IN MEMORIUM

The rains abated, the sun came out, the sky was blue, and it was a beautiful morning for a beautiful Memorial Service for George EDWARDS. George passed away on February Twenty First, 1991, and about one hundred and fifty of his friends, family, relatives and fellow RING SEVENTY SIX members gath-

ered at the Mission Hills First Congregational Church on Saturday, March Second, for a truly uplifting "Celebration Of Life".

George's wife, Olive, his daughter, Diane, and past Ring Presidents. Fred and Ursula ROHRER, organized an exceptional tribute George, complete with catering by the ROHRER's, and it was the nicest memorial I've ever attended. It commemora-George's unswerving devotion to RING SEVENTY SIX for the nearly thirty years of his membership during which time he held every office more than once, served repeatedly on the Board of Directors, and on every committee ever created.

Diane set the tone of the proceedings with her introductory remarks; we were

there to, "celebrate aliveness with tears and laughter" as **George** would have wanted. A Scottish Bag Piper provided a stirring Scottish March and a melancholy rendition of "Amazing Grace", local ABC TV personality, **Jack WHITE**, gave a very complete biography of **George**'s life since his birth in Liverpool, England, in 1916, several anecdotes, and closed by reading Kipling's "IF" which in part

embodies **George**'s philosophy by saying, "keep your head when all about you are losing theirs".

J.C.WAGNER. long time friend and student of George's in J.C.'s early days as a member of the San Diego Mystics, conducted the IBM Broken Wand Ceremony. Fellow Inner Circle member. Stan GERSON, performed a classic LINKING RING routine with

bag pipe music in the background, illustrating the portion of the ceremony which reads. "The World Wide symbol of the International Brotherhood of Magicians is a pattern of Rings in firmness linked...". It was extremely well done and not without some tears.

Olive and Diane shared some family thoughts and memories and invited those in attendance to do the same. There were MANY, as only a tribute to George EDWARDS could prompt. First Cousin Ron BLACK offered the Gaelic proverb which is quoted here. 'May the road rise to meet you. may the wind be always at your back, may the sunshine warm your face, the rain fall soft upon your field, and until we meet again, may God hold you in the hollow of his hand."

Ring Seventy Six President, J.P.JACK-SON. announced that the Ring would be making a significant contribution to the MAKE-A-WISH FOUNDATION of San Diego in George's name, and quoted some thoughts by Past President Dick DALE, who was unable to attend. Sandy WAGNER shared her memories of George, as did Fred ROH-RER, Paul BARTON. (President of RING 292), and many other friends and relatives.

And just when the proceedings began to get a bit maudlin. Diane reminded us all that George would have wanted more laughter than tears, and invited us to adjourn to the lavish refreshment table. Fred and Ursula are to be commended for contributing so



During the business portion President J.P.JACKSON welcomed the guests, expressed appreciation to Don HALBACH for organizing the very successful, and very full, free show on the Thirtieth of January, and reminded the Membership that Dick DALE, alone, serves the Ring as Community! Public Relations Coordinator. As such, he is the only one, beside the President, authorized to contact the American Legion regarding the use of the Legion Hall.

Announcements included the news that the Membership Year ends in April. and that members could renew now at the existing dues of twelve dollars and beat a possible increase in April.

Loch CRANE is working on his proposal for a "TRICKS FOR TROOPS" benefit and will need help from Ring Members, performers, stage crews, etc. The April Meeting will be on April 29th, instead of the fifteenth, and possibly in the small upstairs room in the front. We held a quick drawing for five new products provided by Dick DALE's MAGIC WORKS", and began moving the stuff to the Auction Block.

Don HALBACH unloaded some good working props; J.P.JACKSON had old "Rice

The real collectibles came via Keith BARRETTE who dug out a beautiful wooden Rice Vase made by Thayer, a large P&L Phantom Tube in mint condition, two sets of Thayer Billiard Balls, a P&L Candle Vanish, and a handful of Roterberg palming coins. In a word - DROOL!

Larry FRANKEL did a superb jub as Auctioneer. all the way through, assisted by Dick DALE, J.P.JACKSON, and Jeff MARCUS. The real workers were Peg MARCUS. Sherry LUFT, and Marcus DAY (with his trusty calculator) who recorded the bids, took in the money, and paid all the sellers - all as expeditiously as has ever been done. It went long and late but the die-hards hung in there and picked up some good bargains, new props, and a collectible or two.

A discussion about the recent memorial service for George EDWARDS and his many, many years of contributions to the Ring resulted in a brief moment of silence in his Memory. The Board agreed on a suitable donation to the MAKE-A-WISH Foundation in George's name, and suggested a provision for further donations from the Membership. (See March Meeting.)

The continuing review of Ring Finances, and projected expenses for the coming membership year resulted in a firm vote for no Dues increase. Dues for the 1991-1992 year will remain at twelve dollars and are payable now! 
