Close-Up but So Far Away New Camera and Monitor Improve Close-Up Contest

Ring 76 holds two official contests every year and in February the closeup artists got the spotlight. In front of 35 members and 22 guests, eight contestants captivated the crowd with a dazzling display of legerdemain and personality. This year was also the first time that a "camera and big screen" system was utilized so that everyone in the audience got a good seat.

The meeting was opened by President Josh Sherwin who welcomed guests and shared announcements of magical interest to the members. Jeff Pearson announced that *Gracie Morgan* was going to once again conduct lessons in card magic and encouraged members who are interested to contact her in El Cajon. Max Long asked for help locating Diana, the daughter of late Ring member George Edwards, since she had indicated some business with the Ring. Paul Dwork reminded us of the annual

charity event he organizes with performances from well-known magicians. This year's show will be Saturday, March 16th, at the Carlsbad Cultural Center. (see page 4)

With business concluded, President Sherwin turned the meeting over to our Vice President of

Entertainment, "Magic

Mike" Stilwell. He called upon Ring librarian Gary Salisbury to conduct the opportunity drawing and then auctioned off magic replicas of Walking Liberty half dollars with shells. Misha Osinovsky made the winning bid.

Then Mike reminded the audience and contestants of the rules for the night's competition. Each of the eight contestants would be allotted eight

minutes for their routines; exceeding that time limit would result in their disqualification. Members in good standing would vote on whom they thought was the best of the evening. Winners will be announced at the Installation Banquet in July. Mike thanked **Mark Booth** for orchestrating the camera and monitor system and **Michael Callahan**, the official timer for the event. With everyone and everything set, the contest was under way.

First up was **Mark Booth**, whose act consisted of three effects. The first was Erik Casey's

"Poker Test 2.0," where five blank cards became a royal flush and the color of the backs of the cards changed. This was followed by having helper **Miguel Garcia** mix four red and four black cards which Mark magically separated. Finally, Miguel was amazed to find that a card he had selected earlier had vanished from the deck,



only to turn up in a pouch he was holding the whole time.

They helped with his "what if" questions while he donned a floppy purple hat with an Alice in Wonderland calico cat wrapped around his neck. Ex Libris

Welcome to Ex Libris, my monthly newsletter article about the IBM Ring 76 Library in San Diego.

'Ex Libris' (Eh-cks LEE-breese), means 'From the Book'. Generally, you will see this term used on bookplates to denote that it came from the library of its owner. For example: "Ex Libris: Gary Salisbury."

This is where we talk about your library as well as do book and video reviews. Yes, your library! If you are a Ring 76 member in good standing, then this is your library! So be sure to stay in good standing by paying your dues on time.

Someone recently asked me, "What is the Ring 76 Library?" I responded, "It is currently over 1,000 volumes of magic books and magazines, all available for check-out. It is 229 magic audiobooks, 1,543 magic instruction videos, 75 full length magic movies, 8 albums of magic music (some royalty free), 1,582 magic performance videos (many classics), 10 podcasts (over 2,000 episodes we co-host), 23 magic TV series, a photo warehouse (where we will save all our Ring 76 activity photos) and all this is available for streaming from the Ring 76 Magic Media Server. It is also a museum for a collection of historic Ring 76 memorabilia from one of our founders, Honest Sid Gerhart. It is a magical learning source unparalleled in the entire IBM organization and it is funded totally from donations and fund raising efforts that I have engaged in for your behalf."

WHAT'S NEW AT YOUR LIBRARY?

Library Donations

We had donations of 6 books, 96 DVDs, 1 VHS tape and several props this month. The DVDs and VHS tape have been digitized and placed on the server for all members to stream.

I would like to give a big magical minh would to everyone who has donated to the library. We need your DVDs, VHS tapes, and

video downloads. They will be put on the *Ring 76 Magic Media Server* so you will still be able to watch them or check the physical media back out. Please help. Sharing is good! Sharing is fun!

Funding & Expenditures

We made \$52 from the 50/50 Drawing, \$48 from the Door Prize Drawing, and \$67.50 from Library Sales.

We purchased 6 DVDs (\$76.26) for the Magic Media Server leaving a balance of \$250.13 in the Library petty cash. The library needs to be fed in order to keep it alive so your donations would be greatly appreciated.


We have acquired six books and pamphlets on magic through member donations. Many thanks to those who donated from all of us.

Ring 76 Magic Media Server

We have finally purchased the 16 Terabyte RAID drive which will double our storage capacity plus give us a mirrored back-up. I have not installed it yet but it will be done as soon as there is time in my schedule. I am currently getting the database cleaned up and functioning well before I can migrate it over to the RAID drive. This is a time-consuming job and I have spent many nights up until 3AM working on it.

This month we purchased 6 magic DVDs and received 96 DVDs as a donation which have already been digitized and placed on the server for all members to stream.

This is the utilization report for the Ring 76 Magic Media Server over past 12 months. February, 2024 utilization was the second highest on record.

MAGIC VIDEO REVIEWS

Born to Perform Card Magic

When some people think of card tricks, they can't help but think about their Uncle Ralph who puts everyone asleep, while



promising to show "just one more." I'd be willing to bet they've never seen Oz Pearlman entertain an audience with a deck of cards. Oz knows it's all about entertainment, with amazing effects that look impossible, whether it's with cards or anything else. That's the reason he's had his own TV special and is in high demand as a corporate mentalist/

magician. And that's also the reason he's one of my favorite magicians.

When I came across a couple of card routines recently that I wanted to perform, but required some sleights I don't do, I decided to find someplace to learn them. That's when I came across Oz Pearlman's DVD, "Born to Perform Card Magic," in which he teaches all the most helpful sleights, including those I needed. It's advertised as "The most influential card DVD of the last decade. COMPLETELY UPDATED AND EXPANDED. Go from beginner to PRO with a deck of cards!" And lo and behold, this DVD delivers. Other people agree: It currently has 569


reviews on the Penguin Magic website, with an overwhelming majority of them five stars.

Oz starts with the simplest lesson: how to hold the cards in a mechanic's grip. He proceeds from there to show his detailed handling for tons of moves and routines with cards. I think his ambitious card tutorial is especially good because he shows a grab bag of sleights for this routine and card magicians can just select a subset of them for their own on the spot jazz performances. He includes tips that he's learned over the years which puts the viewer on a fast track to master them. He also performs many routines for a live audience using the sleights he's just taught, to show how to entertain with them. Little tips he sprinkles in are especially valuable since they add to the overall entertainment value.

This is a beefy DVD, almost four hours in length. Oz's intent is not for this to be a compendium on every card sleight, but rather a collection of his favorite card magic which he has used over the years to become the fantastic entertainer he is. So not all sleights are here. For example, I'm not sure if even the basic Elmsley Count is included. And I didn't see a list of the specific contents of the DVD in the advertising nor even on the DVD itself. Unfortunately, this makes it impossible for someone interested in a particular sleight to know for certain if this is the DVD for them. But if someone's goal is to go from zero to hero with a deck of cards, this DVD will fit the bill

The first item discussed was the camera system used at the last meeting's close-up contest. While everyone was generally satisfied, it was felt that we could do better. Because of the generous donation from Dan Thomas, it was felt the Ring had enough financial resources for Mark Booth to begin researching the best camera and screen system for our needs.

Mike Stilwell talked about the upcoming meetings with March being "strolling magic." Mike will be arranging the tables so people will be sitting and standing. There will be seven performers: Dale Law, Joe Mystic, Max Long, Ms. Charley, Barry Wallis, Michael Callahan, and Mark Booth. Each magician will entertain for one hour. The April meeting is the "You Fooled Us" contest. There will be two judges, Misha Osinovskiy and James Thayer and Josh Sherwin will be the master judge (arbiter). The judges will have three minutes to come up with their best idea of how the contestant accomplished their effect. The master judge will have the final determination if the contestant fooled the judges. The May meeting is the stand-up contest, June will be a lecture and the July meeting is the installation banquet and its entertainer will be announced later.

Board elections will be held in June and **Misha Osinovskiy** will be the chairman of the nominating committee. Members interested in joining the Board should speak with him.

V.P. of membership, **James Thayer**, reported that Ring 76 currently has 74 active members. This is an accomplishment the entire Ring should be proud of.

On June 2, 2024, the Silvergate Yacht Club will hold its annual Wheelchair Regatta. "Magic Mike" Stilwell will be arranging entertainment for the charity event and if you can commit to one of the two-hour time slots to perform strolling magic, please contact him.

The Board is looking for a manager for the installation banquet in July. This person will oversee the entire event and organize critical components including food, drinks, etc. Mark Booth has done a tremendous job in this role the past couple of years but has had to step down. Anyone interested or who wants more information please contact the Board.

MAGIC MOVIE REVIEWS

Milarepa: Magician, Murderer, Saint

Runtime: 1:30

"Milarepa: Magician, Murderer, Saint," a picturesque fable filmed in the mountains of northern India, shows us how most -- if not all -- roads to spiritual enlightenment are paved with suffering.

Set in the 11th century, this Tibetan film retells the story of Thopaga, an impoverished villager who would eventually became the enlightened Milarepa, one of Tibet's most revered saints. But his path to bliss followed a traumatic chapter marked with tragedy, injustice, vengeful sorcery and the destruction of his village.

When his affluent father dies, young Thopaga (Jamyang Lodro, who played a soccer-crazy monk in Khyentse Norbu's charming

1999 film "Phorpa," a.k.a. "The Cup"), along with his family, is forced to live with his scheming uncle and aunt. Instead of honoring the dying man's wishes to bequeath his money and house to Thopaga when he turns 21, the uncle refuses. Dispatched by his now-destitute mother, Thopaga learns the ways of black magic from a mystic. But he learns that retribution compounds, rather than solves, injustice.

First-time director Neten Chokling (who played the other soccer fan in "Phorpa") combines old-time lore with modest special effects to evoke this otherworldly story. But what really reaches us is the collective presence of the cast, most of them monks and other acting amateurs. They seem uniformly imbued with inherent grace and effortless spiritual bearing. And their smallest of gestures exude the kind of un-self-conscious gravitas that constitutes all fables.

Joint I.B.M. and S.A.M. Ethics Statement

The International Brotherhood of Magicians and the Society of American Magicians join in recommending that all magicians adhere to the following code of ethical conduct

- Oppose the willful exposure to the public of any principles of the Art of Magic or the method employed in any magic effect or illusion.
- Display ethical behavior in the presentation of magic to the public and in our conduct as magicians, including not interfering with or jeopardizing the performance of another magician, either through personal intervention or the unauthorized use of another's creation.
- Recognize and respect for rights of the creators, inventors, authors and owners of
 magic concepts, presentations, effect and literature, and their rights to have
 exclusive use of, or to grant permission for the use of by others of such creations.
- Discourage false and misleading statements in the advertising of effects and literature merchandise or actions pertaining to the magical arts.
- Discourage advertisement in magical publication for any magical apparatus, effect, literature of other materials for which the advertiser does not have commercial rights.
- Promote the humane treatment and care of livestock used in magical performances.

Each organization expects its members to adhere to the foregoing ethical principles and to educate non-members to the ed to adhere to these ethical precepts.
