblastoma. With his iconic Widow's Peak and appropriate stage presence, he became the epitome of mental magic.

Born Philip Goldstein on December 21, 1950 in Ithaca, NY, he created the character of Max Maven in the mid-'70s, and was honored by magical societies around the world, including the Society of American Magicians and the International Brotherhood of Magicians. Most recently, FISM (Fédération Internationale des Sociétés Magiques) awarded him a lifetime achievement for his many decades supporting and contributing to the organization's global growth and success.


Loch David Crane Estate -----ON HOLD

AUDIOBOOK REVIEW



MAGIC IS DEAD by Ian Frisch

Magic Is Dead is Ian Frisch's head-first dive into a hidden world full of extraordinary characters and highly guarded secrets. It is a story of imagination, deception, and art that spotlights today's most brilliant young magicians—a mysterious club known as the 52, who are revolutionizing an ancient artform under the mantra Magic Is Dead.

Ian brings us with him as he not only gets to know this fascinating world, but also becomes an integral part of it. We meet the 52's founding members—Laura London, Daniel Madison, and Chris Ramsay—and explore their personal demons, professional aspirations, and what drew them to their craft. We join them at private gatherings of the most extraordinary magicians working today, follow them to magic conventions in Las Vegas and England, and discover some of the best tricks of the trade. We also encounter David Blaine; hang out with Penn Jillette; meet Dynamo, the U.K.'s most famous magician; and go behind the scenes of a Netflix magic show. *Magic Is Dead* is also a chronicle of magic's rich history and how it has changed in the internet age, as the young guns embrace social media and move away from the old-school take on the craft.

As he tells the story of the 52, and his role as its most unlikely member, Ian reveals his own connection with trickery and deceit and how he first learned the elements that make magic work from his poker-playing mother. He recalls their adventures in card rooms and casinos after his father's sudden death, and shares a touching moment that he had, as a working journalist, with his childhood idol Shaquille O'Neal.

"Magic—the romanticism of the inexplicable, the awe and admiration of the unexpected—is an underlying force in how we view the world and its myriad possibilities," Ian writes. As his journey continues, Ian not only becomes a performer and creator of magic—even fooling the late Anthony Bourdain during a chance encounter—he also cements a new brotherhood, and begins to understand his relationship with his father, fifteen years

after his death. Written with psychological acuity and a keen eye for detail, *Magic Is Dead* is an engrossing tale full of wonder and surprise.



FOOLING HOUDINI by Alex Stone

When Alex Stone was five years old, his father bought him a magic kit - a gift that would spark a lifelong love. Years later, while living in New York City, he discovered a vibrant underground magic scene exploding with creativity and innovation and populated by a fascinating cast of characters: from his gruff mentor, who holds court in the back of a rundown pizza shop, to one of the world's greatest card cheats, who also happens to be blind. Captivated, he plunged headlong into this mysterious world, eventually competing at the Magic Olympics and training with great magicians around the globe to perfect his craft.

From the back rooms of New York City's century-old magic societies to cutting-edge psychology labs; three-card monte on Canal Street to glossy Las Vegas casinos; *Fooling Houdini* recounts Stone's quest to join the ranks of master magicians. As he navigates this quirky and occasionally hilarious subculture, Stone pulls back the curtain on a community shrouded in secrecy, fueled by obsession and brilliance, and organized around a single overriding need: to prove one's worth by deceiving others.

But his journey is more than a tale of tricks, gigs, and geeks. In trying to understand how expert magicians manipulate our minds to create their astonishing illusions, Stone uncovers a wealth of insight into human nature and the nature of perception. Every turn leads to questions about how the mind perceives the world and processes everyday experiences. By investigating some of the lesser-known corners of psychology, neuroscience, physics, history, and even crime, all through the lens of trickery and illusion, *Fooling Houdini* arrives at a host of startling revelations about how the mind works - and why, sometimes, it doesn't.



MAGIC WORDS by Gerald Kolpan

Magic Words: The Tale of a Jewish Boy-Interpreter, the World's Most Estimable Magician, a Murderous Harlot, and America's Greatest Indian Chief. In a riveting novel of love and adventure, young Julius Meyer comes to the New World to find himself acting as translator for the famed Indian chief, Standing Bear. Young Jewish immigrant Julius comes of age surrounded by the wild world of 1867 Nebraska. He befriends the mysterious Prophet John, who saves his life when the two are captured by the Ponca Indian tribe.

Living as a slave, Julius meets the noble chief Standing Bear and his young daughter, Prairie Flower, with whom he falls in love.

Becoming the tribe's interpreter - its "speaker" - his life seems safe and settled. But Julius has reckoned without the arrival of his older cousin, Alexander - who, as the Great Herrmann, is the most famous young magician in America. Nor does he suspect the ultimate consequences of Alex's affair with Lady-Jane Little Feather, a glamorous - and murderous - prostitute destined to become the most scandalous woman on two continents.

Filled with adventure, humor, and colorful characters, Magic Words is a riveting adventure about the nature of prejudice, the horror of genocide, and a courageous young man who straddles two worlds to fight for love and freedom.

These three audiobooks are available on the IBM Magic Media Server for streaming to computer, tablet, smart phone, or media player.

Trick-of-the Month

RED HERRING

by Ben Earl (Vanishing Inc.)-freely received after ordering a book on Cyber Sale Monday, Nov. 26, 2018—on 1/2/2021 I re-worked it for my own liking/presentation.

IMPOSSIBLE CARD LOCATION—Magician knows the card beforehand, forcing it to be the 3rd card from the top yet the effect seems totally about a random and haphazard process, utterly fair, fluid, and free.

Possible best opening route: "Okay, before we start a card trick, I want you to see if this deck is legitimate, nothing weird, a full deck of 52 cards (as sweeping it open, face-up, Magician eyes third card from top—KEY CARD!—Look it over, check it out, is it okay, ready to go? Good, let's start!"

Initial MOVES

- (1) "Okay, before we start, please look over the cards, then shuffle them to your heart's delight."
- (2) "Now, I'm going to get rid of the jokers (spot key card, 3rd from top!!!)"
- (3) Spread cards out, face-up: "Well, how does it look to you; a fair, full deck, right"
- (4) "Okay, let me finish this segment off with more cuts and shuffles" (all are false ones!)

Onward

- (1) "Okay, now I'm going to deal all the cards face down, like this, one at a time, or in bunches, all the way to the bottom, then square the deck up."
- (2) "Then to make it even fairer, I will move the top card to the middle and the bottom card to the middle, just in case, just in case...I saw something...Okay?"
- (3) "Now, it's your turn. Please cut the deck roughly in half, and put the top half to the side, then guestimate how many cards you have left in your hand...a rough guess will do; you don't have to tell me now! (**This twist derails the Spectator to focus upon an imaginary #, which is irrelevant to the overall effect) or "tell me your guestimate now, to be used later..." Let's say it happens to be 24! It matters not.
- (4) "Then, just like I did earlier, please bury the top and bottom cards in the middle, in the name of fairness."
- (5) "Now, please look at the bottom card (that is your special card), don't say it out loud; then drop these cards on other pack on the table, as I turn away (in the name of fairness). All you have to do now is to remember your card."
- (6) "Now, give the cards a complete cut. And do one more shuffle. So it couldn't be fairer, right?"
- (7) "Then let me smush them totally up...Now, my friend, you do it as well, to make this process even freer and fairer! Then please square them up, simply in the name of <u>neatness</u>!"
