right then performing at a school function which left only Charter Junior Member Logan HALE. Logan made his debut with a well done presentation of "ASTRO-BLAST" - vanished a silk with a long barreled pistol with its instant reappearance inside a shattered light bulb.

Bob INGALLS provided a nice filler with "thanks" to Logan for letting him (Bob) "pal around" with Logan on Saturdays at BRAD BURT, S MAGIC SHOP, with his incredible soft-shoe routine (cardiac shuffle is better), and by offering to show us his incision again (a weekly event). For more filler he regaled us with stories (question mark) of his cardiac exercise class, complete with demonstration, and was about to repeat the soft shoe when Dave (CALIGARTI) NELSON announced that the show was ready.

It was a classic and traditional silent stage act. To theme music from 2001, Scheherazade, and several other great selections, CALIGARTI did beautiful silk productions, a slick dove production, a fooler glass of wine production, a very clean cut/restored ribbon effect, and a tremendous presentation of the "KUMA TUBES" with miles of streamers, a huge chain of thirty six inch silks, and a bunny finale from the bundle of silk.

Next he did a nice interlude with a TORN & RESTORED NEWSPAPER (corner tear) and then produced two silks from the crumpled paper which he used for a clever knot transposition effect and a classy linking and unlinking silk loop routine. A stretching silk production followed, the bunny vanished in a nice clean take-apart cage, he did a slow serpent silk, and went into a huge fountain of silks production with more streamers and a six foot RABBIT IN HAT silk finish. The bunny reappeared in a fall-apart water bucket (into which KUMA TUBE Lota had been emptied many times), and as helper Vi FREELAND's bouquet of flowers changed into a feather parasol, CALIGARTI

produced the biggest Botania I've ever seen - at least eight feet tall and very appropriate as an "Xmas Tree" Botania finish to a great act. All in all, a very nice Xmas "do" for RING SEVENTY SIX.

#### BOARD MEFTING

The Board met on January Third at Brad Burt's Magic Shop with Brad BURT, Dick & Julie DALE, Sherry LUFT, J.P. JACKSON, Don HALBACH, and Mike KLIGMAN. #### CROSS TALK



Discuss possibility of your club making a bid for hosting the 1992, 1993 or 1994 PCAM convention.

... bids will be accepted at the February PCAM convention. (February 16-19... Oxnard, California)

#### PROPOSED NEW PROCESS AIMED AT:

- REDUCING HOST CLUB'S RISK
- INSURING CONSISTENTLY HIGH QUALITY CONVENTIONS
- MAINTAINING THE "LOCAL", HOST CLUB FRIENDLINESS AND PERSONALITY.

At the last PCAM convention—1988 in Santa Barbara—Ernie Nassimbene was asked to look into finding a possible solution for the problem PCAM has been having putting on conventions.

A team of seven experienced members of PCAM were pulled together to help formulate a plan. The team has been meeting since May, has been drawing on the experience of many others and has arrived at what appears to be a very solid approach. There is much work yet to be done, but the fundamentals are in place.

ASK YOURSELVES THIS; "Given the reasons for clubs not sponsoring a convention in the past-financial risk and planning effort—, if the convention committee can relieve your club of these two tasks, would you consider being a partner with the PCAM Convention Committee to host a PCAM convention?

#### KEY POINTS OF PROPOSED NEW PROCESS

- 1. PCAM assumes the financial risk and financial control of the convention.
- 2. Host Club focuses on providing the "feel", "personality", "pazzaz" and "fun" for the convention.
- 3. PCAM Convention Committee and the Host Club will work together to provide the manpower to put on the convention.
- 4. Host Club will receive a workbook describing what its responsibilities are, with budgets, guidelines and hints for making each task easier and more successful.
- 5. Host Club will receive some of the profits from the convention and all of the profits from any miscellaneous fund raisers it chooses to do.
- The remaining money will go into a PCAM convention account to be used to insure the high quality and success of future conventions.

In general, the PCAM Convention Committee will assume the responsibility and chairmanship of those parts of the convention which can significantly affect the financial success of the convention, and for those parts for which year to year continuity is important.

The Host Club will "own" all aspects of the convention other than those the Convention Committee is responsible for.

MORE INFORMATION AT THE FEBRUARY CONVENTION... Have a delegate at the February convention to get all the details. Please join us to help put PCAM back on its feet and on its way to putting on the most exciting and "friendliest" conventions of them all.
