Coins, Currency, and Jewelry were the Specials of the Day at the August Ring Meeting

August 17th was the first meeting of the new calendar year for Ring 76. Our church venue was unavailable for our normal meeting day on Monday the 14th so the meeting was moved to Thursday the 17th and fortunately, a good number of members and guests could still attend. Josh Sherwin, our new Ring 76 president, called the meeting to order with 40 people: 28 members and 12 guests.

To begin the meeting "Magic Mike" Stilwell was called up to the stage for a special presentation. Magic Live had just concluded

in Las Vegas and he had to drop out at the last minute due to family business. Ring members Michael Johnson and Julia Simms graciously mailed a box to him that was to be opened only at this meeting. It contained a good




helping of swag from the magic convention including a "puzzle box," printed material, and a good number of special playing cards. "Magic Mike" gratefully thanked all who thought of him in the San Diego magic community.

After the basic business of the Ring was attended to, **President Sherwin** turned the meeting over to V.P. of Entertainment, "Magic Mike" Stilwell, who introduced Max Long, a new



member, who presented a teachin. All the members were told to bring a dollar bill and Max, after an entertaining magic routine featuring a dollar bill, taught the Ring, with great patience, how to make an origami Dollar Ring that was invented in the 1960s. As

elemental as this might sound, it took the better part of an hour for all the attendees to coordinate their folding effort. In the end, there were various rings and we were all that much richer for the experience.



Magic." "Magic Mike" introduced our nine entertainers with the first one being "Ms. Charley" Miller, who led off with a version of "Short Change." This was a word problem that dates back at

least to the 1930s, and the concept is older still. It involves \$30 divided between three people but constantly comes up one dollar short. What happened to the last dollar? "Ms. Charley" talked about reality vs. imagination and produced the prediction of the volunteer. They came back to reality and the volunteer counted the bills and they miraculously added up to \$30.





The second performer was **Ron Zimmer**, a visitor from Florida, He did a wallet routine, followed by a rope routine.

Max Long, who earlier showed infinite patience teaching us to make monetary jewelry, was the next entertainer. He took out a dollar bill and explained the special security devices to avoid counterfeiting. Max took out a green silk and put it back into George Washington's nose with tweezers.







The fourth entertainer was Mark Booth who did a "Zupan Magic Money Machine" that was built by BS Industries. He began by taking out a wooden chest and assembling a money machine. Putting in a crank, he transformed pieces of paper into currency from different countries. This would have been the basic "Adam's Magic Money Maker" but Mark's routine went far

beyond the original presentation and was an entertaining show unto itself.

To everyone's pleasant surprise, the next performer was **James Thayer,** who does an excellent job managing the membership information and maintaining the Ring website but is seldom seen in front of the audience. He amazed all with an Origami bill routine.





The sixth entertainer was "Mr. Funtastic" who decided to take a magic trick he had performed previously and elevate it with the addition of music. It was a coin effect with disappearing and appearing coins.

Misha Osinovskiy was the seventh performer, whose coins appeared and rolled across his hands and then disappeared. It was an excellent display of coin manipulation, an all-but-lost art these days.



Following Misha was **Michael Callahan** who darted around the room filling the air with the "Illusion Spray" from a can. Then he displayed a Walking Liberty 50-cent piece, openly transferred it to his shirt pocket and it magically passed through to his closed hand. Of course, it was all under the influence of the "Illusion Spray." For

Michael's finale, he told the story about his cat waking him up in the morning and inserting a playing card into his wallet. He asked a spectator to name a card, opened his wallet, and showed the card matched the one called out by the spectator. Michael awarded her two dollars and provided the anecdote of M and M's to come out of the spell.


New Logo Design Sought

Shavings from the Board

The Ring 76 Board of Directors meets via Zoom the fourth Monday of every month, except in December, when there's no meeting. The purpose of the Board is to manage the business of Ring 76 and input from the membership is always welcome. Any member in good standing is welcome to drop in.



Many Board members logged on early to discuss the recent Magic Live convention in Las Vegas and to swap stories and show the treasures they acquired. The meeting officially began at 7:00 p.m. and, as President **Sherwin** was to be late, it was helmed by V.P. of Entertainment "**Magic Mike**" **Stilwell.**

Sgt. at arms Mark Booth gave us the attendance of the general meeting: 40 people, including 28 members and 12 guests. This was an impressive sum given that the meeting this month was on a Thursday and not the usual second Monday of the month. Librarian Gary Salisbury told us that the library has the machine to convert VHS tapes to digital formats better suited to modern viewing. The Plex server has an impressive amount of this digital material and can be used by members only (See library report, page 5). V.P. of Entertainment "Magic Mike" Stilwell announced the meetings through December and suggested possible future lecturers and the entertainment for the December Holiday Pot-luck, one of the most popular meetings of the year. The Board also settled on the price for Swap Meet tables for the September meeting (see page 1). Ring Treasurer Miguel Garcia reported that the treasury for the Ring was healthy and that dues had been paid promptly. V.P. of Membership **James Thayer** confirmed this, saying we have 76 active members, with only a few still unpaid.

With that, the New Business was addressed.

Misha floated the idea of having representation at the various arts and cultural events San Diego is noted for. This would be a way for the Ring to make its presence known outside the magic community.

The Board agreed to continue to have the business part of general meetings kept to a minimum and conducted at Board meetings instead. This leaves more time for actual magic at the meetings. The Board will also be looking at having additional magic get-togethers for casual performing and teach-ins besides the regular meeting nights.

Gary Salisbury suggested that the Ring may benefit by offering swag in the form of shirts and pullovers as well as updating the Ring logo for things like playing cards. It was agreed to bring this to the membership and get their input on the proposal. (See article, this page.) The member who comes up with a winning design will get a \$50 gift card.

The meeting ended at 8:24 p.m.

Ex Libris

Welcome to Ex Libris, my monthly newsletter article about the IBM Ring 76 Library in San Diego.

'Ex Libris' (Eh-cks LEE-breese), means 'From the Book.' Generally, you will see this term used on bookplates to denote that it came from the library of its owner. For example: "Ex Libris: Gary Salisbury."

This is where we talk about your library as well as do book and video reviews. Yes, your library! If you are a Ring 76 member in good standing, then this is your library! So be sure to stay in good standing by paying your dues on time.

Someone recently asked me, "What is the Ring 76 Library?" I responded, "It is currently over 1,000 volumes of magic books and over 2,000 magic magazines, all available for check-out. It is 178 magic audiobooks, 2,169 magic instruction videos, 22 full length magic movies, 4 albums of magic music (some royalty free), 1,769 magic performance videos (many classics), 11 podcasts (that we co-host), 12 magic TV series, a photo warehouse (where we will save all our Ring 76 activity photos) and all this is available for streaming from the Ring 76 Magic Media Server. It is also a museum for a collection of historic Ring 76 memorabilia from one of our founders, Honest Sid Gerhart. It is a magical learning source unparalleled in the entire IBM organization and it is funded totally from donations and fund raising efforts that I have engaged in for you."

The library purchased a new hard-back book at Magic Live! called "You Are All Terrible, aka Tarbell #9" by Harrison Greenbaum. It is available for check out.


Ring 76 Magic Media Server-----ON GOING

There is a ton of work to do and I am progressing slowly. When it is done, I will need to go back through our entire video collection to make sure all videos have been digitized, are on the server, and inventoried. This is a huge job!





Members may contact me 7x24 either by e-mail at librarian@ring76.com or by cell phone (voice or text) at 619-569-6035 to let me know what you would like to check out. (If you do not hear back from me within 24 hours, there may have been a technical problem so call me.) I will make sure the item(s) get to the next monthly meeting or you can pick them up at my home in Blossom Valley.

There is a limit of four items per month. You will need to sign the library card attached to the item along with your phone number. We ask that you return the items to the library on or before the monthly meeting for the following month (for example: If you check out a book at the July meeting, it should be returned on or before the August meeting).
