VINCENT THE MAGICIAN

Tom OGDEN is a former circus performer, has entertained in all of the major casinos, comedy clubs, on television, on cruise ships, in movies, has authored several books, and has been voted MAGICIAN-OF-THF-YEAR by the Academy of Magical Arts not once, but TWICE. Further, he's the PARADE author in the February 1976 issue of the LINKING RING, and, more recently, the feature of GENII magazine for February 1986.

So, after everyone had armed themselves with a homemade Brownie or two and cups of coffee from the "Juniors", we rapidly gave away over fifteen great raffle prizes which included new TENYO items, a DUSHECK Apearing Rose, and even a Magician's License Plate frame (well, we got good stuff out here, no slum); and sat back to hear Tom OGDEN'S incredible lecture.

The first half was all stage and comedy, and we learned how: to abuse kids (nicely) in your show and get away with it (the Prez's favorite part), to create instant stooges, to do a killer CARDS ACROSS (the classic Mike ZEN routine enhanced with fantastic comedy) and to perform very funny comedic bits with kids and adults using standard props including, would you believe, a Rubber Chicken. He gets more mileage out of this hoary old prop than most do with a complete "gag file".

He went on to teach us (really <u>TAUGHT</u>) a very detailed and extremely beneficial lesson on the handling and cuing of assistants from the audience, and on "Stooging" for the extraction of maximum comedy, which was truly invaluable to the working performer.

The second half was all close-up material, and just as well presented, including: a treatise and demonstration of the **ZARROW** Shuffle, a clever bill penetration with a one and a five, and some very nifty handling of the classic SALT SHAKER THRU TABLE Overall, about three hours of superior material with something for everybody. IF YOU WEREN'T there - you missed a GOODER!!

BOARD MEETING


