This year San Diego Ring 76 hosted the social hour and buffet dinner, and Ring Ninety Six did the show. Those guys are GOOD! Thirty Nine Ring Seventy Sixers and twenty Ring Ninety Sixers(including five outstanding performers) got together for a fantastic dinner at PEA SOUP ANDERSON'S in Carlsbad, CA. Ring Seventy Six President Dick DALE gave the official welcome and introduced Ring Ninety Six President and M/C for the evening, Bill McILHANY, who extended congratulations to Ring Seventy Six for hosting the recent IBM Convention, and then presented plaques to last year's Ring Seventy Six performers: Dan FRECKS, Jim RILEY, Jessie JUDGE, Wayne ALBERT, Jack MARK-LEY. Jim BEAMON. Jack EVANS and Dick & Julie DALE.

Bill McILHANY, a fellow collector and performer as well, led off the entertainment with the

GRANTS's MYSTERY OF THE PYRAMID (a reversing stack of different size disks which never could be turned over) with cute topsy turvy patter. Then he introduced special guest star - John FEDCO. John made his entrance scaling cards to "Music Box Dancer" and went into some very nice card fanning and a diminishing card routine. He did classic Billiard Balls with manipulations, multipications, vanishes and a Jumbo Golf Ball from hat climax and finished with a half-faro shuffle, Jumbo Card Fan which revealed the American Flag. Classic magic and a beautiful opening act. Bill McILHANY came back with a nice presentation of Ed MASSEY's "CARVING CUTTER"



- another collectible - and a very realistic carving knife/wrist chopper effect with the knife handed out for examination.

Roy ZIMMERMAN was next, complete with the lab coat, fuzzy hair, a high tech laboratory setting, scientific Einsteinian patter, and about ninety seven versions of the "GOZINTA" effect - it was delightful and a fooler. President Bill presented Thayer's "ARCHITECT'S NICHTMARE" from his collection, a modernized version of the "BLUE PHANTOM", which is one of the few known to exist. Then he introduced Pete MULONY, a youngish member of Ring Ninety Six with lots of potential. He was very original and funny with a "Laundry" routine involving dark blue gloves, white socks and bags which had the gloves and socks changing places, shrinking, mutating and vanishing via one of those Drive-Thru Bank money cannisters - very, very clever.

M/C Bill McILHANY back with another collectible - Don LAWTON's BOLINO BLOCK PENETRATION by Townhouse Magic - one of the very best of the "block-go" or "bomb-block" effects - and then introduced Australian Tommy GARBIN. Tommy is a funny, funny man and set the tone right from the start with his fifty two card repeat - thankfully he didn't have to finish we got the point. It was fast, furious, very funny and entertaining thirty minutes with silk

productions, dove productions, clever "shrimp on the barbie" patter, and a Do-As-I-Do Clippo routine. He followed with a flashy paper slips to cash effect and a nice "TRICKY BOTTLF" routine which was even better with a glitch or two. He finished with an interesting card prediction using the elimination of color plaques to arrive at the chosen card and a split dove production at the very end. Bill McIL-HANY closed the evening with a beautiful presentation of THE TEMPLE OF CAMBODIA. a full scale Guillotine routine with all the right bits and the bartender's head at risk; and finished with a great re-creation of Bill NEFF's "FRAME OF LIFE AND DEATH" just as he saw it in 1964 at the combined IBM/SAM Convention in New York, A spectacular ending to a great evening of magic! Ring Seventy Six President Dick DALE thanked all the performers and attendees and announced that the evening's performance would be too tough to top next year so Ring Seventy Six wasn't even going to try, thus ending our long. long tradition - but he was only kidding, and we are already working on our trip North next year. ****

SEPTEMBER MEETINGwhat you missed

Two nights after the Exchange Banquet forty members and four guests attended our regular meeting for "Mental Or Other Strange Magic" night. Brad BURT presented a "What's New In Magic" Dealer Demo as a pre-meeting event, we had a short business meeting and the regular raffle. Two new members joined us at the break. Welcome back to Ed GREENE, an original Ring Seventy Six Charter Member, and Dave NELSON, who joined us from Hawaii.

Don HALBACH started the entertainment with a prediction using four seven digit numbers entered randomly and totaled on a calculator to arrive at the serial number of a bill sealed in an envelope previously selected from a fan of five. Mike MOSHER entertained us with a clever invisible coin routine, and a four card prediction effect using the month and year. Then Funny Man, Jack EVANS, with a "NO" prediction card and the Anverdi "CLOSING CARD BOX" with his usual hilarious by-play; Sunny, the Clown, with four colored felt rabbits, and a box of baby bunnies matching the chosen color; Cal MAYERS with a two deck prediction with the second deck's matching card marked with an "X": Loch CRANE did a nice matching card effect with five chosen cards torn in half.



the pieces shuffled and dealt at random as per the audience's direction, and the pieces rejoined at the revelation; Ed FORSYTHE doing a nice number prediction from Fulve's "SELF WORKING MAGIC", and then new member, Dave NELSON, with a serio-comic presentation of TELEKINETIC TIMBER, complete with sound effects.

Jack MARKLEY next with a very funny mental routine employing blindfolded SUNNY the Clown as "Madame DOVINI" to predict a chosen card sealed in an envelope. Jack was in rare form with his bottle of Listerine for the "anti-skeptics" and cuing Madame DOVINI with the line, "you remember, just like we did it SIX weeks ago in that CLUB in Chicago"; just before she revealed the correct five of diamonds. Jeff MARCUS did a fooler with three random numbers, chosen by three different spectators, which were added and used to find his prediction in the phone book complete with the right name and address. He followed with a well done jumbo "MENTAL EPIC"routine. Dave LAMBERT came up with a very clever book test using two assistants, a French Book and his prediction in two clear plastic boxes suspended from a rope stretched between Dave and his subject as the psychic link: and it worked.

Bob ALLEN, president of THE MAGICIAN'S GUILD OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, did a mysterious poker chip prediction with two spectators randomly sorting red and white chips from a box with the end results revealed from from a sealed envelope. John GOLD did a mini version of his trained flea act with the line that he "thought about it for a long time to make it mental". Lastly, Old Pro James SWOGER closed with a very quick, but effective, knife in a vase of rice suspension.

BOARD MIEETING

The Board met on October Second with Dick DALE, J.P. JACKSON, Frank SYREN, Sherry LUFT, Ed FORSYTHE, Harry HARTMAN. Ed RAYMOND and Don HALBACH. A recent phone conversation with Hank MOREHOUSE determined that he will not be available for a Ring Seventy Six Lecture this fall during his visit to the MAGIC CASTLE The Board discussed several alternate candidates for a Ring Sponsored Lecture in the near future, including Eric LEWIS, Martin LEWIS. Tom OGDEN, and Mike CAVENEY. Further suggestions are most welcome, and will be solicited at the October meeting.

Don HALBACH petitioned the Board, on behalf of the new Junior Group, for partial subsidization in funding the mailing of the newsletter to all Junior Group members. After discussion, a formal motion was made and carried to fund about one half the cost of printing and mailing MAGICURRENTS to all Junior Members for the first year (Approximately four dollars per member.) 
