DECEMBER MEETING

Our first Xmas Dinner/Show in the American Legion Hall - sorry I wasn't able to attend, but all reports indicate that ex-Presidents Fred and Ursula ROHRER catered an excellent Roast Beef dinner for the seventy members and guests present. Very nice social hour, fantastic Hors d'Oeuvres, Steamboat Round of Beef with all the trimmings; and then it was time for Jack EVANS, ex Love Boat Magician, RING 76 member, and President of the MAGIC GUILD OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA. JACK does a classic showy act which played for years on the cruise ships and held nothing back; more "bits" than you could follow and solid entertainment.

After a nice introduction by President Dick DALE, Jack opened with a six foot Dragon Silk production from a clean, empty tube complete with jumbo flower bouquet, and then a nice paper garland tear. Next a vanishing Coke bottle into silk streamer with MERV TAYLOR BIRD CAGE PRODUCTION, and the great MILSON WORTH ABSCONDING QUEEN which Jack does so well. A great combination of POPSEY SILKS into a QUAD BLENDO led to a short break when Jack introduced his protege?,

casey McFADDEN, who gave us a beautiful three ring routine to great music. Jack came back after a costume change (where does he get those shirts?) and did a jumbo card transformation a la "BLUE ROOM" illusion box, twentieth century silks, a bewildering VANISHING LIGHT BULB and reproduction, lit; a classic SNAKE IN BASKET with chosen torn corner card with extremely funny bits via a telephone to the snake; and his ALICE IN WONDERLAND routine, a PENETRATING MIRROR mini-illusion.

Jack closed with what started out to be another paper tear, jumbo sheets this time, but they wound up to be a twenty four foot square foulard. And THEN - from absolutely nowhere - A SIX FOOT TALL MODEL OF THE EIFFEL TOWER! A fantastic closer, and it put a wonderful cap on a great Xmas Dinner.

You may also have missed the MAGIC GUILD OF SOUTHERN CALIFOR-NIA's special "Member's Magic Night" for RING 76 on January third. After several short business announcements, President Jack EVANS introduced Bob APPLEBAUM (MAGIC BOB) with a great rendition of the MUTILA-TED PARASOL followed by Scot FISHER doing a fantastic signed bill in glass transposition. Fellow RING 76er Jan EASTMAN did a very nice CHANGE BAG BLENDO with an incredible young and cute helper (a natural for the stage), and Ken showed off his Jumbo AYERS (wrong)Card Revelation (and I mean JUMBO; two feet by three at least). Veteran James SWOGER did an amazing ball in silk in glass transposition (nice collector's item I'm sure.) and Ruth (JINGLES) SCHILBERG did a very funny bit with a green thumb tip, and then went into a very smooth COLOR CHANGING RECORD effect with excellent "Christian" patter. Casey MCFADDEN did another per-

formance of his very slick three ring LINKING RING routine and Ben DRUCKERMAN followed with a very confusing, but successful, PRO-FESSOR'S NIGHTMARE, the hard way. V. Robert ALLEN (also a RING Mer) showed us an outstanding version of the TEN CARDS ACROSS effect (an oldie, but goodie). Ken STILL-MAN produced an amazing load of stuff from a flat paper bag, also with very appropriate "Christian Magician" patter; and Paul BARTON closed with one of his fantastic card items. It was an incredible impromptu show, and I hope more IBM'ers can visit this fun group in the future.



The Board met on January fifth with Dick DALE, Mike STILWELL, Ed FORSYTHE, Ed RAYMOND, Harry HARTMAN, and J.P. JACK-SON present. The results of the Xmas Dinner meeting dicussed, and pros and cons noted in an effort to make it an even better one for next year. At the request of the board, Ed FOR-SYTHE, acting as a one-man ad hoc committee, submitted a list of proposed RING 76 specific Goals and Objectives in response to a carry-over item from a previous Board Meeting. His list, based on many, many years of membership in various clubs all over the country, will be compared to existing items in the By-Laws, edited for duplication, and submitted for acceptance by the Membership.

The Board agreed that RING 76 has the

capability and a strong enough membership to support the formation of a Junior Group. An active recruitment program will get underway in the spring to locate and attract potential RING 76 members who are currently below the IBM membership age of fourteen, but would like to participate in a junior club as a path to membership in the IBM and RING 76. The Board is seeking folk who will volunteer to be Advisors, Sponsors and "helpers" in general; AND especially the names of potential candidates for the junior group. We also anticipate help from BRAD BURT'S MAGIC SHOP classes as a source of interested young magicians.

Lastly, the Board agreed that the previously proposed, and often discussed "point system" for selection of a Magician-of-the-Year and for Member-of-the-Year would be just too unwieldy for implementation next year. The Board considered, instead, a new proposal to conduct a fully structured, annual competition with three or four performing nights during the year on regular meeting nights with assigned consistent judging, and ultimate selection of Magician-ofthe-Year based on the competitive results. This proposal will be discussed further and submitted to the membership for consideration at a future date. Further, the Board discussed a proposal to base the selection of Member-of-the-Year on written letters of nomination from the membership at large. This too will be discussed at the next Board meeting on February sixth at Ed Raymond's home.

Auctioneers will present three or four items only from each Seller until each Seller's items have been seen once. After a short break, during which Buyers will pay for their

purchases up to that time, the Auctioneer will continue to offer only three or four items from each Seller until each Seller has been seen a second time. Again there is a short break, more Buyers pay up, and the Auction continues until each Seller's items are gone. This system works very well, provides short intermissions and avoids the big jam-up at the end of the evening.

The show on April first will be performed in the Balboa Park area before an audience of visually and physically challenged children. Ticket sales benefit the Crime Victims Fund of San Diego. "Sawing an Officer in Haif is the easy part explains Crane, 'and restoring the person is an effect ive recently mastered. But I need the help and ideas of other Magicians to attempt to vanish a fully loaded Harley-Davidson police bike."

"That is why Crane proposes a contest, open to amateur and professional Magicians, world-wide, to design an appropriate illusion that he can build. THE CONTEST CLOSES FEBRUARY TWENTIETH, 1989 to allow six weeks for construction and testing of the magical apparatus.

"Rules of the contest are as follows:

- 1. Budget five nundred dollars of so to construct
- 2. Must be self contained apparatus -- no files, wings or traps.
- 3 Conceal a fully loaded Harley-Davidson with fairing, wings, lights.
- 4. Prefer to drive into box or atop a platform, close side & door, and eventually vanish the cycle but not the officer riding it
- 5. Winner receives publicity credit, mention in all press releases, and the right to use the apparatus him/herself in another show.
- 6. Judged on most convincing vanish, affordable use or materials, ease of construction, and breakdown, reusability and portability.

"Crane's abilities as an Escape A, will also be tested on stage with a spectacular, but dangerous, Suspended Straight Jacket Escape, designed to confine the murderously insane. This effect made Harry Houdini into a world famous entertainer, and put the roar into the Roaring Twenties.

"Asked why me date of April Fool's Day (the first of the month) was chosen to perform so many difficult and dangerous stunts, Crans explained, 'So we'll still have two weeks left to complete our taxes!"
