Jack EVANS led off the "Classroom Magic" program with a nifty, small-model-house, Card Castle, a wand-to-fan transformation, and a jumbo wand to circular fan which had the chosen card imprinted. Jim RILEY. conducted a quick TOPOLOGY lecture from his actual classroom "teacher aids" file, and changed two metal circles into a square and a triangle to illustrate his Geometry lesson. Ed RAYMOND showed us a re-do of Cal MAYER'S Vanishing-Knot-in-a-Cardboard-Tube from last month's meeting - and fooled himself! Veteran James SWOGER demonstrated a novel, and flashy, tossed-knot-untorope flourish and with the help of four extra hands holding various loops and ends, tried to show it in slow motion! It was fantastic in real time. Wish we'd had a video for the slow motion part.

Professor Rich ROBERTSON gave us a quick math lesson with the "pick a number and double it" routine and a large poster board MAGIC SOUARE which he uses in the Classroom for Math reinforcement.
