November was our first annual ever SWAP MEET, and proved successful enough to make it a continuing event. Forty two members and eleven guests were present for a busy night of swapping. Sellers included J.P.JACK-SON, with treasures from his collection; Brad BURT, with great discounts from his Magic Shop; "SKIPPER FRANK" HERMAN, with some good bargains from his shop in Oceanside: Jack MARKLY, with assorted goodies, including some cute, magic, magnetic "Fridge Door" stick-up pins; Dick BUSH, Jan EASTMAN and Bob INGALLS; all with some good used props.

Formal meeting started with a short business session which reminded all of our annual XMAS Dinner/Meeting on the ninteenth (a full catered affair), and the Xmas show for the American Legion folks on the twenty third. Brief plans for a paid lecturer in the spring were discussed, and some ideas for TV publicity were noted for future Board action --- and then it was "BACK-WARD TRICK'hight. Eight performers came forward with hilarious versions of standard tricks done in reverse, and the results were great. Joe MYSTIC led off with his back to the audience doing a very nice paper tear, which no one could see; then turned around with the resulting Santa Hat, and proceeded to turn it into two pieces of tissue.

Brad BURT came up dragging about fifty feet of paper coil, stuffed it all in his mouth with some extremely unintelligible patter, chewed it all up, and produced a neatly rolled mouth coil. Jack EVANS bounced on waving a thirty six inch silk (Rice, no less) and a bunch of feather flowers - vanished the silk, and exited stuffing the flowers up his sleeve. His standard opening in

BOARD MEETING

only - the lot in front of the meeting room is totally reserved for tenants of the Health Facility. (See map inset.)





Personality of the Month

Although I have been acquainted with Mike Stilwell for about eight years I had never really gotten to know him. In fact, I felt there was a brittle, aloof quality about him that kept me at a distance. I was mistaken.

Perhaps it was the wild look in his eyes; or perhaps it was the years he spent as a magic bartender, handling drunken customers, that made him seem slightly sardonic. As I sald, whatever I thought it was, I was wrong.

In extended conversation Mike comes through as a warm, compassionate man who loves children, his wife, and magic - not necessarily in that order. His entire life is devoted to magic, not to mention his entire livelihood. He is fond of saying, "I'm one of the fortunate few who does not work to live but, rather, lives to do the work he loves."

Mike was born and spent most of his youth in the sleepy colonial town of Annapolis, Maryland. Like most of the rest of us, his love for magic developed young. A magician came to his home to entertain at his ninth birthday party. Naturally the magician didn't show him how the tricks were done, so Mike set out to

learn for himself. At the public library he found a book titled "Cyclopedia Of Magic" by Henry Hay. This book became his bible. To this day he keeps a well-thumbed copy in his office with the word BIBLE written on it in large block letters.

Unfortunately, he knew no one in Annapolis who could guide him in his magical studies. The nearest magic shop was in Washington, D.C. As a result, for many years there were some strange blind spots in Mike's magical knowledge. One incident particularly illustrates this.

On his twelfth birthday his father gave him twenty dollars to spend in any way he wished. The boy had his heart set on the Chinese Linking Rings. He and his father went to AL'S MAGIC SHOP in Washington where they found that a set of rings cost nineteen dollars. Then Al Cohen, the proprietor, offered them a bargain. He had a box of used magic which contained at least twenty tricks, including a smaller set of rings, plus a hollow egg, an egg bag, a change bag and, in Mike's own words, "a bunch of ends of thumbs, some metal, some rubber, one with a wick at the end, one with a bit of lead, one with a little scrap

of cloth stuck by one corner inside of it. I had no idea what any of this stuff was for, but I was sure it was a great value since all he was asking was twenty dollars for the lot. I went for it."

At about this time the magician who had entertained at his ninth birthday gave his father a tuxedo he had had as a boy. This was a magic tuxedo. It had all the secret pockets in the sleeves, in the lapels, in the tails of the jacket - all overt Of course. Mike didn't know how to use them, but it was nice to have them incidently. the magician's name was William Smith Jr. and he worked under the name of MR. MAGAC Mike would like to thank him for introducing him to our art, but has lost all touch with him; so if anyone knows anything about Smith, Mike would love to hear it. Also, at about this time. Mike gave his first show for profit. He sold tickets and presented it in his basement. The program included the MILK PIT-CHER. FOO CAN CHINESE STICKS, CUT & RESTORED ROPE and a zomble called the MRACLE BALL Four years later he finally got to visit a magic club in D.C. and some one did the lit cigarette into the handkerchief; so badly, that he flashed the thumb tip. When Mike got home he examined his tips and, sure enough, one of them had burnt cigarette ash in it. His embarassment was acute. Ah, innocencel

After graduating from high school, where he played defensive end on the football team and center on the basketball team, Mike came to San Diego. The plan was to go from a small town to a big city and be discovered as a magician. The

trouble was that five thousand other boys had the same idea. He had wanted to work on cruise ships, but found he was too young for that so, after about a year of struggle, he joined the navy where he remained for seven and a half years. The last four years of that service were spent back in San Diego where two important things happened.

In June of 1977, while he was still in the Navy, Mike and J. C. Wagner opened a bar called THE MAGIC LOUNGE. It was located at 4619 University Avenue and continued to flourish until 1980 when the business lost its lease. All the bartenders were magicians, and on weekends there were stage acts. There was also a back room where magiclans could do magic for tips. The place was extremely popular, and whenever a magical celebrity was in town he was sure to turn up at the MAGIC LOUNGE. Among many others were Stydini and Ricky Jay.


One night a pretty girl and her date came into the lounge. Mike entertained her with a few tricks, and showed up where she worked the next day - just in time to take Donna Lynn Doumont to lunch. The rest is history. They have been married for ten years now.

The worst feature of the bar was that it tended to debase Mike. In the constant search for new gags and leering double-entendres he found himself growing ruder and cruder, until Donna finally called a halt. Mike had just gotten out of the Navy and taken a civil service job. Now

he left the MAGIC LOUNGE and, during a twenty week hiatus from magic, he reevaluated his magical career. Donna gave him a pen and ink drawing of a very large rabbit removing a magician from a hat. (The drawing is reproduced here.) With his already plus six foot height it was easy to make a costume for a

seven foot rabbit. John Ferguson, a magician who lives in Rediands, CA, designed the entire costume for him. The head alone is about fifteen to eighteen inches in diameter and is strapped on so he can move, bend and twist without it moving, turning or worst of all - falling off. The feet are enormous, in scale with the

head. The rabbit wears a special black tuxedo and white gloves.

The hard part was learning to walk and talk in the costume, and to do magic with gloves on. The name selected for the new creation was *Bumper*: However, on one of his early *Bumper* shows, Mike Rogers, who was momitoring the show, gave him a penetrating critique:

"Mike," he said, "you're just a guy in a rabbit costume doing magic. You've got to *become* a rabbit if you're going to be effective!"

It took Mike a while to take this in. But that wasn't the only problem. With the head on he had lost a lot of the powers of misdirection which derive from the direction the eyes are looking or the expression on the face. The solution was a class in mime at City College. He learned to create expression with his whole head, his shoulders, his hands and arms, even with his knees and those enormous feet. He learned to think like a rabbit.

He credits Mike Rogers for much of his achivement. Mike continued to suggest and guide as the rabbit developed, giving him many insights that might, otherwise, have been difficult to perceive.

And then came another great step forward. He had a sound system built into the costume. Now he could talk and there was no stopping him. Bumper lived!

To maintain the lilusion that he was the rabbit, he never allowed anyone to see him in partial costume, or to see the head or feet disembodied. Since he couldn't

drive with the head on he had to be driven to every show. As an example, for five years Donna had to drive him to the Black Angus and sit around for endless hours while he table hopped. When he finally got a van he could use as a dressing room part of that problem was solved.

Bumper was the rabbit that made Mike Stilwell. He was enormously successful, working the Magic Conventions, appearing on televison, being featured as the official rabbit at the Del Marr Fair, working every Sunday at Seaport Village for a long period and doing countiess commercial and charitable shows. But still he was not completely happy. He still had to go to that civil service job five days a week. He wanted to start a magic shop and concentrate totally on magic.

As it happens, his Uncle Suds (his mother's brother, Ted Sudbrack, but "Suds" to all his friends) was operating a magic manufacturing business in the Los Angeles area. "Instead of opening a shop, why don't you buy my business?"

Suds was one of the two largest manufacturers of *Linking Rings* in

the country, and probably the largest maker of *Hat Tears* in the business.

Mike and Donna bought a beautiful house on the side of a hill in Spring Valley with a sprawling yard spotted with fruit trees. Mike built a pen for his rabbits, a pool for his turties, and set up the "Suds" business in the

basement. In deference to the debt he owed to the rabbit he named the business BUMPER & COMPANY. Due to the slope of the hill the garage is on the basement level and has become part of the operation. Hence part of the working area is open to the scenery on a nice day.

At a recent IBM convention, Mike's old friend from Washington, Al Cohen, approached him and said, "Mike, Isn't it interesting that I sold you your first set of LINKING RANGS, and now I buy all of mine from you."

Mike does not do many BUM-PER shows any more. Now, working as Magic Mike, he does several restaurant shows a week and numerous private parties, trade shows, and hospitality suites. But Bumper is still on call when requested.

Thus Mike Stilwell has fulfilled his dream of not working for a living, but living for the work he loves - full time.
