I would like to talk with my fellow magi about tricks, certainly. I would also like to talk with you about magic. Why do we do what we do? What can we do to improve, not just our double-lift, but also our performance?

It was based on this desire that I planned this administration's first premeeting event. I will be chairing a group discussion on magic. We'll start with some of the thoughts shared with us by Eugene Burger and the late Tony Andruzzi. Where the conversation goes from there, who can say? I hope you'll join me in this exploration of magic.

But what about our technical skills? I also would like help with my double/triple/quad-lift, bill-switch, etc. I think that technical improvements are often best taught by people, not books or video tapes.


