Now, you can play the directions and LOOK AT THE ILLUSTRATIONS WITHOUT HAVING TO MOVE YOUR HEAD CONSTANTLY BACK AND FORTH! Good Luck!

We continued this month with our "Do Any Kind Of Magic" theme, and our first entertainer was our newly elected President, Brad Burt. He performed a very nice Billiard Ball manipulation using a drop pass while interlocking his fingers. Then he demonstrated TENYO'S WATER SUSPENSION. BRAD called it the difference between science and magic. Water remained in the upside down metal cup when the cup was removed.

Next, Greg Brouelette did an instantly solved Rubic's Cube. Then he proceeded with Ben Harris' "The Written Word" with Sherry Luft's help. She chose a colored pencil. Then a blank business card goes into an envelope. The chosen lead is broken off and put into the envelope which is sealed. Then a word is freely chosen from a book. Upon opening the envelope the chosen word is found written on the card with the chosen lead. Nice effect.

Following this Roy Armstrong with Sherry
Luft amazed us with a card effect like Paul
Curry's "Out of this World". Super Jumbo
cards were used and cut into two decks and
each deck was magically separated into red and
black respectively. Next Roy did Maki Katami
Rice Paper - a clever origami effect.

Then Dana Law showed us some effects he learned from Robert Baxt's lecture. The first one was his "That's Correct! Card" followed by "The Balloon Through The Borrowed Ring".

Terry Runyon presented "Linking Handker-

chiels"Then he did a great "safety pin attached to a handkerchief" effect with Greg Brouelette. The safety pin changed locations magically. Then, with Sherry Luft's help, he did a coin trick. A penny grew in her hand.

Joe Florian performed some pretty card effects. In the first he located the aces, and then the Queens appear and disappear.

Next, Dick Dale dedicated his rope trick to Slydini. "We stop believing in magic as adults." It was a great combination of restored rope and the *Prolessor's Nightmare*.

Rick Gorecki amazed us with a nice jumbo card trick with Amy Runyon and the entire audience. He divided the audience in half by suit and denomination. Amy cut to a chosen card and Rick matched her card underneath the deck.

Next was Christian Pirker, our visitor from Switzerland, who did a great version of "OU? OF THIS WORLD" with Sherry Luft's help. He made the aces rise to the top of the deck, and then the aces turned to Kings. When Sherry turned over the cards they had divided into red and black piles.

Jeff Marcus made salt disappear and appear from his hand. He poured salt (a large quantity) from top to bottom. A clever effect!

And another great meeting was over.



# AUCTION VS SWAP MEET by Jeff Marcus

After much dicussion at the September Board Meeting the Board agreed that there are some obvious problems with the annual auction especially since we also have an annual swap meet. As Program Chairman the Board designated me to explain its conclusions to the membership.

The main reason for both events seems to be simply "tradition".

Times are changing, however, and some traditions become cumbersome or obsolete. The tradition has always been to save all the "good" stuff for the auction and sell mostly small stuff, or junk, at the swap meet; thus making the swap meet a less than great event.

As far as the auction is concerned, it goes on, and on, and on... By the end of the auction most people have left. The few still there are usually bored, and are ONLY there because they're stuck waiting for that one gem that isn't put up for bid until the end of the evening.

That's not a problem at a swap meet. Buyers can set their own pace for the night. They can look over the merchandise, decide what they want, then dicker with the seller, make a price or not, and be finished with that item.

It also seems that sellers at an auction tend to decide what they want to get for an item (what they would bargain down to at a swap meet), and that's what they set for the minimum bid so they get at least that amount, and more if it's "bid up". Many times, however, the minimum bid is inflated because the seller knows "traditionally" that if it doesn't sell at the minimum bid the auctioneer will ask him if he will accept less. The seller wants a margin to deal with; like the dealing that would take place at swap meets.

Most of the people on the Board concluded that the auction is not that exciting. It is, in fact, boring for a lot of people. And, because of the auction, the swap meet is not the great event that it could be.

Our proposal is that we do away with the auction and have one great, full-blown, incred-

ible swap meet instead.

It could be held in the big room of the Legion Hall. All the sellers could bring everything they wanted to sell. There would be huge tables of goodies, from junk to grand illusions. In addition, if a seller wanted to, he could have his own mini-auction at his table, or have grab bags. Maybe we'll even have dueling auctions! If someone wants to demo something big he can take it up on the stage and hold a one item auction using the P.A. system. Those who want to can watch or bid; those who don't can continue to pore over other tables. The atmosphere would be exciting; much like a dealer room at a convention.

We, as your Board of Directors, felt this was a big decision so we wanted to present the pros and cons, get the member's response, and act accordingly. Mull it over and let us know what you think - by coming to a Board Meeting, writing one of us a letter, or giving me a call. I'd be happy to convey your thoughts to the Board.
