Everyone present contributed to our discussion which covered such wide-ranging topics as performing before different types of audiences (would your church group dig a seance?), and in different venues, presenting magic as skillful tricks vs. miracles, performance jitters, and (my favorite), presenting magic with a sense of wonder. I had so much positive feedback that we can look forward to another group discussion (similarly fueled by a short video presentation) at an upcoming pre-meeting.

Our pre-meeting Monday will be similarly interactive. Now, this is an experiment (so was last month's), but let's give it a try. Our performing theme this month is nearly open. Our theme is close-up magic. Mark Flores is arranging video equipment and monitors to help display our close-up miracles to those beyond the first row. If you would like a tape of your performance you can bring a tape and Mark will (if possible) tape your segment for later review. This is an excellent way to help you improve your handling. Although you do not need to bring a tape, I highly recommend you take advantage of this opportunity to see your favorite trick as the audience does.

Finally, the next Board Meeting will be on Aug. 30 at The Dales' house, 2447 Nielsen Street, El Cajon. All are invited.


