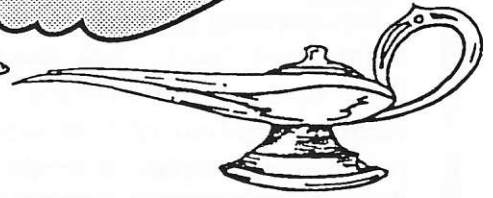

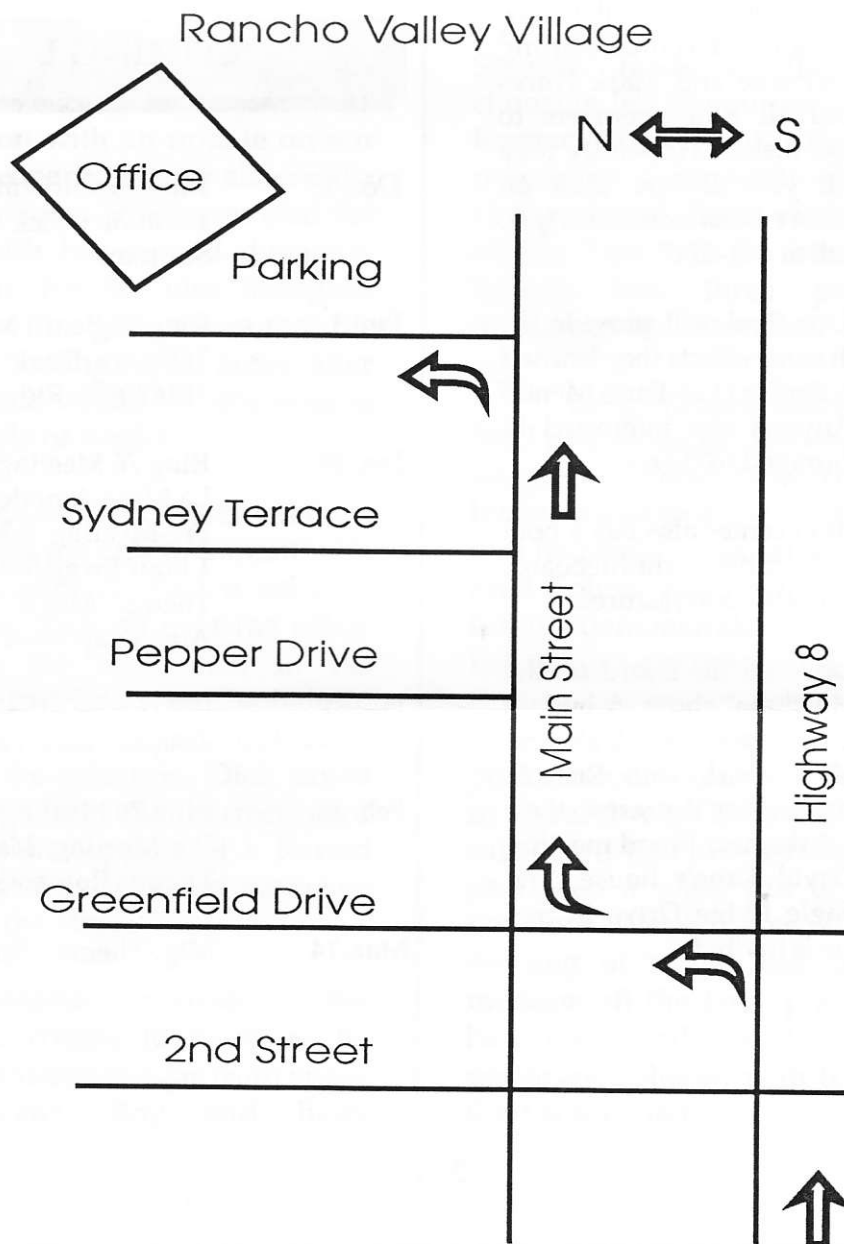

## RICK'S RAMBLINGS

In my travels over the last couple of months, I have been privileged to witness an unusually diverse assortment of magic. I thought (hoped) that you might be interested in hearing about some of it.

### LANCE BURTON

While in Las Vegas, I once again enjoyed Lance Burton's show. I think, for the value, his is the most enjoyable show on the strip. I have not yet seen SARMOTI, but my impression is that it is an entirely different experience. If you have not seen Lance before, perhaps you should. His show makes me feel as if I have stepped back in time to an era of classy full evening magic shows... with naked women and a maniac juggler (a very funny Michael Goudeau). Lance's greatest gift, I think, is the ease and sincerity with which he conducts his show. Even lines I have seen him use before spring out as if they were new. I look forward to seeing his show again and highly recommend him.

### MELINDA

After checking out Lance's act, I followed his advice and dropped by to see Melinda's show. I wish I could say that I enjoyed Melinda's act as much as I enjoyed Lance's. She is a very beautiful woman, and her magic has improved over time. I noticed several technical improvements on effects that I had seen her perform in the past. Melinda has a sexy show, and parts are fun to watch, but as an audience member I never felt quite "at ease". However, unlike her husband's act, her's is pure Vegas.

Unfortunately, I don't really like Vegas or things Vegas. Still, I look forward to seeing her show in the future as she grows in her art.

### DAVID COPPERFIELD

How did I choose to follow up the Honeymooning Headliners? Well, we traipsed over to Caesar's to see if we could buy, beg, or borrow a ticket to the David Copperfield show. We ended up buying (\$\$\$!!!) and begging, but we did manage to get stand-by tickets. Our maitre'd sat us in a broom closet facing away from the stage and asked if we would like to sit closer. What a question! So I dug into my pocket and pulled out a few crumpled up Mr. Washington's with 5's glued to the visible corners. Our greedy friend put us in the best seat in the house. This was evidenced by the fact that David visited our table twice, once performing the Floating Rose, and his parents were sitting in the next booth (and you know their seats didn't suck)!

I have seen David's show several times, and this was by far the best. We had great seats, an intimate venue, close encounters with the Mega-Mage, and we got to see his new closing effect. David did not close with flying. The question then, is how can you possibly follow up flying? David does manage it very nicely.
