La Mesan teaches unusual ways to make folks think

LA MESA — He showed bottles filled with tennis balls, baseballs and padlocks.

There was a "Don't Bottle" containing symbols of vice (a pack of cigarettes, a book of matches, a deck of cards and a bullet). A bottle "done this morning" contained a deck of cards with a bolt through it and more.

All of the objects were too large to pass through the openings and

necks of the bottles.

Harry Eng of La Mesa dazzled and delighted members of La Mesa Kiwanis Club on Thursday at La Mesa Community Center with demonstrations and anecdotes designed to "make you think."

"The average person uses only one-seventh of his brain," Eng said. "I want to know what the other six-sevenths is used for."

After a lot of wrong guessing, club members learned that filling the bottles is not a trick.

Eng uses surgical tools, magnets, dexterity and a lot of patience to place the items in the bottles. After years of practice filling more than 600 bottles, he can do some of them in minutes. Each bottle contains a piece of

knotted rope.

"I put a knot in each bottle as my trademark because in Japan they began producing and selling them," he said, "which was not nice."


school districts, says to be creative a person must find unusual ways of looking at things.

"I tell kids, You have to be different,'" he said.

"Six months ago I was on a planet on the other side of the sun," he told a puzzled audience. "Well, so were you. The Earth was on the other side of the sun six months ago."

"Count up to 10," he asked a club member who started with the one. "Sorry, you forgot the zero. Count from nine to one, backward," he asked another who started with nine. "Sorry, you should have started with one — I said backward. In other words, sorry, you're not thinking... You can toy with the mind."

Eng teaches mnemonics, which is the technique of memory improvement. He said he can teach third-graders to memorize 80 items in half an hour.

"It's possible to program your mind using numbers, names of presidents, states and colors," he said. "You can stack things in your mind if you know how to do it."

Eng says "there is order in chaos," and he likes to use a deck of cards as a "memory bank."

"With a deck of cards your brain is equivalent to one million computers," he said, demonstrating several card tricks using "perfect shuffles," memorization and mental calculation.

At the end of the meeting, Club President Bruce Drake asked Eng to draw two numbered prize tickets from a tumbler, saying, "To see how good this guy is, will you please draw my ticket and somebody else's."

In front of astounded onlookers, Eng drew two tickets, the second being Drake's. When asked how he did it, Eng said with a subtle smile, "Things like that happen with me."(cre)


