

JUNE MEETING

.....or what you missed

New President for the 1990/1991 year is J.P. JACK-SON. Brad BURT and Bob INGALLS were both re-elected to second terms as 1st and 2nd Vice Presidents: Sherry LUFT was elected to the Secretary's position: Peg MARCUS is our new Treasurer and her husband Jeff MARCUS is the new Sgt-at-arms.

Brad BURT started the evening with a "new Products" Dealer Demo featuring the new "Walking Thru Ropes" mini-illusion by Martini Magic; his ultra deluxe Cigarette thru Card and a classy looking "NIFFIN" Tube. President Dick DALE introduced our five guests and presented IBM Membership Kits to David LANE and Art BROOKS. Vice President Bob INGALLS passed out our flashy new Membership cards and collected prize donation from George EDWARDS. Ken AYERS. Jack EVANS and Ed FORSYTHE. Larry FRAN-**KEL** showed up just in time with the trusty "Lotto" cage and another load of great prizes from "BUMPER & CO". About 25 items were re-cycled during the monthly drawing.

Don HALBACH started the "Tricks from TARBELL" program decked out in a fancy Western outfit, replete with classy boots, a three and a half gallon hat and "Drawl" to give us an excellent presentation of "Judge Lynch's Necktie Party" from Vol 5, lesson 67. Vic MINERT and Bob SCHNEELOCH helped lace him into a pair of ropes which went around his neck and down his sleeves. The quick escape came at the climax of a great story about Judge Lynch being hung by "bad guys" and left Don's necktie tied to the double ropes and him free. Don is to be applauded for proving, once again, that it's not so much the effect but the PRESENTATION - Well Done!

Jack EVANS never got as far as Volume 5 so he did a clever card rise from Volume 2. lesson 27, with the deck trapped inside two mouth-to-mouth glasses and all of his usual funny. funny bits 'o biz. James SWOGER lugged up a set of the original Tarbell Course lessons. the true first edition, which he probably acquired lesson by lesson for \$.25 each, and dutifully followed the lesson word by word to demonstrate the "Sealed Card Mystery" from lesson 10.

Dr. Bob ALLEN gave us a bit of historical knowledge with the information that before his rise to magical literary fame. Dr. Harian TARBELL had been, in fact, a doctor of Naturopathy - a health practice subscribing to the use of natural herbal medicines and colonic irrigation. Specific details of this practice were suggested and expanded on by the audience for a few hilarious minutes (read "total break-down of decorum") until Bob was able to regain control with a nice presentation of Tony NOICE's Card Transposition from Volume 7. Mark DIMENSTAIN did a quickie Cut and Restored Balloon which he will probably market soon, followed by Jeff MARCUS with a tricky version of "Bird's of a Feather" from Volume 1. lesson 11.

Frank HERMAN pointed out that in addition to tons of great magic, the TARBELL series also contains often overlooked lessons on Originality and Timing in Volume 2; Routining a Show in Volume 3; and Publicity and Promotion in Volume 5; all of which are still appropriate after 63 years. He proceeded to illustrate this with a very clever presentation of the Topsy-Turvy Bill from Volume 3, his very own "Tender Legal Tender", a jumbo bill penetration which Frank has re-marketed; and his version of TAR-BELL's "Bank Night" from Volumes 5 and 6. Vice President Bob INGALLS closed the evening with a couple of "audio" gags - a breaking glass sounding hammer and a laffing mirror which kept going off while he revealed a chosen card to be the only one with a different back - Twice.

...or what's coming


