

The SAN DIEGO BLOOD BANK will be the sponsor again this year. They're sending out 200.000 mailings advertising the event. There are performers already signed up - Robert BAXT, Mitch WILLIAMS, & CAMERON & CO. Twenty Five Hundred Programs will be printed for which the club will be selling ads. Josel RENNLEITNER, owner of L'AFFAIRE is giving a discount to the public on the tickets. **Don** is looking for volunteers for the show for jobs such as ticket takers. ushers, etc.

Before the lecture we had a good raffle with tricks from BUMPER'S WORKSHOP.

John FEDKO gave a good lecture followed by a Dealer Demo. He started with a rope trick for the stage, shooting knots off the rope then restoring the rope to one piece. Nice Effect! Next was a close-up card effect; a three card monte face up trick called "TOPSY TURVY SMILING FACES" which used no sleights. "MARKED DECK" was another card effect he performed. Another close-up effect he demonstrated was a penetration using a very beautifully made wooden block and ribbon.

There were lots of demos: ULTRA CARD/COIN BOX. DELUXE TWIST AND TURN. BEADS OF PRUSSIA with a champagne glass. ULTRA DECK VANISH with M&M's, BLOCK OF FU MANCHU - a block talls over from a glass. TOPSY TURVY SIX CARD REPEAT and many more. His final effect was wonderful - MONSIEUR CASSETTE using a tape with instructions for the spectator to predict a number.

John explained that he follows these simple philosopies. "Leave people with a smile not necessarily mystical" and "Don't pass up simple things."

BOARD MEETING




