Welcome to Ex Libris, my monthly newsletter article about the IBM Ring 76 Library in San Diego, CA.

'Ex Libris' (Eh-cks LEE-breese), means 'From the Book'. Generally, you will see this term used on bookplates to denote that it came from the library of its owner. For example: "Ex Libris: Gary Salisbury."

This is where we talk about your library as well as do book and video reviews. Yes, your library! If you are a Ring 76 member in good standing, then this is your library! So be sure to stay in good standing by paying your dues on time.

Someone recently asked me, "What is the Ring 76 Library?" I responded, "It is currently over 1,000 volumes of magic books and magic magazines, all available for check-out. It is 227 magic audiobooks, 1,500 magic instruction videos, 75 full length magic movies, 8 albums of magic music (some royalty free), 1,600 magic performance videos (many classics), 10 podcasts (that we co-host), 22 magic TV series, a photo warehouse (where we will save all our Ring 76 activity photos) and all this is available for streaming from the Ring 76 Magic Media Server. It is also a museum for a collection of historic Ring 76 memorabilia from one of our founders, Honest Sid Gerhart. It is a magical learning source unparalleled in the entire IBM organization and it is funded totally from donations and fund-raising efforts that I have engage in for your behalf."



MAGIC MOVIE REVIEWS

David Blaine: Decade of Magic (2002)

Runtime: 2:12



David Blaine revolutionized magic with his groundbreaking television special Street Magic. He then took his craft to the next level, creating a unique genre of endurance art that defies what is possible by pushing his body and mind to the limit.

For the first time on DVD, this two-disc collection contains three of the most death-

defying stunts ever performed in front of a live audience. Each special also features footage of jaw-dropping street magic that first made Blaine a worldwide sensation. From transforming dollar bills to hundreds in New Orleans' impoverished Ninth Ward, to blowing the minds of the likes of Kobe Bryant and Yao Ming in the NBA All-Star locker rooms, this is David Blaine at his most creative, disruptive, and spectacular.

More than 60 minutes of magic and stunts never seen before including: My First Blackout, Extreme Breath Holding Training, Ted Talk, Soweto, Swimming with Great White Sharks, 44 Days No Food, Only Water, Submerged.

Death Defying Acts (2008)

Runtime: 1:37



Death Defying Acts would more aptly be titled Houdini's Whirlwind Romance as it focuses less on the famed magician's skills and more on what kind of secret lovers he may have had. In this historical drama, ravishing conartists, Mary McGarvie (Catherine Zeta-Jones), and daughter, Benji (Saoirse Ronan), play two sharp girls ready to take Houdini (Guy Pearce)

for a ride.

Set in 1920s Scotland, the plot centers on a contest Houdini hosts in Edinburgh to find a psychic medium who can channel his deceased mother. Mary, tired of pick-pocketing to stage fake magic shows, desperately wants Houdini's \$10,000 cash prize and auditions successfully for the role of (real) medium. From there, passions flare up as they negotiate how much of their magic is sheer trickery.

Director Gillian Armstrong's (Little Women) rendition of Houdini's life depicts him as a regular joe struggling to convince his pragmatic business manager, Sugarman (Timothy Spall), that magic and science are connected. Scenes in which Houdini trains for and then tests his boundaries and skills during famous theater acts are highly entertaining and well re-created. Scenes in which McGarvie and her daughter read characters for clues to rig their paranormal hoaxes are equally well-done and Zeta-Jones is gorgeous as a spiritualist. But when Mary and Houdini collide, their definitions of magic turn to mush through Hollywood translation, as something semi-equivocal to faith in love. This unfortunate injection of melodrama in an otherwise smart film cancels out its better parts.

Do Houdini fans really want to see him, on screen, grappling with CG angels as he floats, straitjacketed, in his sealed water tank? I doubt it. Still, Death Defying Acts stars Houdini, which automatically makes for some fun. -Trinie Dalton

Harry Potter Collection Blu-ray (2001-2011)

Runtime: varies by movie



1. Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone: The magical adventure begins when Harry Potter is to attend Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry.

2. Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets: Cars fly, trees attack and a mysterious house-elf warns Harry of great danger as he returns for his second vear.

3. Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban:

Harry must confront soul-sucking Dementors, outsmart a werewolf and learn the truth about the escaped prisoner of Azkaban - Sirius Black.

4. Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire:

Harry must overcome a deadly dragon, fierce water demons and an enchanted maze only to find himself in the cruel grasp of He Who Must Not Be Named.

5. Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix:

When few believe that Lord Voldemort has returned, Harry must secretly train his friends for the wizarding war ahead.

6. Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince:

As Lord Voldemort tightens his grip on both Muggle and wizarding worlds, Harry and Dumbledore work to find the key to unlock Voldemort's defenses.

7. Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows, Part 1:

Harry. Ron and Hermione set out to track down and destroy the secret to Voldemort's power - the Horcruxes. On their own and on the run, the three must rely on one another more than ever...but Dark Forces threaten to tear them apart.

8. Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows, Part 2:

In the epic finale, the battle between the good and evil forces of the wizarding world escalates into all-out war. The stakes have never been higher and no one is safe. But it is Harry who may be called upon to make the ultimate sacrifice as he draws closer to the climactic showdown with Lord Voldemort. It all ends here.

Harry Potter: A History of Magic (2017)

Celebrating the 20th anniversary of the first Harry Potter book, this documentary visits the real-life magical history behind J.K. Rowling's beloved classics. With footage from The British Library's exhibition in London, and exclusive access to a priceless collection of artifacts, experience the fascinating, real history of the magic at the heart of the Harry Potter stories.

Includes interviews with J.K. Rowling herself as she examines the most exciting items on display, and talks for the first time about her own personal drawings and drafts featured in the exhibition. And, as opening night arrives, famous fans marvel at this fascinating trove of delights, like Harry Potter seeing Diagon Alley for the first time.

Hocus Pocus (2013)

Runtime: 1:36

In Disney's Hocus Pocus, Academy Award nominee Bette Midler (Best Actress, 1991, For the Boys), stars with Sarah Jessica Parker (Sex and the City) and Kathy Najimy (The Wedding Planner) as three wild witches who return from seventeenth-century Salem for a night of zany fun and comic chaos. After

they're conjured up by unsuspecting pranksters, the tricky trio sets out to cast a spell on the town and reclaim their youth. But first they must outwit three feisty kids determined to foil their scheme! Filled with bewitching laughs and magic, this hilarious film is perfect for the whole family!

Producer David Kirschner came up with the idea for the movie one night while he and his young daughter were sitting outside and his neighbor's black cat strayed by. Kirschner began to unspool a narrative of how the cat was once a boy who was changed into a feline 300 years ago by three witches. Actress Kathy Najimy described her character Mary as "Eddie Haskell as a witch," referring to the character on the classic TV series "Leave It To Beaver." "She sucks up to Winifred [Bette Midler's character] every chance she gets. She wants to be part of the power club and Winifred's got the power. "To create the costumes, designer Mary Vogt read many historical books about Salem, Massachusetts. "I even read diaries of women who were hanged as witches," she says.

Houdini (1953) *Runtime: 1:45*

"People aren't going to stand in line to see me pull rabbits out of a hat." ~ Harry Houdini



Illusionist and stunt performer Harry Houdini (1874-1926) was born Erik Weisz in Budapest, Hungary and came to the United States in 1878 with his mother and four brothers. He excelled at athletics as a teen and began his magic career in 1891, becoming widely known as "The Handcuff King." He was renowned for his miraculous escape acts, managing to find his

way out of handcuffs, chains, straight jackets, prison cells, combination safes and even a casket while buried alive.

This film was the very first biopic of Houdini's life, based upon the 1928 book "Houdini, His Life Story" by Harold Kellock. The title role is played by Tony Curtis, with Janet Leigh as his wife, Bess. It begins with their first encounter at a carnival side show in Coney Island, New York and traces the magician's rise to fame in Europe and then America. The production also depicts some of his most dangerous stunts and his interest in the occult, which he hoped would yield his greatest achievement -- an escape from the spirit world after his own death.

Under George Marshall's direction, the film sacrifices historical accuracy for entertainment value. For example, the "Chinese

Water Torture Cell" became part of Houdini's act at the Circus Busch in Berlin in 1912, but in the film it is portrayed as his last great stunt. Nor did Houdini die in the way shown here. The reality was much more mundane ... an appendix that ruptured after a fan punched him in the abdomen. Still, it's an interesting film to watch and not half bad at all.

Hugo (2011)

In resourceful orphan Hugo Cabret (Asa Butterfield, an Oliver Twist-like charmer), Martin Scorsese finds the perfect vessel for his silver-screen passion: this is a movie about movies (fittingly, the 3-D effects are spectacular). After his clockmaker father (Jude



Law) perishes in a museum fire, Hugo goes to live with his Uncle Claude (Ray Winstone), a drunkard who maintains the clocks at a Paris train station. When Claude disappears, Hugo carries on his work and fends for himself by stealing food from area merchants. In his free time, he attempts to repair an automaton his father rescued from the museum, while trying to evade the station inspector (Sacha Baron Cohen), a World War I veteran with no sympathy for lawbreakers. When Georges (Ben

Kingsley), a toymaker, catches Hugo stealing parts for his mechanical man, he recruits him as an assistant to repay his debt. If Georges is guarded, his open-hearted ward, Isabelle (Chloë Moretz), introduces Hugo to a kindly bookseller (Christopher Lee), who directs them to a motion-picture museum, where they meet film scholar René (*Boardwalk Empire*'s Michael Stuhlbarg). In helping unlock the secret of the automaton, they learn about the roots of cinema, starting with the Lumière brothers, and give a forgotten movie pioneer his due, thus illustrating the importance of film preservation, a cause to which the director has dedicated his life. If Scorsese's adaptation of *The Invention of Hugo Cabret* isn't his most autobiographical work, it just may be his most personal. -- *Kathleen C. Fennessy*

Little Houdini (2016)

Runtime: 0:52

It's 1866 and twelve year old Harry has lived and breathed magic since his early childhood. The problem is that his hometown, Appletown, is not the best place for his natural talent to blossom.



Although he rehearses endlessly in his parent's barn he realizes that his dream is just that - a dream. One day Harry catches the glimpse of a chance when the mayor of New York announces a magic competition to celebrate the official opening of the Statue of Liberty. But there's a catch - to enter the competition one must be trained by a real magician and poor Harry doesn't know a single one. But then, Harry's father crosses path with the Great Tesla, a true

magician! Tesla promises to meet Harry and despite the young boy's lack of knowledge, Tesla sees talent, creativity, and boldness in Harry. He decides to give him a chance and invites him to his home to begin training. Accompanied by his niece, Beth, and his assistant, Amrold, Tesla will teach Harry the basics of magic and his tricks. He will also test him. Will Harry be strong enough to become a true magician?

Magic (1978) *Runtime: 1:46*

Magician's assistant Corky (Sir Anthony Hopkins) performs disastrously at his first solo appearance. He is given a ventriloquist dummy called "Fats" to improve his act, and within a few years, Corky is at the height of fame. However, Fats has developed a mind of his own,

and wants to control his master. Don't miss this classic tale of mystery.



Next (2017)
Runtime: 1:37

Blessed, or cursed, with the ability to see events minutes before they occur, Cris Johnson (Nicolas Cage) earns a living as a *magician* in Las Vegas and keeps a low profile under an alias. When terrorists threaten to detonate a nuclear weapon in Los Angeles, government

agent Callie Ferris (Julianne Moore) goes on the hunt for Cris and hopes to convince him to help her stop the coming apocalypse.



Now You See Me 1 (2013) *Runtime: 1:55*

Cinematic sleight of hand and digital prestidigitation drive *Now You See Me*, a slick popcorn movie about four magicians coming together to pull off a heist and maybe right a wrong at the same time. Jesse Eisenberg, Isla Fisher, Woody Harrelson, and Dave Franco

play the Four Horsemen, who each have their individual skills (Harrelson is a master hypnotist, for example) but have combined to put on an amazing show in Vegas--a show that culminates in robbing a French bank. The authorities don't know how they did it, but an FBI agent (Mark Ruffalo) and an Interpol agent (Mélanie Laurent, Inglourious Basterds) start tracking the Four Horsemen as they prepare a second performance in New Orleans. A professional skeptic (Morgan Freeman), however, suggests that these performances are only the preamble to a much bigger trick, and that maybe the Four Horsemen themselves are misdirection. The excellent cast (which also includes Michael Caine) and the unrelenting pace give Now You See Me the illusion of sense and coherence, and the movie can be fun if you surrender to it. Don't think too hard about the illusions themselves; the real fun of magic is not being able to figure out how it's done, whereas we know exactly how the "magic" in Now You See Me works: editing and CGI special effects. Even the few tricks that are supposedly explained fall apart with a moment's thought--they wouldn't actually work. The most compelling element of the movie is the developing romance between Ruffalo and Laurent, two charming actors who know how to let emotion simmer under the surface.



However, whilst performing in a village pub off the west coast of Scotland, he encounters Alice, an innocent young girl, who will change his life forever. A delightful film for the entire family.

It is with great sadness and heavy hearts we announce the passing of our beloved husband and father, Paul. We know Paul had such a huge impact on so many people, and his larger than life personality will be missed by all who knew him.

Our family is very thankful for the many telephone calls, emails, donations,

flowers, cards, food, and visits that have helped us in celebrating the life of Paul. While these days have been difficult, we have been constantly amazed at how through the sharing of loving memories our hearts have been lifted and we are filled with gratitude for having shared a life

well lived.

We would love for you to share your stories and pictures of Paul from over the years in honor of his memory.

The world of magic has lost one of its most ardent supporters and a man who single-handedly elevated the business of conjuring to unprecedented heights. Paul Michael Gross, 68, died peacefully on November 29, 2023. He was the guiding force of Hocus-Pocus Magic in Fresno, California for most of his adult life. And at a time when brick and


