Welcome to Ex Libris, my monthly newsletter article about the IBM Ring 76 Library in San Diego, CA.

'Ex Libris' (Eh-cks LEE-breese), means 'From the Book'. Generally, you will see this term used on bookplates to denote that it came from the library of its owner. For example: "Ex Libris: Gary Salisbury."

This is where we talk about your library and do book & video reviews. Yes, your library! If you are a Ring 76 member in good standing, then this is your library! So be sure to stay in good standing by paying your dues on time.

Someone recently asked me, "What is the Ring 76 Library?" I responded, "It is currently over 1,000 volumes of magic books and over 2,000 magic magazines, all available for check-out. It is over 1,500 magic oriented teaching videos and over 150 magic related audiobooks, all available for streaming from the IBM Ring 76 Magic Media Server. It is also a museum for a collection of historic Ring 76 memorabilia from one of our founders, Honest Sid Gerhart. It is a magical learning source unparalleled in the entire IBM organization and it is funded totally from donations you have made and fund-raising efforts that I have engage in."


These items will be put on the *IBM Ring 76 Magic Media Server* for you to stream to your favorite device.



Loch David Crane Estate ------CLOSED

I am serving as the contact point between Ring 76 and the Probate Attorney for Loch David Crane. We just heard from the Court and I am afraid it is bad news for us.


In summary:

Loch died without a formal will and was declared intestate by the Court. He had two heirs, a paternal cousin (here in San Diego) and a maternal cousin (back in Michigan). Normally, under these circumstances, the proceeds would be equally split between the survivors.

However, the San Diego cousin found a hand written will, after he was declared intestate, dividing his assets as he wished. This is where he wanted us to have his magic book collection.

Also of note, the Michigan cousin was not mentioned in the handwritten will but the San Diego cousin was.

The Probate Court has decided that his handwritten will was not submitted to the Court in time and declared it invalid, never mind what Loch's intentions were. Under those circumstances, the Court will probably divide his assets equally between the two cousins.

If you knew Loch, you wouldn't think he was worth a lot of money but I was surprised to hear that at the time of death, his assets were around five-million-dollars. With the spike in real estate values, that number will most likely be closer to the ten-million-dollar mark today.

So where does that leave us? Out in the cold I am afraid. However, my intentions are to contact the San Diego cousin and see if she would like to donate his magic books to our library, per his wishes.

On a personal note, if you want your final wishes to be followed, then do it legally with an attorney or they may not be, as in Loch's case.

The War Magician by David Fisher

How an Illusionist C

How an Illusionist Changed the Course of World War II

Based on an extraordinary true story and soon to be a major film produced by and starring Benedict Cumberbatch, *The War Magician* is the remarkable tale of the man who used the powers of illusion to fight the Nazis—and created the most remarkable feat of legerdemain since the Trojan Horse.

When England went to war against Hitler in 1939, it mobilized its entire military and industrial resources. But there was no place in that vast army for legendary stage magician Jasper Maskelyne, whose family was renowned for creating modern theatrical illusions. Maskelyne was determined to fight the Nazis using his only weapon: he intended to apply the techniques of popular magic to the battlefield. Initially ignored and ridiculed by the staid military leadership, he eventually cajoled his way into the Camouflage Section and was sent to the western desert, where he created a new type of warfare.

With his small group of artists, the Magic Gang, Maskelyne designed and developed ingenious weapons, then tricked the Desert Fox, General Rommel, and his fabled Afrika Korps into believing there were tanks and battleships where there were none, concealed the Suez Canal, and even successfully "moved" Alexandria harbor.

But it required all his skills to pull off perhaps the largest and most complex magic trick in history. As General Bernard

Montgomery told Maskelyne on the eve of the Battle of El Alamein, "The entire war will turn on what happens here. What I am about to ask you to do is impossible. It can't be done, but it must be done. I hope you've brought your magic wand with you."

This is the fact-based story of the illusion that won the war in the desert

(If you do not hear back from me within 24 hours, there may have been a technical problem so call me.) I will make sure the item(s) get to the next monthly meeting or you can pick it up at my home in Blossom Valley.

There is a limit of 4 items per month. You will need to sign the library card attached to the item along with your phone number. Last year several volunteers from Ring 76 entertained the people there with strolling magic. This was a great time, bringing some magic into the lives of others to make the event even more special. In fact, it went so well that they invited us back! We have three Ring 76 members signed up so

CONTEST TIME!

Our annual stand-up competition will be held at the general membership meeting on May 8. We currently have six brave individuals signed up and there can be a maximum of eight, so there is room for you! Contact Greg Wauson at gw83@ring76.com to throw your hat into the ring. Keep in mind even if you do not win, you will benefit from the stage time in front of a live and friendly audience! Here are the rules:

- 1. The V.P. of entertainment, or his proxy, will be the contest chair.
- 2. Any member in good standing is welcome to compete.
- **3.** The order of each contestant's appearance in the standup contest will be determined by a random drawing prior to the commencement of the contest.
- 4. Contestants may choose to perform on the stage or on the floor in front of it.
- **5.** Contestants are welcome to provide their own sound systems or coordinate with someone else to bring one.
- 6. Each contestant will have eight minutes to perform.
- 7. An announcer will announce each contestant's name, initiating the beginning of the performance. The announcer will call out the seven-minute time, indicating one minute is left. Exceeding the eight-minute time limit will automatically disqualify the contestant.
- **8.** All Ring 76 members at the meeting will be provided with a ballot upon which they will write the name of one contestant.
- 9. All ballots will be collected and counted by the contest chair. The total votes for each contestant will determine that person's score.
- **10.** The cash prizes will be \$50, \$30 and \$20 for the contestant with the first, second and third most votes, respectively.
- 11. The winners will be announced and awarded their prizes at the Installation Banquet in July.

12. All decisions concerning interpretations of, and exceptions to, these rules will be made by the contest chair.
