This your, fourteen members of Ring Seventy Siz traveled north to perform and/or just enjoy a sumptuous Roast Turkey diamer, courtesy of our Ring-Minety Six hosts, at the GOLD STAR RESTAURANT in Whittier, California, After a magnificent feast with all the trimmings, Mil McHILANY, president of Ring Minety Six, gave a nice welcome and introduced Dick DALE. president of Ring Seventy Six and J. P. JACKSON, Secretary of Ring Seventy-Six, whe then presented Plaques to the Rine Minety Six members who had performed the previous year in San Diego - another nice thank-you tradition. Ring Seventy Six member, Jos MYSTIC, was introduced as the MC for the evening and proceeded to lead a very professional and powerful show for the rest of the evening.

Joe started the magic with a very ciever, three-time, bare hand silk color change (through the fist), and finished by putting them all tugether with a surprise Fire Blenda

Dan FRECES led off with classic magic which included a terch-te-case opener, dove production, bare-hand flower productions, a very nice double dove production from a scarf, and closed with an instantaneous Tan-Apart vanish and reproduction via a Hang Kong frame.

Hen RHLEY, the Ring Seventy Six lengest term active member, did a classic Die Bar routine using one of John DAHM's creations (the cadillac of die bexes), and an extremely funny Passe-PasseMultiplying Bettle routine.

Jessie JUDGE fellowed with a jumbe Spot card, his very funny chosen card-on-ferehead, and a tern tissue to paper hat which he presented to his cute little assistant.

Joe MYSTIC came back with an entertaining interfude called the BOO BOO Bor, and paved the way for old/new member, Jack MARKLEY, (as IBM Ring Seventy Sizer in 1971, and just reactivated in time to perform). Jack did his very original routine with GRANDMA'S THIMBLE as his magic wand to show us his three short ropes to one with vanishing knots, his multichanging Wands, and finished with a very funny PLUNGER CARD routine, using a Plumber's Helper to locate a chosen card.

Jee MTSTIC again, in true MC Style, with a beautiful CLIPPO reutine which proved again that NO magic effect is told OLD. It was great, and I can attest touthe fact that hymen leved it, (my guests)

Ex-10VE BOAT magicine, Jack EVANS, one of our newest members and president of The Magician's Guildof Southern California, stele the show and had us all in stitches with his delightfully "campy" bits and gags while deing a silk production into a QUAD BLENDO, a Mariching Cabe Bettle late streamer with a Merv TAYLOR Birdcage bicker (yeah, I noticed), then sewed down with a very serious Abscarding Ouece (a Milsoni Worth piece seidem seen), and desed with his "Alice Through The Looking Glass", a penetrating mirror mini-illusien. Very, very nice, and very profes-

Wayne ALBERT came on with the Housini Mail Eng Escape, normally a stage illusion, which he does so well close-up.

Joe MTSTIC came back with his very showy fire-enting act, a nice change-up, and then introduced Ring Seventy Six President Dick DALE and Julie with the closing act. Dick opened with a stylish bare-hand Flash dove production from candle flame, a second deve from a call of ribben, and passed them to Julie who placed them into a glass freat cage. Dick did his original Cut and Restored Aspe routine with several variations which led into the Prefessor's Mightmere Thes, slowing to a calm pace, he gestured toward the caged doves, and they visibly dimmed, faded, became transparent, and totally vanished! After a pause for some strong audience reactien, Dick came back in a lighter vein with his Professor Cheer's Comedy Reper routine. WHAT a close to a GREAT SHOW and as exceptioned evening! Announcements included the Aleger-Castle Swap Meet on October eighth, a plained "PHANTOM OF THE OPERA" package bus tour for the opening next June in Los Angeles sponsored by Paul and Sharen BARTON, and the news that a local production of "CATS" will feature member Loch CRANE as the magical "Mr. Mestaffilees".

AND THEN IT WAS BIRTHDAY PARTY break time and Donne STIL-WELL produced from nowhere, a stupendous, build-your-own, ice cream Sundae feast in honor of her husband's thirty-fifth, the same as our meeting date. WHAT A NEAT TRICK FROM A NEAT LADY! Our monthly raffle gave away over a dozen choice prizes from BUMPER & CO, and this time I

did get the very collectable, guest-type bottle prize - Champagne this time.

MISTERY BAG NITE started with a very precise explanation of the rules and regulations by Veep Mike STIL-WELL, none of which were followed when the action started. Over twenty three Mystery Bags were aligned on the front table and chosen by the designated valuateer performers who were off and running with five minutes to prepare to perform with whatever they found in the bag. Even the dramatic count-down to show-time failed to impede the mad scramble for answers. help in identification and cives for a suitable routine (or any routine). Comments like - "What in the hell is this?" were heard often, or "How do I do five minutes with a red thimble?" and "C'mon guys - I've never seen anything like this in my LIPE, and I own EVERYTHING." and, lastly, "HEY this isn't a prep; it's semebody's lunch!" It was hysterical, and the resulting show was a tremendous success! Felks who hadn't performed in ages got up, bit the bullet, and did some fantastic entertaining with no rehearmi, five minutes of preparation, and unknown props. 



Personality of the Month



Jim Riley, Julian's only five foot eighteen inch magician, is also Ring 76's longest tenured member. Not a very novel distinction, certainly, but a significant one in the history of this Ring. Jim is far from being our senior member. Chronologically speaking, he is somewhere in the middle. There are many younger, and older members. But there are few who have served the Ring more faithfully. He has been president at least twice, in his memory, not to mention the many other offices he has held. He has written this Newsletter for many of our past presidents; and, of course, contributed in a thousand ways to the health of this Ring.

He is not a Charter Member. There are only a few of those left, but he remembers the charter members, something few of us are able to do. Even more interestingly, he has maintained a rather complete file of back-copies of this newsletter. He has even agreed to compile some notes supporting a history of the Ring. Therein lies a future project for the staff of the news letter.

Jim has another distinction not many of us share. He was born right here in San Diego. The year was 1939, and the community was Mission Beach, where he continued to live through his school years. He was graduated from Mission Bay High School in the Class of 1957. When asked if he participated in any sports, he dryly replied, "...as few as possible."

When he was eight or nine he saw a pitchman demonstrating a Svengali deck at the Dei Mar Fair. The man was a clever magician and could, apparently, de anything with that deck. Immediately, the lad was hooked. Here was real magic that the man said Accould do - for a modest investment. Naturally he bought one.

At the time, Jim knew no magicians and progressed little beyond the Svengali. However, in the sixth grade in San Diego public schools there is camper program in which children attend Camp Cuyamaca. Jim was one of those campers, and there he met a counsellor who was also a magician, a man named Gordon Plummer. By the end of the session Gordon had agreed to teach Jim magic, and the beginning of a long association was begun. Gordon also lived in San Diego, and the lessons continued for a number of years.

Some time during that period, or perhaps a little later on, Jim lourned of the existence of Ring 76, and made a few tentative visits.

"I was extremely aervous at being around magicians," he says. "I was

doing little shows around, but I didn't consider myself qualified to perform before megicians, and I wasn't." Actually, he was in college before he felt ready to join the Ring.

"I think Art Hannum was president at the time of those first visits. And of course Sid Gerhart was around. He was the one who held the club together. It met at his home, and later he found other places for it to meet. He was a fine person for helping young people into magic - and generally getting magicinus together. I guess that's why the Ring was named after him."

Asked when he did his first show, he said, "I guess in the usual way family and friends. I guess the first real shows were at Camp Cavamaca. They would have, say, one hundred and fifty youngsters up there, and they would have a talent night. You only go one year as a camper, but then I started in the summer program. They have two programs: the school program that the children go to in the sixth grade, and the summer program. I worked in the summer program for years and, in fact, finally became director of it. As a consequence I would do a show a week during the Cammer."

Wenderful magic experience for a young boy.

After high school Jim attended San Diego State, graduating in 1961 with a teaching degree. During callege he worked at THE FUN SHOP, a magic and nevelty shop at Third and C.

"I liked seiling the magic," he says, "but Peg Harbin, the swaer, was always sheeing me out of the magic area to get me to the stuff that sold better. Temmy Wee, an eld-time San Diego magician, was actually the original owner of the business."

In 1961 Jim began his teaching career at the Jones Elementary School in Serra Mesa. He remained there thirteen years. It was there that he erganized the Jenes Magic Club, a club that became known all ever the county for presenting illusion shows. He had a student teacher who was an excellent craftsman and built most of the illusions. The children were paid for the shows they did, and many came back from the higher grades and even high school to participate. "The hids came out of the walls when money was concerned," Jim mys. "We did the Spirit Cabinet, the Dagger Baz, a Sassay Production Boz, even sewed a weman in half."

Jim is now teaching a special Pifth and Sixth Grade class at Hawtherne Elementary in Clairment. His class is composed of eighteen exceptionally gifted youngsters who come from all over the county. The class is restricted to that number so that each may receive the special attention he or she requires. Parents vie for places for their children and there is a waiting list. The children are very advanced and, in effect. Jim is teaching seventh and eighth material. For some, who can hendle it, he teaches first year Algebra.

"Teaching is my life," he says simply - and elequently. It is easy to see that, with such a commitment and eighteen knowledge hungry youngsters to greet him every merning, even magic must take second place.

He has erganized a magic club at Hawtherne, but the circumstances are different than at Jones. Pew of his students walk to school, and transportation is a problem after school. He has students from as far away as Poway, La Jella, El Cajen and Mission Beach so most can't participate in after school activities.

One of his former students has two patents for inventions of biomedical apparatus. Another, who is going to Yale this year, won the Young Playwrights Award twice this past year.

"She came back to talk to my students. She had video tapes of a play of hers that was produced, which she shewed to the class. Then she talked to them about acting - and about how life develops as opposed to art - how you present life as art - and how you have to saip things out and rearrange to produce a work of art."

Almost makes you wish you were young again - and brilliant - se you could be in that class.
