Right now, no limit, but try to keep your list to fifteen or twenty prime items so we don't have to impose restrictions on the number of sellers or the number of items per seller.

So far, Dick DALE will have the choice items from a collection he acquired, Brad BURT will root around in his attic for some workable stuff, J.P. JACKSON is cleaning his garage and found some great stuff to put on the shelf, Larry FRANKEL will have a couple of side tables, and Don HALBACH will bring some club and stage items. So we have room for some more sellers. Look around in those unused storage area for some good magic to recycle. (Like the stuff you bought last year.) SELLERS: Plan to arrive and set up about six forty five PM. so that we can have an Auction preview from seven to seven thirty P.M. (This will be the pre-meeting event.) Organize your stuff in accordance with your list. (You'll need three: one for the recorder, one with your stuff which becomes the Auctioneer's copy, and one for you to keep.)

Leave the one with your stuff and give the Recorder's copy to J.P. as soon as you're organized.

BUYERS: Bring money, (small bills and maybe some change) and pick up a "Bidder's Card" when you sign in at the door.

EVERYBODY ELSE: Just come and enjoy a fun evening, and watch evrybody's stuff change hands again. Larry FRANKEL will be our Auctioneer, assisted by JP, Dick DALE, and Jeff MARCUS. Sherry LUFT and Peg MARCUS will keep score and take your money at each "break". (See Procedure on the Auction Flyer.)

MAGIC HINTS FROM THE AUCTIONEER: HOW TO GET MORE MONEY FOR THE THINGS YOU SELL!

1. Get all the parts together, including extras like silks and other items necessary to perform each trick. Make

minor repairs, repaint, etc. so that everything is at its best. (BROKEN TRICKS DON'T SELL!)

2. Include instructions! Original instructions are best, but a Xerox copy, typed copy, or even handwritten notes from memory will all help your trick or prop sell.

3. Try to find a box, bag, or envelope to keep the prop(s) together. But remember that the auctioneer may need to open the package in order to demonstrate the item, so don't seal the package too securely!

4. If possible, label each item with a copy from an ad or catalog page. The catalog description often sells the trick

far better than a glance at the props themselves! (What sold YOU on the trick in the first place?)

5. Furnish the auctioneer, as far in advance as possible, any information which will help him present your items most effectively. The better he understands your item, the more likely it is to sell at a high price! 6. Put the lowest possible minimum bid on each item, to allow plenty of bidding excitement...which tends to drive

the final price UP!

7. Register your items as far in advance as possible, to give the auctioneer time to study them.

8. Remember that the bidding begins at 8:00p.m.! If you are present when your items are auctioned off, you can answer questions from prospective buyers.

Then the red hat card disappeared from the pack and appeared with TIP TOP in his envelope. What a nice effect! Next she did a torn and restored napkin - but the spectator's napkin was still torn.

The next performer was COSMAR. He started out with a black and white BLENDO. He made a Coke can appear & disappear in a cylinder. COSMAR ended up with a multicolored BLENDO. Nice effects!

Then Terry RUNYON performed with his bird, "Louie". "Louie" guessed the spectator's card and pulled it from Terry's hand. After that he did a nice ESP effect.

Between the different performers **Bob.** the M.C., brought out his pal "TOOTSIE". Then he did "SHRIEK OF THE MUTILATED". All

of his effects were great. The audience loved it.

Then Dee Gee, the Hobo Clown, returned to the stage. He did a beautiful presentation of LINKING RINGS to the tune of "NEW YORK, NEW YORK". After Dee Gee was Jessie and his magic hat. He had linking red, white, and blue ropes. Then he unlinked them. Jessie placed all the ropes in the hat which turned into an American Flag.
