May Stand-up an Evening to Remember

As the current Ring year winds down, the May meeting of Ring 76 proved to be an enthusiastic event. From the auditions of new members to the annual Stand-up contest, the members and guests had an evening to be remembered.

The meeting got started with the usual Ring business. "Magic Mike" announced we had 50 people in attendance: Several other announcements included James Thayer's reminder that dues are due in June, and Mark Booth's reminder that the Installation Banquet is \$24 per person and you need to pay him by the end of June. Paul showed the "macro world' and entertained us with putting knots into a tube, then the knots were undone and his routine ended with appearing knots on the rope.



Mentalism in June

Mentalism is the theme of our June meeting on the 12th. There's a wide variety of types of effects within the broad range of mentalism: telepathy, clairvoyance, divination, precognition, psychokinesis, mind control, memory feats, deduction, and rapid mathematics. Mentalism is commonly classified as a subcategory of magic, although many professional mentalists want to distinguish themselves from magicians, who simply perform "magic tricks." We won't be that picky! The broader topic of entertainment includes them both. And comedy mentalism is fair game too. Remember Johnny Carson's Carnac routine?

Are you considering performing at one of our meetings but just can't get yourself to sign up? Here are some reasons you should:

- Get some stage time. Yep you can hone an
 effect you already perform and make it even
 better. Or, try out a new effect and see how
 well it plays.
- 2. Get some feedback. Our members are always welcome to tell the VP of Entertainment they'd like to get feedback from our members about an effect they're presenting. Written and confidential feedback is then provided directly to you, or it could be verbal your choice.

- 4. Votes on our performance nights count toward the cumulative total, which determines the performer of the year.
- **5.** We're a friendly crowd. You're among friends when you perform at a Ring 76 meeting.

A few weeks ago, I got a call from JW August of Channel 10 News. He asked if I would like to be part of a little reunion of channel 10 staff that had worked with **Jack White** over his 30 years at channel 10 and told me that Lynn White had suggested I come and tell how I met Jack and possibly do a little magic in remembrance.

This happened on May 25th on the patio at The Casa Guadalajara in Old Town. There were 40 to 50 people there, anchors, story writers, camera men, reporters, editors, all kinds of folks that worked with Jack. I arrived at 3:45 PM and entertained with some walk-around table side magic till the event kicked off and was M.C.d by JW August. He showed a video of

Jack doing Restaurant row stories, a video that talked about a scholarship program that Jack created and a video of Jack doing "Fresh fish sold here today". It was 1974 and I decided that since I was an armature magician I would stop by the magic shop on 30th Street in North Park to pick up a roll of rope, so I could do the cut and restored rope trick. There I met Jack for the first time. He told me he worked at Channel 10 as a news anchor and also was a collector of vintage magic and that he did a few rope tricks. He asked me if I knew "Professors Nightmare." I said no so he asked Chuck Martinez for a pair of scissors he pulled off about 6' from my spool, cut the rope and taught me the routine.

So, I did that routine that Jack taught me for the group and that kicked off all the fun stories in remembrance of San Diego's Jack White. Oh and I also found out that Jack was a consultant for the movie *The Anchorman*. Will Ferrell did a little video clip for this event. It was great seeing all the people that many of us grew up watching over the last 40 years. What an honor for me to be invited to this event.

Shavings from the Board

The May Board meeting was held via ZOOM and was called to order at 7:02PM by "Magic Mike" Stilwell.

Along with the Board, Sherry Luft was there as acting secretary, Richard Ustick as Newsletter Editor and Josh Sherwin, current candidate for Ring President.



After the approval of the minutes of the last Board and General meetings, the reports of the various officers were presented. James Thayer reported that the Ring currently has 75 members and that a third of the membership has renewed for the next year. David Chui reported we had a substantial audience for the Stand-up Contest (See Page 1) with twenty-eight members and twenty-two guests in attendance. Librarian, Gary Salisbury announced that Sherry Luft, Malcolm Campbell, David Chiu, Nick Benevento, and Chris Lorenson all donated to our Library.

The estate of Loch David Crane's (November 28, 1948 – April 25, 2018) is still being decided and Gary will stay in contact with the family. Greg Wauson reported that the June 12th meeting theme is "Mentalism" and this is the last "performer night" of the year. As of the Board meeting two people have signed up (see page 3 for details). Greg will not be there that night, so "Magic Mike" will announce the entertainment and collect the votes.

With all reports made it was on to Old Business.

The Ring is still looking for a Secretary for the new Board. Sherry Luft has graciously offered to fill in until this problem can be resolved. With Sherry doing the duties of the Secretary, Greg Wauson will fill in as Newsletter Proof Reader, an important and time consuming position she has held for quite a few years.

June will be a very busy meeting as not only will we have magic from the members but the elections for the new Board of Directors, and the election of the Ring 76 Member of the Year. "Magic Mike", David Yee and Bruce Wollitz will be the entertainers for the June 4th Wheel Chair Regatta. The Installation Banquet has 26 RSVPs. Your best chance to pay is at the June meeting, though reservations will continue till the end of the month. Brenda Wauson is providing the decorations, Olive Garden is providing the food and the Ring will need round tablecloths and the club will buy them. Welcome to Ex Libris, my monthly newsletter article about the IBM Ring 76 Library in San Diego, CA.

'Ex Libris' (Eh-cks LEE-breese), means 'From the Book'. Generally, you will see this term used on bookplates to denote that it came from the library of its owner. For example: "Ex Libris: Gary Salisbury."

This is where we talk about your library as well as do book and video reviews. Yes, your library! If you are a Ring 76 member in good standing, then this is your library! So be sure to stay in good standing by paying your dues on time.

Someone recently asked me, "What is the Ring 76 Library?" I responded, "It is currently over 1,000 volumes of magic books and over 2,000 magic magazines, all available for check-out. It is over 1,500 magic instruction videos, over 500 magic performance videos, and over 150 magic related audiobooks, all available for streaming from the Ring 76 Magic Media Server. It is also a museum for a collection of historic Ring 76 memorabilia from one of our founders, Honest Sid Gerhart. It is a magical learning source unparalleled in the entire IBM organization and it is funded totally from donations and fund-raising efforts that I have engage in for you."

WHAT'S NEW AT YOUR LIBRARY?

Funding & Expenditures-----ON GOING

Last month we made \$50 from the 50/50 drawing and \$55 from an auction. We purchased a six-volume audiobook series and parts and software for the Magic Media Server for \$210.80.


Ring 76 Magic Media Server-----ON GOING


A PERSONAL NOTE

Four short years ago, I was asked if I would like to be the club's librarian. I thought about it long and hard before replying. I first asked what the current state the club's library was in and found it was in 8-9 delipidated, insect and rodent infested, cardboard boxes that were stored in someone's open garage. I then asked what the club needed. It needed a complete overhaul! How could I get it from point A to point B? How could I make this library the "Best in Class?"

I had a vision of making it the best magic reference library in the IBM organization and to bring it into the 21st century with new technology – streaming! I stipulated that I would accept the position if I could run it like it, was my own business. I laid out my vision before the board of directors, which they accepted, and then, and only then, did I accept the position as your librarian.

I requested a commitment from the board for regular funding but that was refused so I set out to raise the needed funds on my own. I did so through donations, monthly opportunity drawings, as well as sales of books, videos, and magic props that were donated to the library. To date, I have raised over \$5,100 for the library. Early on, I secured the largest donation ever made to the ring with a collection of magic videos valued at over \$12,000 from Dr. X, an anonymous friend of the library. There have also been several other large donations of books, videos, and props valued from \$1,000 to \$5,000 from throughout the United States. I have even willed my personal magic library of over 300 volumes (valued at over \$15,000) to the Ring 76 library.

We currently have over 1,000 magic books, over 1,500 magic instructional videos, over 500 magic performance videos, over 150 magic oriented audiobooks, and over 2,000 magic magazines. We have one of the first audio/video streaming libraries with the *Ring 76 Magic Media Server*. The Ring 76 library is now one of the largest, if not the largest, ring libraries.

I am 77 years old and do not know how much longer I have left so I need to do the prudent thing and start grooming the next librarian. We need someone who can be as passionate about this project as I am. Someone who is willing to give their time, energy, and space for the library. Someone who is willing to make themselves available for the membership 7x24. If you think this could be you, then let me know and we will talk. I am looking at this as a long-term apprenticeship. Maybe a year, maybe two or three. I will stay on as long as I can but who knows? I do promise you that it will be "A Most Excellent Adventure!"

LIBRARY CHECK OUT PROCEDURE

Members may contact me 7x24 either by e-mail at <u>librarian@ring76.com</u> or by cell phone (voice or text) at 619-569 -6035 to let me know what you would like to check out. (If you do not hear back from me within 24 hours, there may have been a technical problem so call me.) I will make sure the item(s) get to the next monthly meeting or you can pick it up at my home in Blossom Valley.

There is a limit of 4 items per month. You will need to sign the library card attached to the item along with your phone number. We ask that you return the items to the library on or before the monthly meeting for the following month (for example: If you check out a book at the July meeting, it should be returned on or before the August meeting). If need be, you can keep the book or video again if nobody else has requested it but you must sign for it again.

Our objective is to build the best magic reference library in the entire IBM organization world-wide but we need your help to do that. Please return over-due books & videos and donate regularly to your library. The library is here so YOU can learn how to perform magic. Use it!

Non-urgent communications will always be done via my *Ex Libris* newsletter article while more urgent communications will be done by a *Ring 76 Librarygram* emailed to:
