

Forty seven Members and thirteen guests showed up at the July Meeting to hear Convention hi-lites and tid-bits, the reading of letters of thanks to the Ring for recent benefit shows, including the Children's Hospital the day before the Convention which featured outgoing International President Ed MORRIS: and to hear everybody thanking everybody profusely for everybody's help in making the Convention THEE best yet. George EDWARDS hosted one of his great teach-ins. work-shops (cards this time) as a premeeting event. We had a brief business meeting, Magic Mike STILWELL conducted the raffle, and two new members joined at the break.


Jack EVANS started our "MAGIC WITH NUMBERS" with his Fourth Grade graduation exercise - an hilarious "Math Oral Test" which should have kept him in the fourth grade. The funny rou-

tine showed how he put the number seven into the number twenty eight, thirteen times. He proved it by multiplying seven times thirteen to get another twenty eight, and capped it by adding seven thirteens in a row to get another twenty eight. John GOLD pulled a pair of scissors and one of those three foot by four foot sheets of one dollar bills out of his business portfolio to show us how he pays the lunch tab with a chuckle. He went on with fifteen minutes of other fun gags and described how to get the sheets from the Bureau of Printing and Engraving. Roy & Betty ARM-STRONG gave us a delightful thirty minute slice out of their school show using marker boards and felt-tip markers and lotsa numbers. Betty walked through the "nines" multiplication table the hard way, and **Roy** had three random, single digit numbers chosen, reversed them, subtracted, reversed again and added to get the classic magic number, "1089". Then he revealed the ninth word on the eighth line on page ten of the JULY LINK. ING RING. He continued his great number magic with a prediction using random entries in a passed out calculator, and then another using a set of jumbo cards; all very entertaining and extremely well presented by a couple of very nice pro's.

Jumbo Card Cal MAYERS used the ace through nine from a jumbo deck and three assistants to create three, three digit numbers, and then correctly predicted the Skipper Frank HERMAN did TWO vanishes with ONE color changing lighter, and used THREE bangles demonstrate "EL ROJO, SI", a Mexican ring release; FIRST from his thumb and SECOND from a rope - and called it all NUMBER magic. Makes Sense to me!

James SWOGER came up with a long strand of prayer beads and showed everyone a loop-around-neck clever release which no one could duplicate while "doing as he did". Jim insisted it was number magic cause he's been doing it FORTY SEVEN years! Don Halbach, the brand new sponsor of our soon-to-be junior group, did a fantastic "PREDICTION NEWSPAPER TEAR" with a sheet of paper, torn five times to get a multitude of pieces, had one chosen by random number and, when revealed, it matched an identical piece in a previously selected and sealed envelope - very nice stuff. Bob INGALLS ate the flowers off two feathered roses and produced a multicolored mylar mouth coil. Loch **CRANE** did his "Magician's Rap" from the Convention competition, and Ed RAY-**MOND** closed with a number prediction based on a spectator's age.



The Board met on August Seventh with Dick DALE, Mike STILWELL. Bob IN-GALLS, J.P. JACKSON, RAYMOND. Frank SYREN, Don HALBACH, Sherry LUFT and Brad BURT. INITIAL PLANS AND STRUCTURE FOR OUR NEW "JUNIOR GROUP" were discussed. Sponsor, Don HALBACH has a copy of the old "SAN DIEGO JUNIOR MAGICIANS" and the old, but fairly extensive, Junior Group library. Brad BURT has offered the back room of his Magic Shop as Junior Group meeting room. Don HAL-BACH, assisted by Bob IN-GALLS, will firm up details and provide an initial report at the regular meeting on August Twenty First. Candidates for the Junior Group should be solicited by the Ring Membership and names and addresses passed to Don HALBACH or J.P. JACKSON.

In keeping with our plans to have monthly "teach-ins" or "work-shops" from Six Forty Five to Seven Thirty on Meeting Nights, Brad BURT has offered to conduct a "Dealer Demonstration" or "What's New in Magic" as a Pre-Meeting event anytime required. The first one is scheduled for the regular meeting on September Eighteenth.

Past Treasurer, Ed RAY-MOND. proposed a motion that the practice of purchasing End-Of-Year plaques for outgoing Ring Officers be terminated, as too costly. After discussion, the Board agreed that, in the future, such expenses will be capped at Seventy Five Dollars, and that the specific expense be approved by the Board prior to any contractural obligation.

Mike STILWELL proposed that the Ring conduct a Public Show\Fund Raiser to help replenish our depleted treasury. The Board agreed and established a tentative date of January 1990.

Frank SYREN proposed that Ring 76 should consider submitting a "Ring 76 Parade" to the LINKING RING and volunteered to chair the effort. The Board agreed and will support this undertaking. A target publication date will be established, and original material solicited.

J.P. JACKSON proposed Jame THURSTON SHE-PHARD for Honarary Membership in our Ring in view of her help with the Convention, specifically on the Welcome\Hospitality Table. The Board agreed unanimously.

The Board discussed plans and menus for the Annual RING 76196 Exchange Banquet on September Sixteenth. Liaison has been established with Bill McHILHANY, President of RING 96. (See Dinner Flyer this issue.)

Next Board Meeting will be at J.P. JACKSON's on Tuesday, September Fifth.











If your creation is the revision of an existing trick please try to give credit, where possible. If you don't, Phil Willmarth probably will.

When we feel we have a package that does credit to the club we'll send it to Phil Willmarth.


I have deliberately not set a schedule for completion until I see the volume of your submissions. Later we will announce a dead line



FROM THE NORTH:
