MAY MEETING

- or what you missed.

Attendance picked up at our May meeting with fifty two members, two guests and two "Juniors" who followed last month's debut with more great "break" refreshments - (Super Fudge). Dave SMITH conducted a very detailed close-up work shop as the pre-meeting event with good "tips" for all. President Dick DALE introduced the guests, presented a Membership Kit to Brian BERG and introduced newest members. Caroline BAUER and Tony ISAACS. Jim WHITING, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, presented the recommended slate of candidates for our June elec-


tions and opened the meeting to nominations from the floor. Don HALBACH outlined an enthusiastic and well conceived plan for a Ring Seventy Six Public Show on October Twenty Seventh during National Magic Week and "tasked" the membership with future ticket sales. Lotsa great stuff for our monthly drawing with about twenty items going out - even the guests won.

President Dick DALE started the "Tricks That Fool Magicians" program with a request for help in improving his top card, air-pressure. turnover revelation. Several Members bit and. after many unsuccessful attempts, discovered that the top card was a "double-backer". The real entertainment started Don HALBACH doing a nice mystery with a small walnut box containing three wood tiles and a great story about the Pharaoh's personal Ankh and the curse to the "opener" of the box. The Ankh symbol vanished, leaving a hole in the cen tile, and reappeared back in the box. Jack MARKLEY gave us an improved version of the SILK-TO-EGG trick by doing a SILK-TO-LENON complete with a pseudo explanation and the cutting in half of the real lemon in the end - great, but messy! Cal MAYERS doing a novel rope effect with Jan EASTMAN and Gary SCWARTZWALD holding the ends. which had been knotted around a long cardboard tube. Cal passed the rope end through the tube and vanished the knot as the tube was pulled free. Bob ALLEN dropped a large die

onto a small tray and then passed out the resulting explosion of candy kisses while the die went into thin air.

Frank HERMAN demonstrated his "Holyman Wand" which he used to guide JAKE THE SNAKE thru his paces - a beautiful series of Rope-(or Silk)-thru-Stick penetrations, with a pink feather "boa" named "JAKE". Guest Jes-JUDGE. making his semi-annual appearance, with a nice series of knots on and off a length of rope which changed into a continuous loop, then into two continuous loops, with and without knots, and back to one long length. Dave (CALIGARTI) NELSON did a smooth eight minute routine starting with a snappy silk onto rope production, several "snap-on" knots, a "blow-on" knot creation, a silk thru rope penetration, and finished with his classic cut and restored ribbon folded lengthwise in a Jumbo Playing Card.

New member, Ray KOSBY, showed us his ambitious card routine and finished with a kicker revelation with a chosen card stuck to his thumb as the deck dropped away. Jack EVANS gave us a treat with a Jumbo Three Card Monte. The Jumbo Queen vanished, reappeared back in the carrying envelope and changed into a jumbo die - (that's where Bob ALLEN'S went). Joe FLORIAN tossed a paper airplane (his stooge seeking missile) into the crowd which brought up Peg MARCUS to help him with an incredible card prediction. Peg chose five cards, mentally selected one, spelled down to it in the deck and found her mental selection which also matched the contents of a sealed envelope. THEN, she spelled down again in a second deck and found it again good stuff! Mark (COSMAR) DIMEN-STAIN performed a nice cut and restored borrowed bill effect with the bill folded lengthwise in a piece of paper and cut with a knife.

Jim (Grand Old Man) SWOGER did a skillful continuous production routine a la cigars or bananas, but produced an endless supply of thirty caliber bullets - (where was he twenty five years ago when I really needed

'em?). Second VP. **Bob INGALLS**, opened with a vanishing silk into his green thumbtip to prove a point and followed with a clever production of three half dollars from a folded one dollar bill (a la **ANDRUS**) and capped it nicely by changing the one into a one hundred.

Lastly, newest member, Caroline BAUER, gave us a cute rendition of "THE HIGH COST OF CAT FOOD", a short mystery story by Charlotte McCULLOUGH, with great finesse. A very nice finish to a very full evening. We will have our annual Installation Banquet in July, a new slate of officers in place for August and get-ready-for-Halloween magic in September. JOIN US! BOARD MEETING

Ring memberships were approved for Caroline BAUER and Roger CRENSHAW and ballot procedures for the June elections were discussed. Jeff MARCUS reported on possible designs and costs of plaques for outgoing Ring Officers and will continue researching their purchase. The Board agreed that a total of up to Fifteen Dollars for each of the three plaques was well within the parameters set in August 1989.

Plans and specific task assignments for the Ring 76 sponsored Public Show (announced at the May Meeting) were discussed at length. The show will be a benefit for CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL and the Ring, and is set for October Twenty Seventh 1990. Don HALBACH provided a thorough overview of the show concept, complete with an analysis of costs, staging, promotion and potential profits. After several specific questions were answered and discussed the Board gave full approval for the project. Next Board Meeting will be at Sherry LUFT's on Monday, July Second.


out at the June Meeting. Also IBM Central is currently processing another for Gary SCHWARTZWALD.


