

#### The John Mendoza Lecture

It is easy to see why John Mendoza is considered to be one of magic's foremost teachers. While he is a technician of the highest degree, his style of both entertaining and instruction is very easy on the viewer. As he puts it, "I'm low key. I want to put a spectator at ease."

With apologies to Mike Rogers, John's explanation of dice stacking is at the top of the stack. He makes it look soooo easy and has incorporated a very clever routine with one of his patented "kicker"

finishes.

This brings up a point of controversy about John's philosophy of going the extra mile to provide an additional finish to a routine. Some say he goes too far, doing too much, and confusing an effect. This is a subject for much discussion to be held at another time and place.

John uses some basic sleights (multiple lifts, Elmsley count, etc.) and some excellent routining to accomplish some very strong card magic. His thinking on the chop cup is to be gentle with the spectator, not denigrating. Of course, his cups and

balls are a well-known classic.

He also shared his expertise on how to handle various situations regarding spectators--audience control. This included angles, "grabby" people, and

close-up stage management.

Of cousre, he had lecture notes available, some original Rings 'N Things Combination (one cup is a chop cup) Cups and Balls in aluminum, brass, or copper, and his highly acclaimed instructional, two-hour video tape.

The MAGIC WORKS lecture was well received

by those in attendance-and they learned!
