
Long Beach's **Roland KHAN** used comedy in his predictions. He had two people choose musical selections, and then rendered the

The snake located an incorrect card, went back for another look, threw out the entire deck in three squirts of cards, and finally came up with the correct choice. San Diego's Junior Magician President, Logan HALE, was the first prize winner in the beginner's category at Tannen's Summer Magic Camp recently, and treated us to his award winning performance. With YORK. NEW YORK" as his background music, he stretched his gloves to produce a fake dove, changed the fake dove into a real one in his hat, and turned the real dove into a silk. He turned his wand into two silks and finished with a very nice TWENTIETH CEN-TURY SILK effect - it was great, and he looked very good! San Diego's Jack EVANS brought his "CHOP SUFY" character out of retirement, after many years of retirement, complete with gorgeous "Mandarin" robe and full make-up for an elegant Production Box routine. It was all done with the usual Evans' elan and hilarious bits of business in a Chinese accent. He is to be commended for the effort involved - a true professional. Long Beach's Joyce BASCH performed a clever POM POM POLE routine with a sports theme. and went into a classy nine-card-repeat effect using Base Ball cards.

San Diego's Jeff MARCUS charged "on"

with a rush and a bluster to provide a brief commercial message about the "KITCHEN HELPING HAND" using a DISECTO ARM CHOPPER, lots of carrots, a shy, female helper, and the fastest patter ever. He was gone in three minutes, and it was funny. San Diego's Dave (CALIGARTI) NELSON

did some beautiful work with cards and silks, and produced a full glass of wine as his opener. He cut through a jumbo card, folded lengthwise, leaving the ribbon intact, did some showy silk knots, his linking silken loops, and a color changing flower. He performed some of his nice coin manipulations, and a bouquet-of-silks complete with paper throw-out coils, and a giant Rabbit-in-Hat silk at the end.

Long Beach's Jack (COWBOY) CORFY dazzled us with "TRAVELING SILK". It must have gone around his body about a dozen times before sneaking over his shoulder and into his upper pocket. He did a very nice collection of rope effects, including linking, unlinking, knots, stretching, shrinking, transposition into one long rope, and finished with a neat Silk-On-To-Rope effect. San Diego's Sherry LUFT and J.P.JACKSON did a "double" with some items from his "Collector's Corner". Sherry presented Himber's "SILVER ROCKER BOX": circa 1949, and used it to produce some lovely silk scarves. J.P. performed the Paul Fox "CANDY BOWL", complete with miles of paper streamers, and a giant cage production containing Logan's fake dove.

San Diego's Vice President, **Bob Ingalls**", interspersed all the acts with his own neat effects, clever bits of humor, and nice introductions for every one in true professional M/C style. He opened with a Card Cascade item which left only the chosen and signed card in his upper pocket after the entire deck had shot up and out into the air. He treated us to some fun handling of "ROCKY RACOON",

and amazed us with a burned and restored piece of paper called "SHRIEK OF THE MUTILATED".


