It turned out not to be an issue since other members raised their hands to show they wanted to throw their hats into the ring. Mark then showed us a big-screen TV which long-time San Diego magician



Following the performer's instructions and some simple math, the magician is always able to tell what card the spectator simply thought of. Jeff was good enough to share the workings of this effect so we can now all do it too. Thanks, Jeff!

Our last performer was **Terry Lunceford**, who showed us a terrific presentation with a beautiful multiplying bottle prop. A bottle and glass, under two cylindrical covers, repeatedly switched places in increasingly baffling ways. Then the bottles started multiplying and the kicker ending was the production of a glass filled with liquid. Terry graciously let everyone examine everything after the meeting, giving us an appreciation of this finely made apparatus from Japan.

Following all the performances, **Mark Booth** made good use of the new big-screen TV in the front of the room to demonstrate the Plex server. Our librarian, **Gary Salisbury**, has been outdoing himself the last several years in crafting together one of the, if not the best-stocked library of any IBM Ring in the world. In addition to hundreds of physical books, it contains hundreds of magic videos which are accessible online, using the Plex server. Mark showed us how easy it is to use, from the comfort of your own home. Big thanks to **Gary, Mark**, and **David Chiu** for their countless hours in doing a phenomenal job collecting, converting, and performing other tasks involved with bringing videos into the library to serve our members.



Welcome to Ex Libris, my monthly newsletter article about the IBM Ring 76 Library in San Diego, CA.

'Ex Libris' (Eh-cks LEE-breese), means 'From the Book'. Generally, you will see this term used on bookplates to denote that it came from the library of its owner. For example: "Ex Libris: Garv Salisburv."

This is where we talk about your library as well as do book and video reviews. Yes, your library! If you are a Ring 76 member in good standing, then this is your library! So be sure to stay in good standing by paying your dues on time.

Someone recently asked me, "What is the Ring 76 Library?" I responded, "It is currently over 1,000 volumes of magic books and over 2,000 magic magazines, all available for check-out. It is 210 magic audiobooks, 2,085 magic instruction videos, 28 full length magic movies, 8 albums of magic music (some royalty free), 1,768 magic performance videos (many classics), 10 podcasts (that we co-host), 20 magic TV series, a photo warehouse (where we will save all our Ring 76 activity photos) and all this is available for streaming from the Ring 76 Magic Media Server. It is also a museum for a collection of historic Ring 76 memorabilia from one of our founders, Honest Sid Gerhart. It is a magical learning source unparalleled in the entire IBM organization and it is funded totally from donations and fund -raising efforts that I have engage in for you."

Funding & Expenditures-----ON GOING





### MAGIC AUDIOBOOK REVIEWS



#### Mrs. Houdini

By Victoria Kelly

A captivating debut novel, meticulously researched and beautifully imagined, about the passionate marriage of Harry and Bess Houdini—a love story that defied death itself.

Before escape artist Harry Houdini died, he vowed he would find a way to speak to his beloved wife Bess from beyond the grave using a coded message known only to the two of them. When a widowed Bess begins seeing this code in seemingly impossible places, it becomes clear that Harry has an urgent message to convey. Unlocking the puzzle will set Bess on a course back through the pair's extraordinary romance, which swept the illusionist and his bride from the beaches of Coney Island, to the palaces of Budapest, to the back lots of Hollywood. When the mystery finally leads Bess to the doorstep of a mysterious young photographer, she realizes that her husband's magic may have been more than just illusion.

In surprising turns that weave through the uncertain days of the dawn of the twentieth century and continue into the dazzling 1920s, Mrs. Houdini is a thrilling tale that will take you deep into the heart of one of history's greatest love stories—asking what drives people to believe in something bigger than themselves—even as it reveals the famous magician's most remarkable feat of all.



### The Witch of Lime Street

by David Jaher

History comes alive in this textured account of the rivalry between Harry Houdini and the so-called Witch of Lime Street, whose iconic lives intersected at a

time when science was on the verge of embracing the paranormal.

The 1920s are famous as the golden age of jazz and glamour, but it was also an era of fevered yearning for communion with the spirit world, after the loss of tens of millions in the First World War and the Spanish-flu epidemic. A desperate search for reunion with dead loved ones precipitated a tidal wave of self-proclaimed psychics—and, as reputable media sought stories on occult phenomena, mediums became celebrities.

Against this backdrop, in 1924, the pretty wife of a distinguished Boston surgeon came to embody the raging national debate over Spiritualism, a movement devoted to communication with the dead. Reporters dubbed her the blonde Witch of Lime Street, but she was known to her followers simply as Margery. Her most vocal advocate was none other than Sherlock Holmes' creator Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, who believed so thoroughly in Margery's powers that he urged her to enter a controversial contest, sponsored by Scientific American and offering a large cash prize to the first medium declared authentic by its impressive five-man investigative Admired for both her exceptional charm and her committee. dazzling effects, Margery was the best hope for the psychic practice to be empirically verified. Her supernatural gifts beguiled four of the judges. There was only one left to convince...the acclaimed escape artist, Harry Houdini.

David Jaher's extraordinary debut culminates in the showdown between Houdini, a relentless unmasker of charlatans, and Margery, the nation's most credible spirit medium. *The Witch of Lime Street*, the first book to capture their electric public rivalry and the competition that brought them into each other's orbit, returns us to an oft-mythologized era to deepen our understanding of its history, all while igniting our imagination and engaging with the timeless question: Is there life after death?



Mr. Sebastian & the Negro Magician

From the author of Big Fish comes this haunting, tender story that weaves a tragic secret, a mysterious meeting with the Devil, and

a family of charming circus freaks recounting the extraordinary adventures of their friend Henry Walker, the Negro Magician.

In the middle of a dusty Southern town, in the middle of the twentieth century, magician Henry Walker entertains crowds at Jeremiah Musgrove's Chinese Circus. Though not the world-famous illusionist he once was, Henry, with his dark skin and green eyes, is still something of a novelty to the patrons who pay a dime to see his show. Most of the patrons, anyway.

As the novel begins, one May night in 1954, Henry is confronted by three menacing white teens, and soon thereafter disappears. With his fate uncertain, his friends from the circus—Jenny the Ossified Girl, Rudy the Strong Man, and JJ the Barker—piece together what they know of Henry's mysterious and extraordinary life. The result is a spellbinding adventure that begins when ten-year-old Henry meets the devil, who gives him the art of magic and then steals the one thing that means the most to him. As Henry's friends recount the remarkable adventures and incredible heartache that result from this childhood encounter, only one thing seems certain about Henry's life: nothing is as it appears.






# Thank you to This Month's Photographers
