





# LETTERS, we get letters. . . .

Dear Editor,

Some comments regarding the letter..."Do magic clubs promote bad magic?" I agree they sometimes do, including Ring 76. The performance part of our meetings is an open forum for anyone to show a magic trick regardless of their preparation or lack thereof. Usually no critique of the presentation is given. After the meeting it's easy to find ourselves telling performers, "That was great!", when that may be a stretch. Therefore, the magician receives no real feedback about what part of the presentation to keep doing and what part to change.

But, that may not be all bad. Just getting up and doing ANYTHING takes guts and builds experience. Many people may not be willing to perform at meetings if they were also to be PUBLICLY critiqued.

Perhaps performers who **do** want to be evaluated, inform the emcee to field comments and suggestions from members after the trick. This helped me when I experimented with the bill in lemon trick. The feedback helped my presentation and turned it into a stronger effect.
