#### Amateur vs Professional

amateur (n) 1. one who pursues an activity for pleasure instead of for material gain.

professional (n) one working for pay, not an amateur.

I was talking on the phone with a fellow magician who got me thinking about my status as an amateur magician. The word amateur has gained a negative connotation over the years. Can't you just hear someone sneer derisively, "bunch of amateurs!" Even the second definition in my dictionary refers to one who is unskillful. Let's look seriously at the term "amateur". The primary difference between an amateur and a professional is that amateurs do not get paid. That's it! I've seen professionals who positively SUCK and I've seen amateurs who are truly "magical".

There are other differences inherently linked to the need to pay bills and put food on the table. Professionals demand a fee for their services and most must perform a wide variety of shows (whatever the public wants) in almost any venue. Amateurs have the option of performing only what and when they want. Professionals are damaged financially by poor magic, exposures, and cut-throat competition from pro-wannabees. Amateurs, on the other hand, run the risk of putting off the old practice sessions, stifling their own creativity, and generally not earning the title "magician".

I think pros have a better shot at understanding amateurs because they were once amateurs themselves. Yes, there are differences. Understanding these differences is imperative if we want to coexist in a positive, mutually respected manner.

I'm proud to be an amateur magician. If someday, I turn my avocation into a vocation, I'm sure I'll be just as proud. Although there are differences between amateurs and professionals, they are not qualitative. Professional does not mean good and amateur does not mean bad. Both words need qualifiers before they can imply a skill level.

#### Magic Shows

Well, this month I didn't get to nearly as many magic shows as is my wont. I did, however, get the opportunity to catch the El Cajon Valley High Faculty Follies. As it happens, one of my favorite magicians performing under the anonymous heading of "The Magic of M". The "M", of course, stood for Mark Flores, our own second vice president. Mark performed some mental magic with a turtle. really was an incredible considering that Turtle, a young high school co-ed, had trouble remembering her playing card!


