The response to last month's premeeting was phenomenal. Likewise, don't miss this months pre-meeting. Mark Flores has arranged for drama teacher Ken Myron to come and teach us how to act like magicians. This idea came from a fellow AZ magi whose local SAM had held a similar event. Magic is a performing art. We, as performers, are the actors (and, all too often, the writers, directors, lighting designers, etc.). This pre-meeting will be of interest to anyone who wants to PERFORM magic.

I caught two serious magic shows in March. Rudy Coby's variety show, which includes a complete cast, features comedy, magic, original music, computer graphics and more. There was no question that this was a Rudy Coby EVENT. There were Rudy Coby signs, posters, balloons, T-shirts, themed original artwork in the lobby and LABMAN (Rudy's character) rest room warnings to wash your hands! And the Magic? Original, frightening, wonderful, exciting. Overall, the show was a mind bender. The highlight effect, Rudy's version of "sawing a woman in half", was very real. His chainsaw accidentally slipped and sliced his assistant in half. The bottom half kept walking as the top half flopped onto the floor. Outrageous!

To top off the evening, I got autographs from the complete cast in their spread in Magic Magazine!

Penn & Teller - what can I say? I snagged AWESOME seats to the SRO show, and was thrilled to get a chance to talk (however briefly) with Teller about their seance and BBS. The boys were as irreverent as ever, and the show might not be for anyone who is terrified of blood.

Avoiding specifics, (like punch lines), I'd like to say that Penn has a unique way of treating his audience participants with respect while dripping disdain. I'm not sure how he does it, but it would be worth watching a taped show just to study his technique.

Penn also managed to work in quite a few "ad-libbed" jokes/references to the musical *Tommy*, which really pleased the La Jolla Playhouse crowd. For those worried about the duo's famous "exposures", don't. While there were things I found amusing, (i.e. Penn's exaggerated thumb tip handling), I don't think the lay audience noticed. The duo clearly revealed the Seven Secrets of Magic and exposed a cigarette routine which had Teller ditching it in his ear.

While the principles and terminology were correct, it was very tongue in cheek. Few who did take it seriously would be able to remember the principles and apply them to other effects. But, if you do a routine that involves ditching a lit cigarette in your ear, you might not want to play La Jolla for a while!


