
June Meeting was Mentally Challenging

We had two auditions. First up was "Super Duper Santa," Richard Stahley. He performed a classic "Professor's Nightmare" with a twist as "Santa's Nightmare." Richard used sleigh bells as sound effects and ended with a story about "fairy dust" and candy appearing and disappearing. It was no surprise that he was voted into the club!



Our first performer was "Ms. Charley" Miller, who kept to the mentalism theme and entertained us with a comical card counting routine. Three cards were selected and the cards were fanned to determine which cards were missing. Charley guessed all the selections correctly.





Max Long was the second entertainer., demonstrating three ways of predicting the outcome of a die: sleight of math, sleight of hand and sleight of mind.



Next was **Chris Connelly** who did a card prediction. His spectator selected a card and then dealt cards, some face up and some face down, and flipped them over . Chris predicted the spectator's card. He was also accepted as a new member. Welcome, Richard and Chris!

Mark Booth was the third presenter. He did a prediction effect called Michael Murray's "Show Reel," guessing the correct celebrity, a book test without a



book. His finale was an Inject effect by Greg Rostami. Mark showed a Google picture of a card that the spectator had merely thought of and the result was a tattoo artist revealing the spectator's card.

The last presenter was Steve Rowin, who did a Max Maven effect named Kurotsuke. He figured out the color of a single candy from a group of candy with an entirely different color.



The fifth entertainer was "Mr. Funtastic," who performed "Picto Play" with flash cards, another form of card counting.





"Mago Ruly" was up next, and he triumphed with a game to combat Alzheimer's. He produced a plush animal (unicorn) and his finale was a second plush animal (cow), which works well with both adult and children spectators.

Steve ended with a demonstration by his son, who solved a Rubik's Cube in record time.

If you've seen him before, you'll want to see him again. That is, if you like to laugh while you're enjoying top notch magic. Any list of the best comedy magicians has to include him. We're talking about Jeff Hobson and we are incredibly excited to have him as our performer at the installation banquet on Monday, July 10.

Jeff saw a magic show at seven years old and the hook was set. He decided then that when he grew up he'd be a full-time magician. From his roots in Michigan, he traveled and performed in Las Vegas, Atlantic City and around the world. He performed with Mark Kalin and Jinger in "Carnival of Wonders" then took off with "The Illusionists" and became the emcee of that show. He's also been the featured entertainer for many Fortune 500 companies. His television appearances include HBO, Showtime's Comedy Club Network, Fox's Masters of Illusion, NBC's World's Greatest Magic as well as the star of Thames Television's Magic Comedy Strip, a 16 week television series in England. Overall, he has more than 20,000 live performances under his belt, including two seasons on Broadway and 14 years on the Las Vegas strip.

And Jeff has an entrepreneurial side, being the owner/operator of "Marvyn's Magic Theater" in La Quinta, which is close to Palm Springs. There he brings in top magic talent weekly and plays the role of host and emcee. Several Ring 76 members have gone there to enjoy first class magic and comedy and have always come back a fan of Jeff Hobson. It is our good fortune to have him come to us!






Shavings from the Board



Welcome to Ex Libris, my monthly newsletter article about the IBM Ring 76 Library in San Diego, CA.

'Ex Libris' (Eh-cks LEE-breese), means 'From the Book'. Generally, you will see this term used on bookplates to denote that it came from the library of its owner. For example: "Ex Libris: Gary Salisbury."

This is where we talk about your library as well as do book and video reviews. Yes, your library! If you are a Ring 76 member in good standing, then this is your library! So be sure to stay in good standing by paying your dues on time.

Someone recently asked me, "What is the Ring 76 Library?" I responded, "It is currently over 1,000 volumes of magic books and over 2,000 magic magazines, all available for check-out. It is over 1,500 magic instruction videos, over 500 magic performance videos, and over 150 magic related audiobooks, all available for streaming from the Ring 76 Magic Media Server. It is also a museum for a collection of historic Ring 76 memorabilia from one of our founders, Honest Sid Gerhart. It is a magical learning source unparalleled in the entire IBM organization and it is funded totally from donations and fund-raising efforts that I have engage in for you."

The library purchased a new book from Viking Magic entitled, *Magic with Electronics by Julio Caso*. It will be available for check out.


Ring 76 Magic Media Server-----ON GOING


I have been hard at work on developing new sections of magical information and entertainment for the Ring 76 Magic Media

AUDIOBOOK REVIEWS



I Lie for Money

by Steve Spill

In this funny, irreverent, unique, eccentric memoir, magician Steve Spill reveals how he managed to survive decades inside a rarely profitable, sometimes maddening, but often deliciously rewarding offbeat showbiz profession - magic!

Spill tells of how his tailor grandfather sewed secret pockets in a magician's tuxedo back in 1910, which started his childhood dream to become a magician. This dream took Spill on a journey that started with him performing as a young boy at a "beauty on a budget" neighborhood house party to engagements in Europe, Africa, and the Caribbean, to today in Santa Monica, California, where he's been starring in his own shows since 1998 at Magicopolis, the theater he designed and built himself.

Being a magician has given Spill the opportunity to interact with the world's most famous and fascinating people. In his memoir Spill reveals the many unique encounters that his profession has led him to enjoy and endure: hosting Sting as his opening act one night, spending two days on camera with Joan Rivers, and selling tricks to Bob Dylan, as well as encounters with Adam Sandler, Stephen King, and other celebrities.

I Lie for Money is a literary magic show that captures the highs and lows of an extraordinary life that will delight and amaze you with wit and wickedness. This book should be an obligatory listen for anyone considering a creative career, and it serves as an inspiration to those who desire to craft an independent life.

A PERSONAL NOTE (repeat from last month)

Four short years ago, I was asked if I would like to be the club's librarian. I thought about it long and hard before replying. I first asked what the current state the club's library was in and found it was in 8-9 delipidated, insect and rodent infested, cardboard boxes that were stored in someone's open garage. I then asked what the club needed. It needed a complete overhaul! How could I get it from point A to point B? How could I make this library the "Best in Class?"

I had a vision of making it the best magic reference library in the IBM organization and to bring it into the 21st century with new technology – streaming! I stipulated that I would accept the position if I could run it like it, was my own business. I laid out my vision before the board of directors, which they accepted, and then, and only then, did I accept the position as your librarian.

I requested a commitment from the board for regular funding but that was refused so I set out to raise the needed funds on my own. I did so through donations, monthly opportunity drawings, as well as sales of books, videos, and magic props that were donated to the library. To date, I have raised over \$5,100 for the library. Early on, I secured the largest donation ever made to the ring with a collection of magic videos valued at over \$12,000 from Dr. X, an anonymous friend of the library. There have also been several other large donations of books, videos, and props valued from \$1,000 to \$5,000 from throughout the United States. I have even willed my personal magic library of over 300 volumes (valued at over \$15,000) to the Ring 76 library.

We currently have over 1,000 magic books, over 1,500 magic instructional videos, over 500 magic performance videos, over 150 magic oriented audiobooks, and over 2,000 magic magazines. We have one of the first audio/video streaming libraries with the *Ring 76 Magic Media Server*. The Ring 76 library is now one of the largest, if not the largest, ring libraries.

We have accomplished a lot and have so much more to do but let's face facts. I am 77 years old and do not know how much longer I have left so I need to do the prudent thing and start grooming the next librarian. We need someone who can be as passionate about this project as I am. Someone who is willing to give their time, energy, and space for the library. Someone who is willing to make themselves available for the membership 7x24.

LIBRARY CHECK OUT PROCEDURE

Members may contact me 7x24 either by e-mail at librarian@ring76.com or by cell phone (voice or text) at 619-569-6035 to let me know what you would like to check out. (If you do not hear back from me within 24 hours, there may have been a technical problem so call me.) I will make sure the item(s) get to the next monthly meeting or you can pick it up at my home in Blossom Valley.

There is a limit of 4 items per month. You will need to sign the library card attached to the item along with your phone number. We ask that you return the items to the library on or before the monthly meeting for the following month (for example: If you check out a book at the July meeting, it should be returned on or before the August meeting). If need be, you can keep the book or video again if nobody else has requested it but you must sign for it again.

Our objective is to build the best magic reference library in the entire IBM organization world-wide but we need your help to do that. Please return over-due books & videos and donate regularly to your library. The library is here so YOU can learn how to perform magic. Use it!

Non-urgent communications will always be done via my Ex Libris newsletter article while more urgent communications will be done by a Ring 76 Librarygram emailed to:


CREDES QUOD HABES, ET HABES
