



# JOSEPH SILK GUN

E.R. JOSEPH of Glendale, CA, designed a SILK VANISHING GUN in the late thirties/early forties which instantly vanished a fifteen inch silk or a very light-weight eighteen inch silk. The gun looked like a German Mauser Pistol and was manufactured by the LLOYD CHAMBERS MANUFACTURING COMPANY of Clearwater, KA. It was sold through the forties by many magic shops and crept up in

price from seven dollars and fifty cents to fifteen dollars. Today, in good working condition, they sell for close to one hundred dollars. However, they were sealed when made, break easily, and are extremely difficult to repair. I am learning how and am looking for broken ones in any condition, and/or parts or pieces. Please call J.P. - George SANDS lecture on March thirteenth? FANTASTIC hardly does it! Almost TWO lectures worth of some of the cleanest, slickest magic I've ever seen. About forty folk turned out and were spellbound for over three hours of incredible material - and that's not surprising. George SANDS is a delightful, unpretentious man who has been doing magic for over fifty vears. His classic "ROPE SAND-SATIONAL" was first copyrighted in 1949 and is still in print! What a wealth of knowledge and experience: and the fun part of it is that he seemed actually pleased and happy to be able to share it with us. AND he did, down to each tiny detail. He started with some fun rope handling ("Threading the Needle Loop") while everyone followed with rope in hand, and then walked us through his newer "ROPESATIONAL" routine, a bewildering series of cuts and restorations (with no scissors) and vanishing and appearing knots. He demonstrated and explained his "RAZOR BLADE version of THREADING' with some of the boldest and cleanest handling around. His card magic was dumbfounding, and included two versions of "CARDS ACROSS" (Voo Doo Cards), and an incredible "CARDS TO POCKET", oneat-a-time effect. Both appear in his book "FIFTY YEARS OF MAGIC", along with "ONE CARD PETE", a six card repeat with a poetic, gambling story line. Even the local
- "card guys" were impressed. The second half was just as good, and it went on and on. Another nice Coins Across effect called "TWO COINS IN THE FOUNTAIN"; some imaginative Billet Reading; his timeless "ROPESANDSATIONAL" routine; and some very original Balloon Animals with great gags. A tremendous lecture by a very nice man. Come back again next year, George.
- Again from Stan ALLEN: PENN & TELLER will be on HBO's COMIC RELIEF on Saturday, March eighteenth just about the time you get this. You may not care for these zany magic comedians, but ya can't hardly NOT watch them.

# Personality of the Month



This month I had the pleasure of interviewing a charming and dynamic lady who has been an active magician for over fifty years. A member of Ring 76 since 1964, Jane Clement is still going strong, not only as a magician, but in a myriad of other activities. For instance, next month she will lead a travel group to Australia and New Zealand. In the past she has lead groups to, among other places, the Orient and Europe. Jane is definitely not on the shelf.

Her home on Lomica Drive in Rancho Bernado instantly reflects the catholic tastes she shared with her husband Wil Staar (Wilton S. Clements), who passed

away in 1985 at the robust age of 87. On approaching the house you are greeted by a pair of weathered swinging gates which screen the entrance garden from casual passers by. However, a small sign bids you "Enter", and you step into a lovely little oriental garden. The tinkle of a fountain draws your eye to a small secluded pool presided over by the impassive figure of a small seated Buddha. Somehow the charm of your surroundings is instantly established.

Upon admission to the house you are greeted by a capacious foyer which melds into a generous glass walled living room that looks

out over more small gardens penciled with ceramic tiled walks. Over a low stone wall the view of the valley is beautiful but fails to intrude on the privacy of the room. The living room and foyer walls are tastefully decorated with travel mementos of the couple's world travels. Jane explains that there were even more pictures and memorabilia when Will was alive, plus a complete theater in the garage, which has had to make way for the rakes and tools of an active gardner.

Will, who grew up in Owensboro, Kentucky, was bitten by the Magic Bug at age eleven. It seems that a traveling magician/tourist, named "Sport" Green Logdson, was lost in the Mammouth Cave. (Will's father was the manager of the Mammouth Cave.) When the senior Clements was active in rescuing the frightened magi the man

offered to show young Will some magic in recompense. He performed: THE LINKING RINGS, THE CUPS AND BALLS and then really impressed the boy by making a glass of water disappear and reappear three rooms away. In an interview in the RANCHO BERNADO JOURNAL in 1978, writer Barbara Walter quotes Will as saying, "I thought it was a miracle. I was hooked!"

Although Will had no teachers he began to read all the books he could get on the "ancient art of honest deception". He soon found, however, that although the books were helpful, they were written in the conjuror's special language which could only be learned through apprenticeship to a master magician. Despite this drawback he continued to study.

During World War I Will served in the Marine Corps (leaving high school in his third year to enlist), and after his service he decided to complete his education. He went to Chicago and got work to help him through college, at one point attending two colleges simultaneously. He also joined the S.A.M. and the I.B.M. in order to pursue his avocation. He is quoted in the Walter's article, cited above, as saying,"In Chicago in the late twenties and early thirties I met some of the great men in the field of Magic, among them Harry Blackstone Sr., Dr. Harlan Tarbell, Warner Dornfield and

Okito (Theodore Bamberg); men who really made it possible for me to be something in magic.

"Blackstone and the others gave me the technical information I needed in magic - how to build my act, how to present it, and how to dress. Dornfield said, 'Don't ever let your audience be better dressed than you are.' The effect was all important."

Will met Blackstone, his "hero" and mentor, by walking up and introducing himself to the magician when he was playing the TIVOLI in the early thirties.

"I invited him to have lunch at our fraternity house," Will recalled. "He accepted and asked if there were any children in the house. I told him our cook's son was the only child.

"Blackstone talked with us and ate lunch. Then he asked to see the cook's son. He surprised us by producing a live rabbit out of his coat pocket for the little boy. I thought that was a very humane act."

Will performed his own sleight of hand while at the University of Chicago. He whisked Jane away from her current boyfriend. Again quoting from the Walter's article, "Jane was dating a fraternity brother of mine. I just told him to move over." The couple were married in 1934 and have two daughters and six grandchildren.

That felicitous outcome was not always assured. At first Jane was not overly impressed with magic. She thought it was "corny". Her younger brothers ,however, did not. There was at times a question as to whether Will was calling to see Jane, or to entertain her brothers. After their marriage she changed her mind about magic.

After college both of them joined the Chicago Public School System as teachers, Will teaching Physical Education and coaching, and Jane as an English teacher. Will also worked officiating at sports events until he decided that magic was more lucrative and concentrated on that. Will was eventually awarded a Master's degree by the University of Chicago. Jane also studied at the Sorbonne, and at the French School in Vermont.

Will spent thirty eight years with the Chicago Board of Education, retiring in 1963. During those many years he made a name for himself as a magician in Chicago. He was also active in Magic Circles, serving as president of the HARLAN TARBELL RING 43 In 1963 the couple



decided to retire to San Diego. They were looking at a house in the city and had about decided on it when they learned the current owners were moving to Rancho Bernardo. It immediately occurred to them that if someone was leaving such a lovely home the alternative must be even more desireable. As a result they took a look at Rancho Bernardo and bought the first lot in Seven Oaks. They never regretted it.

In World War II Will accepted a commission in the Navy as a Welfare and Special Services Officer. The first Christmas after the

liberation of the island of Guam from the Japanese Will presented the first magic show many of the children there had ever seen. In all, he served five years on active duty and fifteen years in the Active Reserve, retiring as a full commander.

While the couple lived in Chicago Okito was in retirement in the city. He had become old and feeble and his only living relative, Fu Manchu, was working in South America, so several magic wives began keeping an eye on him. On Sundays the hotel where he lived served no meals so the girls would bring him dinner. Jane's interest in magic had developed to the point where she asked him to teach her some tricks. The old master not only taught her some tricks, but built some equipment just for her, plus developing routines and special music. The act, which was done in pantomime, was called MAGIC TO MUSIC. Jane became an accomplished magician in her own right.

The couple became very active in Rancho Bernardo. Will was president of the dramatic club and was the first person elected to the Rancho Bernado Hall of Fame. He also worked widely in San Diego County as a magician. He was an expert in the art of Public Relations, capturing many press notices and garnering an imposing collection of letters of appreciation from his many satisfied clients.

One of his most impressive achievements was his record of free shows for the patients at the Balboa Naval Hospital and the Base Hospital at Camp Pendleton. Between the years of 1964 to 1974 he did not miss a single month of his self imposed duty to the hospitalized boys. His stack of letters boggles the mind. Reading them one wonders how the Red Cross Workers were able to think of the words to create this outpouring of appreciation.


