
BANQUET on Saturday, September Fifteenth. (See Flyer this issue.)

A quick poll of the membership determined that we are all in favor of only one December event, the XMAS Pot-Luck dinner on our regular meeting night, December Seventeenth.

Loch CRANE gave us a quick report on the show that he and Dave (CALIGARTI) NELSON performed at the Women's Prison in Chino CA. Dick DALE announced a lecture by Mike ROGERS coming up in our regular meeting room on October Eighth and Mike KLICMAN announced public show ticket procedures. Larry FRANKEL brought in an extra nice load of goodies from BUM-PERS MAGICAL WORKSHOP and raffle tickets went like hotcakes.

After the break, Cal MAYERS (without his jumbo deck)led off "THE ANYTHING BUT CARDS AND ROPES" PROGRAM with an intriguing Mental Routine. Julie DALE assisted by randomly selecting four pieces of paper, each of which had a large letter on it; then used the letters to create a random word which Cal had correctly predicted. First Vice President Brad BURT did a clever "Shrinking Stuff" routine which included a shrunken politician's brain (and I thought that was normal size), a shrunken "Bob's Big Boy", and a shrinking and vanishing Coke Bottle.

Dick DALE with a nice presentation of his "Wish Book" complete with vanishing crayons, and the jumbo, breakaway crayon. Frank HERMAN forgot the "Anything-But-Cards" rule, and did an experimental version of Mike ROGERS "UNCONQUERED CARD" anyway -nice. Happy Jack EVANS (funny as always) with an eighteen inch tall, flat Mummy Case containing e well wrapped named "TettiPUPU". He closed the case,
