

OCTOBER MEETINGwhat you missed

Forty five members and seven guests at our October meeting with "Historical Magic" as the theme. J.P. JACKSON, the duty accumulator, lugged in a couple of items for "Collector's Corner", our pre-meeting event, and displayed a mint, junior size "Colonial Table" by THA YER with two plugged B/A wells: a HIMBER "SIL-VER ROCKET BOX" (his lavorite piece) sold in TANNEN'S Catalog #1; "WATCH-OUT", Gene GLOYE effect by MAZDA MAGIC from the late Forties; an ABBOT's "BEAUTY CAN-ARY CAGE", and then asked for help in identifying a very ornate, hand painted (with Oriental Birds) Take-A-Part Vanish - maker unknown, to no avail. The business portion announced about three requests for magicians to do benefit shows (that time of year); a Halloween public show at the Mid-City Theater by members Loch CRANE and Dave NEL-**SON**; and the presentation of a nice citation with fond Good-Byes to long time member and past officer, Harry HARTMAN, who is leaving the area.

We socialized at the break, welcomed our one hundred and fourth member, Tom KASNER, gave away lots of "BUMPER'S" stuff during the raffle and started the program with Mr. Historical, himself:

James SWOGER favored us with a presentation of probably the very first "flip book" from England - a beautiful piece which went from crossword puzzle to blank, to sheet music to blank, to alphabet letters to blank, and from a stamp album to blank - all with a delightful story line. John GOLD performed one of the fun ones we all tried as kids; he had a fresh banana peeled by one of the junior members to discover that it was presliced into the number of sections that matched the number of pips on his chosen card. John went on with a short observation on "investment planning" and illus-

trated his point, to many groans, with a model of his "Tacks Shelter", complete with a tiny thatched roof - almost wish he'd spared us, but it was cute and entertaining.

Dr. Bob ALLEN gave us a nice re-creation of the very first illusion - the beheading of a goose as performed by the Egyptian Magician, DEDI, for the great Pharaoh, CHEOPS, in about 1700 BC, or earlier. (DEDI not Bob.) Bob used two loops of rope tied together into a goose shape to do a baffling cut and restored rope routine. All of which prompted President Dick DALE to walk on with small, dragging steps to announce that this was the very first "Pharaoh Shuffle" to which some wag exclaimed, "Tut, tut." (It got worse but you ain't gonna read about it here!!) Dave (CALIGARTI) NELSON came up with a nice volcano patter story from Hawaii to go with his bare hand production of red silk from a well that was formed in white hank. SANDY JAY demonstrated her Teddy Bear custom made coloring book with magic pictures first and then the colors. Jeff MARCUS did his "historical" six linking ring routine with very smooth handling, beautiful moves and horrible gags - but funny. Roy ARMSTRONG presented a true historical treasure - the Mac-Donald BIRCH POPCORN trick with the original prop given him many, many years ago by **BIRCH** himself. Then he did a nice routine with an original THAYER BREAKAWAY DIE BOX which he purchased some forty six years

Jack MARKLEY was next with an original BLACKSTONE SR. VANISHING BIRD CAGE only Jack drew the bird in the cage on a slate complete with the droppings. When he turned the slate back around the cage was there with the droppings - but no bird. He followed with his very first cup and ball routine, learned as a boy, his vanishing "Esther", a small Rabbit Silk, and closed with his sponge ("Meat") ball routine. Mark DIMENSTAIN demonstrated his newest COSMAR MAGIC item, a very

realistic Cutting-into-Arm effect with a gruesome looking butcher knife - just in time for Halloween geek-type magic. 
